

Important Regents and Final Exam Information

- Regents exams and school final exams are required parts of the academic program and make up a part of the final course grade. Students who are seriously ill may make up a school final exam on the next day with a note from a doctor explaining their absence. Unfortunately, there are no make up dates for Regents Exams. Students may not be exempt from an exam or allowed to make up an exam due to summer plans. Further details can be found in the Academic Policy section of the Community Handbook.
- Please be aware that moming exams start at 8 AM and afternoon exams begin at noon, unless you are told alternate times due to approved testing modifications. Students should arrive 15 minutes before their exam.
- From June 13 to June 22 there will be no breakfast or lunch served in the cafe teria. Please make sure that students bring their own breakfast and lunch when there is more than one exam scheduled during the day. Bus schedules will run the same as a regular school day with the addition of a pic kup at the high school at 11:30 following morning exams.

The school building should be one that is distraction-free, which ensures an appropriate learning and working environment. Keeping this in mind, we are asking you to join with us in reminding students of the schools dress code. The dress code is published in the Byram Hills High School Community Handbook, which each student receives upon entering BHHS. The policy fulfills the guidelines set forth by the New York State School Boards Association, as well as the New York State Center for Student Safety and the SAVE legislation. For your information, the BHHS dress code is printed below.

A students dress, grooming and appearance, including hair style/color, jewelry, make-up and nails, shall:

- Be safe, appropriate and not disrupt or interfere with the educational process.
- Include footwear at all times. Footwear that is a safety hazard will not be allowed.
- Not include clothing and other articles, which are distracting or revealing. These might include, but are not limited to, clothing that does not cover the midriff, and clothing that contains inappropriate sayings or graphics. Specific items that are not acceptable in a school setting include short articles of clothing (shorts, dresses, skirts), mesh shirts (excluding school athletic uniforms), shirts/dresses with low-cut necklines, tank strapped shirts, sunglasses, hoods, and gang-related articles.

- Not include items that are vulgar, obscene, libelous or denigrate others on account of race, color, religion, creed, national
 origin, gender, sexual orientation or disability.
- Not promote and/or endorse the use of alcohol, tobacco, controlled substances or illegal drugs, and/or encourage other illegal
 or violent activities.

Hats may be worn in the school building. However, teachers have the authority to request that students remove hats in the class-room.

As stated in the dress code, students who violate the policy shall be required to modify their appearance by covering or removing the offending item, and, if necessary or practical, replacing it with an acceptable item. Any student who refuses to do so shall be subject to disciplinary action.

It is understood that personal choice and style varies, as do opinions concerning clothing. Following the districts mission, enforcing a code of appropriate dress promotes a safe school environment, academic achievement, and good citizenship. Any article(s) of clothing that may distract from the learning environment or that may create a safety issue may be deemed inappropriate by the school administration. Please note that we have made every effort to provide students with freedom to make clothing choices that allow them to express their individuality within our dress guidelines.

The administration reserves the right to amend the dress code policy as the need arises. The BHHS dress code serves only to illustrate guidelines to be used when deciding upon school attire. It does not include every item that may be deemed inappropriate. We ask that it be used as a basis for forming good decisions about the suitability of school attire.

The BHHS school administration thanks you for your cooperation in this matter, and appreciates your support throughout the school year. If you have any questions or concerns regarding the school dress code or other matters, please do not hesitate to contact us.





Summer Reading 2012

At Byram Hills, we endeavor to make reading a lifelong habit that functions as an intellectual pursuit, a catalyst for self-exploration, and a form of entertainment. Operating under the principle that reading improves critical thinking skills, facilitates vocabulary acquisition, and results in a greater awareness of the world at large, the English department at Byram Hills High School maintains a summer reading requirement for which students are expected to read a minimum of two works: a required grade-level text and an independent reading selection. The grade-level text introduces themes and genres that play a larger curricular role. The independent reading selection allows students the freedom—with parental permission—to select high-interest reading material. Like our Independent Reading Initiative, the Summer Reading program seeks to provide students with a choice of reading material and build a community of readers that values cultural literacy.

MAKE THIS A PRODUCTIVE SUMMER

Students who choose to take these courses for advancement **must receive prior approval** from their counselor and the department chairperson in order to receive credit. Called to Order / Comments from the Public

The Board of Education meeting was called to order by Board President, Mr. Ira Schulman. Mr. Schulman indicated it was a very special night for the District celebrating student accomplishments and administrative appointments. Mr. Schulman also reminded everyone to vote on May 15, 2012 at HCC from 6:30 a.m.- 9 p.m..

Mr. Schulman asked if there were any comments from the public. There were no comments.

Dr. Donohue announced two administrative appointments that was approved at the evening's meeting. Dr. Donohue announced the new principal of the Coman Hill School, Mrs. Margaret (Peggy) McInerney, who is currently the Assistant Principal of the Coman Hill School. Dr. Donohue indicated that Mrs. McInerney has the qualities that Byram Hills desires. She

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is knowledgeable, a great communicator, she thinks clearly, acts decisively, as well as being skilled and compassionate. Dr. Donohue indicated that Mrs. McInerney inspires a great amount of confidence. Many of her Coman Hill colleagues were in attendance at the meeting.

Mr. Schulman, on behalf of the Board of Education, also welcomed Mrs. McInerney to her new position.

Dr. Donohue also announced the appointment of Mr. James Yap as Director of Technology. Mr. Yap comes to Byram Hills from a neighboring school district. Dr. Taylor noted that the May 1, 2012 meeting was Budget Hearing V which is a required budget meeting. She noted that this is the community's final opportunity to ask questions about the budget. It was noted that there can be no changes to the budget at this time. Unfinished Business Revisions to Current Policies: First Read: 5300 (*Code of Conduct*)

The above mentioned policy was accepted as a first read as presented.

Dr. Taylor noted that this policy has had extensive review and was reviewed by a committee that included district administrators, building administrators, teachers, staff, parents and students. Dr. Taylor noted that once the revised Code of Conduct policy is adopted by the Board, a notice will be placed on the district website under Board of Education, Policies.

Mr. Summers also noted the extensive effort placed on reviewing the Code of Conduct Policy.

Dr. Kaltenecker shared that the Assistant Principals have been trained throughout the year regarding the revisions in the Code of Conduct and there will be extensive training for faculty in the fall.

Mr. Schulman thanked the committees and the administration for their good work.

New Business

School Breakfast Program-Public Hearing to Discuss Continuation of Exemption in 2012-13

Mr. Gregory Carlson reviewed the required survey sent home to parents, as required by state regulations, and the requirement to have a public hearing prior to continuing the exemption of the K-6 breakfast program. Historically, Byram Hills has had survey results that indicated an exemption was appropriate. There were no questions or comments about the program or the exemption.

Board of Education Calendar Draft for 2012-2013

The Board Calendar for the 2012-2013 school year was reviewed and adopted as presented. The Board's first meeting of the 2012-2013 school year, noted as the Board of Education Organization meeting, is scheduled to take place on Tuesday, July 3 at 8:30 a.m. in the District Office Board Room.

Staff Reports Superintendent

Dr. Taylor made note of the audit report conducted by the New York State Comptroller's Office covering the period from July 1, 2010 - July 31, 2011. Dr. Taylor noted that an extensive audit report was conducted by the State auditors reviewing almost one million dollars worth of purchasing and the state auditors found no irregu-

larities. It was noted by Dr. Taylor that during the exit interview with the state auditors, the auditors congratulated the district. It was mentioned that the audit was very extensive and the district met a very high standard set by the State Comptroller's Office.

Mr. Summers offered information regarding a policy that the State Comptrollers' Office is recommending to school districts. Dr. Taylor noted that this policy is not required by the State, only recommended. The Policy Committee will be reviewing their suggestion at a future policy meeting.

Dr. Taylor announced an award that will be offered by the Lower Hudson Council for Social Studies to Ms. Kim Lapple, Social Studies Chairperson, as Outstanding Supervisor of the Year Award. Ms. Lapple was nominated by the Byram Hills Social Studies Department.

Deputy Superintendent

Dr. Donohue offered an update on the district's hiring process. He noted that a recruitment process will begin for the assistant principal positions at the Coman Hill School and H.C. Crittenden Middle School. Dr. Donohue also commented on teacher openings, some based on budget and others based on teachers not returning in September.

Assistant Superintendent for Business and Management Services, District Clerk

Mr. Carlson offered information on absentee ballots noting that applications are available on the district website and need to be returned to the District Office by May 8, 2012. Mr. Carlson also reported that the District has tried to place as much budget information as possible on the district website for the community to become an informed voter. He noted that the Board meetings are viewable online under BobcatTV. Also, on the district web site, under the Board of

Education, Budget, Budget Information 2012-2013, different links are available to view the budget, Budget Hearing presentations, as well as a section entitled FAQ's - Frequently Asked utes of April 3, the Board minutes for Questions. Additionally, a complete budget book is available for viewing in approved. each school building's library, as well as the District Office.
