Assembling Directions


Materials Needed:

- 1. <u>Cut</u> the right dotted line off the <u>Start</u> <u>Here</u> page. <u>Glue</u> this piece on top of <u>Title and Author</u> page, being careful to line up the top edges.
- 2. <u>Cut</u> the top dotted line off the page with the <u>Name and Date</u> on it. <u>Glue</u> this page on top of <u>Start Here</u> page, being careful to line up the left edge.




- 3. <u>Cut</u> the top and left dotted lines off of <u>Jail</u> page. Glue this piece on last, being careful to line up all the top and left edges.
- 4. Cut out the large <u>Trivia Card</u> and glue it in the <u>middle</u> of the game board on a slant. Now <u>cut out the game board along the black outer borders</u>. Save this step for last so that your edges are straight.
- 5. Turn your game board over and <u>tape</u> the back sections to make sure that they are secure and will not fall apart. To make your game board more durable, you may want to <u>glue it onto a piece of construction paper</u>. Your game board is now assembled.
- 6. Now you are ready to begin your writing and coloring. Write the <u>author</u>, <u>title</u>, <u>genre</u>, <u>your name</u>, and <u>date</u> in the stars. Draw and color two <u>pictures</u> of your favorite parts of the book in the empty <u>stars</u>.
- 7. <u>Cut</u> out your <u>15 Trivia Cards</u>. Using your edited <u>First Draft</u>, write the <u>questions</u> on the lines on the front side of your trivia cards. Write the <u>answers</u> on the back side of your trivia cards. Use a rubber band to secure them together.

8. Using your edited <u>First Draft</u>, write the <u>property titles</u> in the 22 property boxes.

9. Choose 10 different colors. Color each set of property (2 or 3 in a set) a different color.

10. If you want, you can <u>draw pictures</u> in the bottom sections of property boxes that represent the titles that you chose.

11. Color the rest of your game board. You may add other decorations to your game board.



12. You need to have <u>4 objects</u>, one for each player (4 players). You may cut out 4 different colored squares, or be creative and make your own personal design! You will need a <u>dice</u>, so that you can play your game with your classmates.


Note to teachers: For each of my book reports, I like to start off by showing my students an example of a book report that I completed using the same project. This helps to give students a visual image of what this project entails. This is a bit time consuming, but worth it to me, and you can use your example year after year once you have made it. This is one of the more time consuming projects to complete yourself, so I have provided you with a sample of a book report example that I did with this project using the book Matilda by Roald Dahl. 
