2. Feedback will also be provided for student **learning skills**. Working independently, teamwork, organization, work habits/homework, and initiative are assessed apart from student achievement in the four categories outlined above and will conform to the coding:

Course Expectations:

There is a basic assumption in this course. You (or your parents) have made a choice for you to attend a school whose underlying philosophy is based on the religious principles of Christianity. It is expected that you will take this course seriously and apply your full academic potential to it.

Tests and Quizzes: Advanced notice will be given for all tests. However, students should always be prepared for occasional surprise quizzes based on homework reading assignments. Missed tests due to a legitimate absence must be made-up within two days of your return. An unexcused absence on a test day results in a mark of "0" on the test.

Notebooks: Notebooks must be brought to every class and must be complete and accurate. Use a separate three ring binder and take all notes in blue and black ink, using colour only for underlining. Keep your notebook well organized, using dividers for each unit.

Homework: Homework must be completed when assigned.

Journals: Journals comprise a major portion of your term mark. Each journal assigned should be completed within a day or two of it being assigned.

Textbooks: The Textbook is Growing in Christian Morality and Creating a Christian Lifestyle will be assigned to you. You are responsible for returning the same numbered books at the end of the semester. Books must be brought to every class.

Writing policy: All written assignments in this course will be graded not only on content but also on the correct use of English (form and style).

Late Assignments: A penalty will be applied to all late assignments according to school policy. Attendance: Since participation in discussion is a major component of this course, regular attendance is mandatory. School policy on attendance will be strictly applied. LEAVING CLASS EARLY WITHOUT PERMISSION = ONE SKIPPED CLASS!

Behavior: A mature attitude and behavior are expected in this class. You are to be prepared with appropriate materials and in proper uniform at all times. There will be no food or drinks permitted in class and washroom breaks will be limited to serious emergencies.
