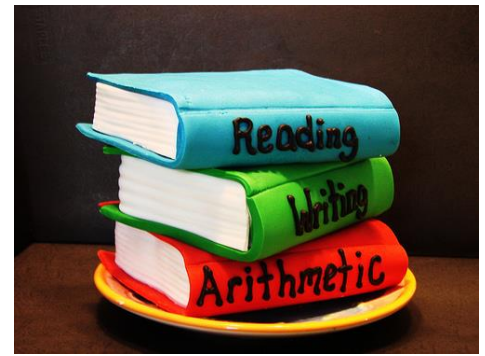

Patriot Day is observed on September 11th. Patriot Day was signed into law on December 18, 2001 as a day to remember those who lost their lives in the terrorist attacks on our country.

On September 11, 2001, two hijacked civilian aircraft were crashed by terrorists into the north and south towers of the World Trade Center in New York City, causing the collapse of both towers. A third hijacked aircraft crashed into the Pentagon outside Washington, D.C. And a fourth hijacked aircraft crashed in Shanksville in southwestern Pennsylvania after passengers tried to take control of the aircraft in order to prevent the hijackers from crashing the aircraft into another important symbol of democracy and freedom and killing even more people. Thousands of innocent people lost their lives in this tragedy.

Then President George W. Bush returned to the White House, and at 9 p.m., he delivered a televised address from the Oval Office, declaring "Terrorist attacks can shake the foundations of our biggest buildings, but they cannot touch the foundation of America. These acts shatter steel, but they cannot dent the steel of American resolve." In a reference to the eventual U.S. military response he declared: "We will make no distinction between the terrorists who committed these acts and those who harbor them."

On Patriot Day, Americans should fly flags at half-staff. We hope you will all please join us as we observe a moment of silence to honor those individuals who lost their lives as a result of the terrorist attacks.

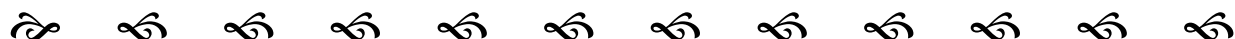

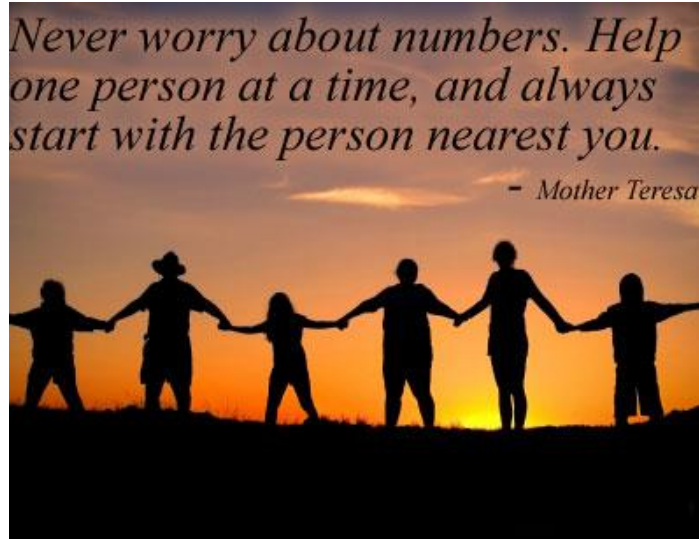
