### **Tuesday Morning Workshop with Michael Meath**

## Best Foot Forward – Communication During Sensitive or Crisis Situations

Most propane suppliers are excellent at responding to emergencies and are eager to assist the fire service and other public safety officials. But many do not have a crisis **communications** plan and strategy for effectively dealing with serious or sensitive situations that can impact their company or the industry. This session explores how to deal with key audiences such as the news media... how to use "key messages," and how to respond to any question. The workshop is filled with real-world examples and practical approaches. It also includes two (2) video clips that were specifically prepared for the propane industry. Lots of dialogue and Q&A is encouraged.

### **NPGA Update with Rick Roldan**

During Tuesday morning's membership meeting, Rick Roldan, President and CEO of the National Propane Gas Association, will provide insights into critical issues facing the industry.

Rick was named President and Chief Executive Officer of the National Propane Gas Association in March 2002. His tenure with NPGA began in 1995 with his appointment as Vice President of Government Relations. Since that time, he has played an important role in the formulation of numerous federal laws and regulations that have saved the propane industry billions of dollars and strengthened its reputation as a clean, safe and reliable energy source. Rick's involvement with the propane gas industry began in 1994 with his selection as the founding Executive Director of the Propane Vehicle Council (PVC), which was formed to promote propane as a cleaner-burning alternative transportation fuel.

### Safety & Training Update with Dennis Cruise

On Monday morning, Dennis Cruise, VAPGA Outreach Coordinator, will provide an update on safety and training issues that are important to all propane industry members.

Dennis came to the propane industry from a law enforcement career in Virginia which spanned from 1977-2006. During that period of time Dennis was a DOT Inspections and Hazmat Officer from 1991 – 2006. He has 14 years experience in roadside inspections and compliance with DOT regulations. Dennis also worked as a Hazardous Materials Technician and continues to provide instruction for the Virginia Department of Criminal Justice Services, Virginia Department of Fire Programs and the Virginia

Department of Emergency Management. Dennis is recognized by the Virginia Department of Fire Programs and by the West Virginia Fire Commission as an adjunct instructor in Propane Emergencies Training.

#### The Boardwalk

First constructed in 1888, the Virginia Beach Boardwalk has received national acclaim in recent times as one of America's favorite boardwalks by the Discovery Channel, and in magazines such as Coastal Living, Southern Living, and National Geographic Traveler.

In its various forms, the thoroughfare has seen it all: Prohibition and German U-boats, Big Bands and surfer girls, shag contests and rollerblades. Throughout time, the Boardwalk has remained an enduring symbol of Virginia Beach. Built from wooden planks during the nation's "gilded age," the five-block promenade attracted thousands of Victorian vacationers. At the famed Peacock Ballroom, couples swooned to the music of legendary artists such as Duke Ellington, Cap Calloway and Tommy Dorsey.

Today's Boardwalk is now 28-feet wide and stretches three miles featuring a separate bike path, making it ideal for strolling, rollerblading and biking. Entertainment is offered nightly during the summer months and four oceanfront stages at 7th, 17th, and 24th and 31st Streets provide live musical acts. Along the boardwalk there's a variety of quaint outdoor restaurants and vendors offering bike and surrey rentals. Nautical sculptures adorn many of the side streets which lead to Atlantic Avenue. While there, don't forget to swing by and see King Neptune – a twenty-four foot, twelve-ton bronze statue that stands at the gateway to Neptune Festival Park on 31st Street. This is perhaps one of the most popular photo opportunities in the resort area.

The Virginia Beach boardwalk has been a treasured beach hot spot. But like a perfectly placed beach towel, the love has spread throughout the country as Travel + Leisure has named the Virginia Beach Boardwalk one of America's Best Beach Boardwalks. And who could blame them? Nowhere else will you find such a perfect mix of restaurants, shops, and unforgettable beach vibes.

The Tournament is being held at the Virginia Beach National Golf Club, formerly the TPC. Virginia Beach National opened in May of 1999 as the premier public golf course in the Tidewater Area. A Pete Dye Design with assistance from PGA Tour Hall of Fame golfer Curtis Strange, VB National is a masterful blend of natural grasses, waste areas, rolling fairways and "tour quality" greens. The course has challenged some of the best players in the world in past years as host of the NATIONWIDE TOUR's Virginia Beach Open. This Par 72 course stretches to well over



7200 yards from the Championship markers, however, five sets of tees offer players of all abilities the opportunity to play within your "comfort zone."

The cost is \$125 per person, and includes green fees, beverage cart, range balls, prizes and two mulligans to benefit the Young Gassers Scholarship Fund. Note: lunch is not included but can be purchased at the course.

Shotgun start at 11 a.m. on Sunday, July 14. The course is located at 2500 Tournament Drive in Virginia Beach, approximately nine miles from the Hilton. Phone: 757-563-9440. Driving directions from the Virginia Beach Oceanfront: Follow Pacific Avenue South across Rudee Inlet Bridge. Pacific Ave turns into General Booth Blvd. Follow General Booth Blvd 2 miles & turn right on Dam Neck Road. Follow Dam Neck Road approx. 6 miles. Turn Left on Princess Anne Road. Entrance to the GolfCourse is 1 mile on the right.
