From The Executive Director

Do you know you are among the more than 60 million Americans who live in homeowners associations and condominium communities? We think most Radisson residents are happy living in our community—and we certainly hope you are among them—but how do these 60 million residents feel about their own associations? Are they happy with their elected boards? How do they feel about the rules?

The Foundation for Community Association Research, an affiliate of Community Associations Institute (CAI), sponsored a recent national public opinion survey to answer these and other questions. Here are some of the key findings:

- 71 percent of residents say they are satisfied with their community association experience. Only 12 percent express dissatisfaction and 17 percent are neutral on the question.
- 89 percent believe their association board members strive to serve the best interests of the community, while 11 percent say the opposite or they aren't sure.
- 76 percent say their professional managers provide value to their communities, while 24 percent say the opposite or they aren't sure.

• 70 percent believe their community association rules "protect and enhance" property values. Only 2 percent say rules harm property values, while about 28 percent see no difference or didn't know.

We'd like to think that the Radisson Community Association would do even better than the national averages. If you feel differently, please let us know what you think we can do to make our community a better place to live. If you're especially pleased about our community, share that too! It's always good to know we're on the right track.

Since the beginning of 2011, we have been regularly informing you, the resident, of our new membership registration process. This change came as part of our upgraded database software and website. To be able to use the amenities, participate in the voting process (for board members or referendums) or surveys, residents must be registered. Our community has approximately 2,700 residences. This number includes single family and attached houses, condominiums and apartments. As of this date, we have 1,137 households registered. If you are not one of our registered households, please consider registering to realize all of the benefits afforded to you through membership.

Many Capital Improvements continue to be done in the community. Both the Aspen House and the RCA Office buildings are having siding replaced. Please pardon our appearance while these improvements are being completed. Also, the railing replacement along Oberon Lake is ongoing. This project will take some time due to weather delays and waiting periods while the concrete cures, etc. That section of the pathway system may need to be temporarily closed while this project continues. Please check our website for updates. Photos on the projects in progress can be seen on Page 9.

The local political contest has gotten an early start with many advertisements for candidates being seen around town on signs, in local newspapers and social networking sites. As a reminder, there are restrictions on the political signs that are allowed within the Radisson Community. Residents are allowed one sign that may be displayed in your front window thirty (30) days before Election Day, and removed after Election Day. No yard signs are permitted on residential or corporate park properties.

Storage Yard Notice

As a routine security measure and to ensure lot availbility for current renters, facility locks are periodically changed. We will be putting new locks on the Storage Yard gates on October 24th so new keys will be required. If you are renewing an existing contract, come to the office between October 3 and October 24 to pick up the new key. Old keys can be discarded AFTER October 24th.

Renewal notices will arrive in early October. Contracts and payment are due in the RCA Office by October 31, 2011. Please keep in mind the terms of the contract, specifically:

*The item(s) must occupy ONLY their assigned space and avoid crowding the adjoining space by parking in center of lot.

- * Vehicles and trailers shall be stored in an operable condition and be able to be moved or towed.
- * The Storage Yard is inspected regularly for violations and potential issues. A written notice will be sent to the Renter giving 30 days to correct the violation or otherwise accommodate the request. Renter will be subject to a \$50 fine per month until situation is remedied.
- * ANY CHANGE in the vehicle, boat, etc. being stored MUST BE REPORTED TO THE

RCA OFFICE. It is renter's responsibility to keep contract information current and complete.

Town of Lysander **Electronics Recycling**

The NYS Electronic Recycling and Reuse Act was signed into law on May 28, 2010. The law will ensure that every New Yorker will have the opportunity to recycle their electronic waste in an environmentally responsible manner. The law requires a convenient system for collection, handing and recycling or reuse of electronic waste beginning April 1, 2011.

The Town of Lysander Highway Department located at 2730 West Entry Road is a designated location for Town Of Lysander residents to drop off their electronic equipment to be recycled for free. This program runs May 10th to October 13th on Tuesdays & Thursdays from 8:00 am to 1:00 pm in the parking lot. All equipment must be unloaded by the resident.

Summer Tourism: Tis the Season



The state has gone retro. New York has reignited its LOVE NY" tourism slogan.

This most successful campaign gave New York a positive image for residents here and outside our boundaries in the 1980s. I'm glad it's back. No slogan before or since proved to be as catchy or winning as this one with the red heart at its center.

If you haven't gone to the www.iloveny.com site in a while, I encourage you to visit. This site features all the graphics and photography iPads and computers can handle, with colorful maps, directions to destinations, travel guides, itineraries, deal finders, and accommodations outlined for the major regions of our state.

I love seeing our attributes outlined on this site. It is not only good for businesses and those who are considering locating here, it's good for our self-image. Most importantly, it's good for the tourism industry. Antiques, parks, Niagara the Niagara Escarpment, how-Falls, snowmobiling, ATV trails, hiking, beaches, camping, fresh water lakes and performing arts are only a few of the 100 clickable links listed under the "reasons to Love NY" section.

When you click on reasons to love New York, a picture of two glasses of wine with a vineyard behind them greets the visitor. It's no secret: wine is a big draw for our state. Today, more than 5 million tourists visit New York wineries annually. We're ranked number 3 in the nation, according to the New York Wine and Grape Foundation. The New York wine and grape industry has a \$3.76 billion economic impact from the production of wine and grapes grown on nearly 1,400 vineyards statewide. Since the passage of the Farm Winery Law in 1976, the number of New York's farm wineries has grown from under 20 to nearly 306 today.

The five major wine producing regions in the state are the Finger Lakes, Long Island, the Hudson Valley, Lake Erie and ever there are wineries in 51 of New York's 62 counties. Lake Ontario, as well as the Thousand Island boasts wine trails as well. Wine production has increased more than 50 percent in the last 20 years to nearly 200 million bottles annually. The sale of New York wines account for \$420 million a year. It is expected these numbers will only improve.

Legislation to increase wineries, wine sales

Legislation passed unanimously this year that will help boost wine sales. The Alcohol and Beverage Control Law was streamlined, making it easier for new licensees and farm wineries to apply. It also enables wineries to operate up to five branch stores without obtaining separate licenses. These stores would be considered extensions of the farm winery, not separate entities. Also, the new law removes the stipulation that wineries that produce less than 1,500 gallons obtain a microwinery license. New York wineries celebrated being able to ship directly to consumers in other states in 2005, however, layers of bureaucracy made this difficult for wineries because they needed to produce an extensive report. The report has been simplified. This was signed into law by the Governor on July 22.

This is the kind of legislation our businesses are asking for. This law was a result of a task force managed through the New York State Ag Department in 2008 which sought ways to bolster wine sales for wineries. I'm pleased to see this come to fruition.

Report from the Onondaga County Legislature



The August session of the Onondaga County Legislature was held on August 2, 2011. This

month we had several appointments in support of the management of the county. First, Kevin Wisely, a past member of the Belgium Cold Springs Fire Department, was appointed as Commissioner of Emergency Management. Mr. Wisely will take over for retiring Commissioner Peter Alberti. Commissioner Alberti had a long and distinguished career with Onondaga County. He coordinated many emergency events throughout the county, including the Labor Day storm that caused a large amount of destruction to the New York State Fairgrounds. I welcome Mr. Wisely and look forward to working with him.

Another Baldwinsville native, Hugh Kimball, was appointed to a county board, the Onondaga County Council on Environmental Health. Mr. Kimball has served the Town of Lysander well on several boards, both past and present. Mr. Kimball will be a great addition to the Environmental Health Council. I want to thank Mr. Kimball for donating his time to this important board.

At the beginning of the legislative session we took a moment to honor another Baldwinsville resident, Michael Chura. Mr. Chura is a past member of the Belgium Cold Spring Fire Department and the Moyers Corners Fire Department. He is currently a Chief for the City of Syracuse Fire Department. While Mr. Chura and his family were on their way to the New Jersey shore, they observed that a vehicle had overturned on the New Jersey Turnpike. The vehicle was upside down, on fire, with a woman trapped inside. Mr. Chura pulled over and used his training to remove the women from the burning car just before it became fully engulfed in flames. The Legislature presented Mr. Chura with a Gold Seal Proclamation, thanking him for his heroism.



How do we deal with anger? Acknowledge your feelings and listen to each other. 1) Encourage discussion together with safety rules to listen to each other's point of view, even if you don't agree. Safety rules allow three minutes to listen to the other person with no interruptions and comments only on what was said. Use reflective language such as "I hear what you are saying," and start each sentence with I instead of you ("I feel or I believe" not "you are or you said"). so the problems don't become

2) Respect yourself and each more intense, and resistant and stay focused on higher other—don't yell or put down the other person or walk off in anger and refuse to talk. As your family works to express anger without causing pain to someone else, concentrate on tone of voice and choosing words that aren't hurtful. It is absolutely unacceptable to use name-calling, ridicule, shame, or emotional or physical violence to another person. 3) When an argument occurs, step back, take a deep breath, and remain calm. Listen and determine whether it is time to problem-solve or whether there is too much tension and misunderstanding. If this is the case, state calmly that you need to have quiet space until each of you is ready to deal with the issues. You need to do this before you go to bed

to solving, allowing the issue to move farther from sight. When too much time is given to hold on to unsolved problems, pride and control lock the problems inside the person and peace is very difficult to create. 4) If you are tired, stressed with not much joy in your day, don't start out on a new adventure with family members, as there may not be enough reserve in the rest of the day to get you through. Try to be tuned in to others' moods, so if they are having a rough day, you can give them patience and space. Avoid activities that will get them angry or bring up unsolved issues. 5) Remove yourself temporarily from a situation that may be tense if you feel your control slipping. Remind yourself to stay calm, pray,

level thoughts. 6) Look at the big picture of your life and your family. There have been positive and fun things you have done together, and these bumps in the road will be over soon and a better way to solve problems has been learned that will use respect, calmness, and caring.
