



Monsignor Fournie Scholarship Request

1. The Monsignor Fournie Scholarship fund was created by Thomas R. Cromwell and Fournie's great-niece, Jeanne M. Newton. Their leadership inspired additional Ondessonk supporters to contribute to the fund. This scholarship has been established to make Camp Ondessonk accessible to St. Clair County, IL children of racial minority status and limited financial means. We are faithful to the premise that families applying for scholarship funding are in need of tuition assistance. Please help us honor the wishes of our donors with honorable participation. In many cases, a partnering agency is involved in referring Fournie Scholarship recipients to Camp Ondessonk.
2. A Monsignor Fournie Scholarship Request application form (one for each child) must be completed and submitted by mail, email (scanned copy), or fax for consideration.

3. Monsignor Fournie Scholarship requests will not be reviewed unless a completed camper registration form and copy of latest Federal 1040 form are submitted by mail prior to or with this scholarship request application. Scholarship applicants may register with a group in the same "envelope of friends" or as an individual (see "registration basics" section of brochure for registration details).
4. Registration deposit (when applicable) is refundable in the event that a scholarship is not awarded.
5. Scholarship request applications will be reviewed in the order of receipt on March 1 and May 1 of each year as funding allows. Thereafter and until the last session of camp begins, applications will be considered upon receipt as funding allows.
6. Monsignor Fournie Scholarship recipients receive round-trip bus transportation originating in Caseyville, IL, full tuition coverage, and basic camping essentials including a sleeping bag, mosquito net, and flashlight.
7. Camp Ondessonk is an equal opportunity provider of summer camp programs. Monsignor Fournie Scholarship awards are made without regard to national origin, sex, religion, or disability. However, the intent of this scholarship fund requires consideration of racial background. Children considered by the State of Illinois to be of a racial minority are eligible.
8. If a scholarship recipient must cancel, his/her scholarship award cannot be applied to another camper's tuition.
9. Camp Ondessonk may utilize a portion or all of your child's essay for fundraising or marketing purposes. If your child's essay is used, his/her last name will not be publicized.
10. **Award notification:** Camp Ondessonk will make a good-faith effort to contact the parent of each scholarship applicant within one week of application review.
11. In many cases, a partnering agency is involved in referring Fournie Scholarship recipients to Camp Ondessonk.
12. Respectfully, your child's application will not be considered unless stated scholarship request procedures are followed.
