A NEW PUBLICATION:

THE THEOLOGICAL VOICE OF WOLF WOLFENSBERGER, edited by William Gaventa & David Coulter

This 170-page book is a collection of eight papers by Wolf Wolfensberger that all deal with issues of Christian faith and theology as these relate to human impairment and societally devalued (especially handicapped) people. Five started as speeches to Catholic or multidenominational audiences. Six items have already appeared in various publications from the early 1970s to late 1980s. However, the previously published items have not heretofore been easily available because they appeared in periodicals with small and specialized distributions. There are also three responses (one Jewish and two Christian) to Wolfensberger's papers, and a review of Wolfensberger's 1992 monograph on protecting devalued people in hospitals. The last chapter is a response by Wolfensberger to the responders and the book reviewer. Below is a table of contents of the book.

Some of Wolfensberger's chapters contain material of historical interest, e.g., earlier Christian responses to needy people, and historical arguments from a Christian perspective in support of the social integration of devalued people into society, and especially into the lives of Christians. However, all papers are relevant to our time. The issue of Christian communality is addressed repeatedly in different ways in seven of Wolfensberger's chapters.

The exact same text has also been published simultaneously as a double issue of the <u>Journal of Religion, Disability & Health</u>, 2001, vol. 4, numbers 2 and 3. However, the book is more solidly bound than the journal, and more readily available for purchase.
