





Day 1: 10/13 San Francisco/Beijing

Board a convenient charter bus in the morning, and travel to San Francisco International Airport for an afternoon flight CA986 by 1:55pm to Beijing. Your adventure begins as you fly trans-Pacific aboard a wide cabin jetliner. Cross the International Dateline.

Day 2: 10/14 Beijing (King Wing Hotel/5-Star, 17 Dongsanhuan Rd. S., Tel: 86-10-67668866)

Arrive in Beijing, the Capital of China at 6:15pm. You will be met by your local tour guide at the airport. Transfer to the hotel..

Day 3: 10/15 Beijing

Visit the Tian An Men Square, the largest square in the world, and the Temple of Heaven, built in 1420 A.D., where the emperors prayed to the heaven for a good harvest Sightseeing also includes the Palace Museum, also known as the Forbidden City, home of 24 emperors with a total space of 9,999 rooms, and the Summer Palace, known for many significance such as the Long Corridor with painted gallery, Kunming Lake and Longevity Hill, Seventeen- Arch Bridge and Marble Boat.

Day 4: 10/16 Beijing

Tour bus excursion to the Great Wall, the 4,000- mile long and 2,000 years old construction is said to be the only man-made structure visible by naked eye from the moon. Visit to the Ming Tombs, one of 13 Ming Emperors' Tombs is fully excavated and open for exploration. Roasted Beijing Duck Dinner.

Day 5: Beijing/Shanghai/Suzhou

Morning flight CA 1519 to Shanghai, then take the tour bus trip to Suzhou. Evening dinner show of traditional Chinese music.

Day 6: Suzhou/Hangzhou

Morning sightseeing to the centuries old Lingering Garden, Tiger Hill, and Hanshan Temple. Visit to the National Embroidery Institute to see silk embroidery, and important local craft with 1,000 year history. Afternoon tour bus journey to Hangzhou. Visit Economic Development Zone.

Day 7: Hangzhou/Shanghai

Morning boat cruise on West Lake with relaxing stopover at jewel-like pagodas and tea houses. Visit to the centuries old Lingyin Temple, which features the 64.3 ft. high camphor-wood carved Buddha. Afternoon tour bus to Shanghai.

Day 8: Shanghai

Sightseeing includes the Yu Garden, a maze of marvelous pavilions, ponds, rocks, and over arching trees. Visit the Bund, a famous waterfront park. Business visit to the Pudong economic development zone.

Day 9: Shanghai/San Francisco

A non-refundable registration fee of \$200 per person is required and due at the time of your registration. This will be deducted from your total tour fare, the balance of which is due by August 14, 2009. Securing or updating your passport is your responsibility. Passports must be valid 6 months past travel date. Richmond Chamber will handle visa applications. Cost of the visa is \$145 each. Travelers will need to provide passport, signed visa application form, two passport photos and the \$145 visa application fee payable to Richmond Chamber and mailed no later than October 1, 2009. Passports will be returned within 10 working days. Notification of tour cancellation for any reason must be in writing by the passenger who purchases the trip. Verbal cancellation by phone is not acceptable. Any cancellation refunds will be calculated from the date the written cancellation is received in our offices. Should the traveler's cancellation change rooming arrangements, thereby incurring single supplement charge to their roommate, the amount of that charge will be deducted from the traveler's refund. This is in addition to any other cancellation fees that may apply. To receive a refund, all air tickets and all other travel documents must be returned to Richmond Chamber. Applicable refunds will be processed promptly following receipt of the written cancellation and documents. Any cancellation after August 14, 2009 will lose \$500 plus the \$200 non-refundable deposit. Any cancellation made after the departure date of your trip will lose all monies paid. China visa handling fee is not refundable and is in addition to the above penalty if the visa is processed.
