Thoughts from your District Governor

I usually don't receive a lot of feedback on these articles. In fact, sometimes I'm curious if they are even being read. Well last month's article seems to have been enjoyed by several of you, since I've received many comments on it. Apparently the thought of the District Governor being strapped in a helicopter simulator, upside-down and underwater is enjoyable to a lot of you. Maybe it's a sign of the times, when a mixture of danger and humiliation sells. Well the people have spoken, so for this month's article we go back to the late 1980s in Austin, Texas.

During the first few years when I was attending The University of Texas, I was in the Army ROTC program. I got out of the program before I had to sign a commitment to join the Army. I joined in the first place to get to do some of the fun things like flying in helicopters, shooting M60 machine guns and learning to rappel. Rappelling was a lot of fun. We started off learning the basics and techniques in the classroom. Since the training was part of ROTC, we learned how to rappel using minimal store-bought rappelling gear. No padded harnesses or belts for us. We learned how to tie our own Swiss Seat harness (if it doesn't hurt then you are doing it wrong, we were told) from an excess piece of the rappelling rope. Then clip on a carabineer, attach to the rope and rappel. After the classroom section was over, we started off on a small wall that was part of a drainage system on campus. It couldn't have been more than 10 or 12 feet from top to bottom. We did that until everyone was proficient. Then we moved on to the final part of the training. The top of the lower level of Darrell K. Royal-Texas Memorial Stadium (then it had the much shorter name of War Memorial Stadium). I tried searching to see how high this was, but a quick search didn't turn up the results. I'd include a picture, but with expansion it doesn't resemble the same stadium I rappelled from in the 80s. Needless to say, when we looked over the edge from up there it looked like a long, long way down to the ground. Well, we all tied up our Swiss seats (I'm not sure how blood was able to flow to my legs at the time, because I cinched that rope up super tight) and one by one clipped on to the rope and rappelled our way down. We had someone helping us over the edge and easing us down to take the initial slack out of the rope. We also had someone on the ground on belay. The person on belay was a safety for the person rappelling. At any time if something looked out of control, the belay could pull the rope tight and the person rappelling would be stopped. That was part of the exercise, while pushing off the wall to rappel down the person on belay would pull the rope tight to show us how they could control our descent. I'm glad I was able to take part in this exercise and actually rappelled a few extra times. You only had to do it once and many only did do it once so I had extra time to do it a few times. Everyone made it down and training was complete.

So what does this have to do with Lions? You could make a couple of connections. The one I'll make is that if a Sergeant Major can take a bunch of knuckleheaded 18 year old college kids and teach them how to properly rappel safely off of a couple hundred feet high college football stadium, then anyone can be taught something new. For Lions this could be as easy as logging in to the Lions Learning Center on the LCI website and learning a new skill or honing an existing one. The leadership development that is available through Lions is a great resource and we should all try and make sure we are putting it to use. It might not help you go down the side of a football stadium, but it will definitely help strengthen you and your club. Stay Frosty.

Thought's from the First Vice District Governor ...

Last weekend I attended the February meeting of the Council of Governors. After listening to instructions, reports and discussions, I was reviewing in my mind the weekend. Much of the information was centered around two topics membership and service. Membership - service. Service - membership. Which order is "the right one"? I was reminded of the story of the indian chief that had a dilemma. So he went to a doctor and said "Doc, you got to help me. I don't know what to do. I have a teepee and a wigwam. I cannot decide which one to sleep in. Should I sleep in the teepee or the wigwam? I can't sleep trying to decide. Please help me!" Upon which the learned doctor responded " No problem you are just too tense (tents). Relax and choose one." (polite laughter is now appreciated). Without members, we can not serve. But without service, the public does not know we are there. Let me illustrate the question in another manner. After Hurricane Ivan devastated the south Alabama coast, I led a small group to help with the cleanup. Four us ran chainsaws for a week cutting up downed or dangerous trees for different people/families. One house we were sent to was that of an elderly man, living alone. There were trees down all around his house. In some cases, the trees were stacked 2 and 3 deep. He was in a daze. He met us and said "I don't know what to do.". Think about it. What would you do? What would you say? One of the things I have learned about helping others is that time needs to be spent talking with and listening to those that you go to help. We listened to him. Then we said - "Pick up a limb and put somewhere.". After he did that, we said- "Now pick up another limb and put it with the first limb. Now you have pile." The four of us ran chainsaws all day - probably 6-7 hours. We made a lot of piles. But it was his final words that had the most impact on us. As we were getting ready to leave, he thanked us and said - "I don't feel alone and forgotten anymore. I know what to do. Make a pile.". The next day, we were sent to another location - that's another story. Ask me about a Texas weather stump and chocolate chip cookies sometime. All this brings me back to my original question - service or membership. For me, service is the first step. That is what we are about. Membership comes from service. Because we serve, people see our works and life changes we make and want to be a part of that process. Service is force of change - lives, activities, and membership. And all of these impact service. So let's serve others and change lives - theirs and ours. God bless you all.

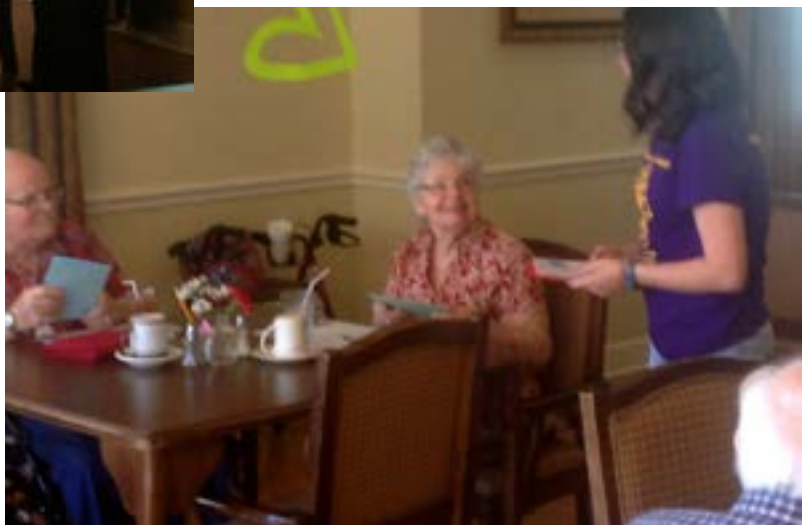
SHSU Lions Club, and one of their activities during the month of February was distributing Valentine's Cards to a local nursing home.

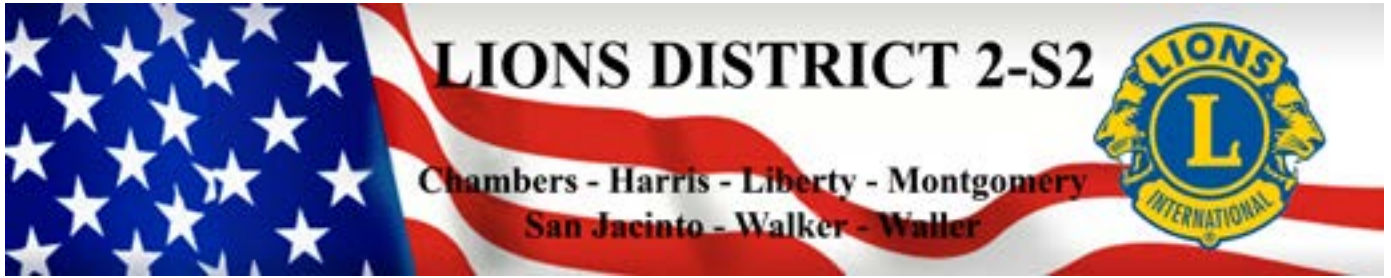

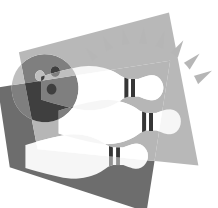

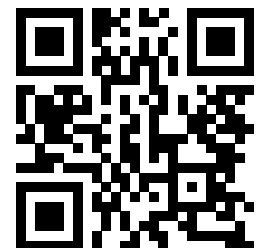
