# **Registration Procedure**

Registration will be held from April 1 -30, 2015.

- 1. Complete the application form and submit to the office: Monday-Friday 8:00am-4:00pm. (Mailed applications should be marked: ATTN: SUMMER SCHOOL DIRECTOR)
- 2. All applications MUST be signed by a PARENT/GUARDIAN.
- 3. Tuition Payment MUST accompany the application form.
- \*Checks should be made payable to: Kawananakoa Middle School
- \*\*Pursuant to Act 45, SLH 1981, the Department of Education will assess a fee of \$25 (cash) for each returned check. Do not mail cash.
- 4. Class confirmation will be emailed or sent home with students after the registration period.
- 5. Receipts will be sent home with students the first week of Summer School: June 15 June 19.

\$190 for two periods of enrichment classes OR one credit-recovery class

# **Meal Service**

Students may NOT leave campus to purchase lunch.

#### **Attendance**

<u>Absences:</u> One summer school day is the equivalent of approximately one week of regular school. Therefore, attendance is important and will be dealt with on a daily basis. Two (2) unexcused absences will result in immediate dismissal and/or failure with no refund. No excused absences for family trips or sports will be granted during the summer session.

Reporting of absences: Excused absences must be reported by:

- 1. A telephone call from parent/guardian to the office by 8:00am on the day of the absence AND
- 2. A note from the parent/guardian to the teacher indicating the reason and date(s) of absence(s) on the first day the student returns to school.

<u>Tardies:</u> Students need to be in school on time. Students with unexcused tardies will make up time missed with the summer school director after school. Students arriving tardy 30 minutes or more will be considered absent for the day.

#### **Report Cards**

Report cards will be given to each student on the last day of summer school. Students will earn either a "satisfactory" or "unsatisfactory" grade for enrichment classes. Letter grades will be given for credit-recovery classes.

#### **Tuition Waivers**

There are no tuition waivers available at this time from the Department of Education. However, the Native Hawaiian Summer School Assistance Program is providing tuition assistance. Documented financial need is a requirement. Applications should be submitted directly to Alu Like, Inc. #### Refunds

Withdrawal prior to the start of summer school, BEFORE 4:00pm June 12<sup>th</sup> 100% Refund

Withdrawal on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of summer school, BEFORE 4:00pm June 15<sup>th</sup> 50% Refund

No refunds after June 15<sup>th</sup>, 2015.

### **Supplies**

Students should bring the following on the first day of school:

- 1 eraser
- 1 black ink pen

Teachers may request additional supplies.

# 2015 COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

**ENRICHMENT COURSES** (Courses are subject to cancellation due to low enrollment.)

Transition to Middle School Instructor: Mr. Baron

Class Availability: Period 1 or Period 2 Enrollment Open To: Incoming 6<sup>th</sup> graders

**Class Description:** Students will be given an orientation of the campus and the school's expectations and procedures. Students will be exposed to grade 6 content in Language Arts, Math, Social Studies, and Science.

Orchestra Instructor: Mr. Masuno

Class Availability: Period 1 Only Enrollment Open To: All Students

Class Description: Students in this class will learn how to play the violin, viola, cello or string bass.

Students who are continuing in orchestra will be able to strengthen their fundamentals on their instrument and

further their performance music standards and repertoire.

Band, Beginning Instructor: Mr. Chin/ Mr. Miyashiro

Class Availability: Period 1 Only Enrollment Open To: Students with no band experience

**Class Description:** Students will learn to play a wind or percussion instrument. The class will focus on development of motor skills and general musicianship. Students will be responsible for the cost of method books and other consumable supplies, which will vary by instrument. Students may use their own sticks, mallets, mouthpieces, etc.

Band, Intermediate Instructor: Mr. Chin/ Mr. Miyashiro

Class Availability: Period 2 Only Enrollment Open To: Students with teacher approval

**Class Description:** This course is designed for students with at least one year of band experience. It continues instruction on correct fundamentals of tone production and expands note reading. Students will be responsible for the cost of method books and other consumable supplies, which will vary by instrument. Students may use their own sticks, mallets, mouthpieces, etc.

Class Availability: Period 1 or Period 2 Enrollment Open To: All students

Space Science.


Social Studies Gr. 6 Social Studies Gr. 8
