The reason I didn't get a full cat back system was because various exhaust specialists (including Chris @ Best Mufflers) said the cat back system was pretty good to begin with. He said I'd get just as much of a power increase from changing the rear box (which, along with the flexi, are bolt on restrictors) than if I did the whole cat back system. Of course, I'd be interested in confirming actual power increase on the dyno.

Remus have proven themselves time and time again with quality exhausts and proven results. Sure, it is expensive, but since when are great things cheap?

At the end of the day, Jeff, it is your choice. I don't think you'd be disappointed either way.


