### Consumer Decision Making:

This year we will be hosting two sessions for consumer decision making. Each session will have the four problems that we use to determine our county's CDM Team for the State Fair. The change for this year though is that youth will have the opportunity to do all 8 problems if they wish instead of having to come to two separate sessions. This will be up to the youth if they wish to do this.

### Market Beef Weigh-Ins - March 14th

Market beef weight-ins and DNA sampling will be held on Saturday, March 14th from 9-11 a.m. at the Dell Rapids Vet Clinic. Any market steer or market heifers that may potentially be exhibited at 4-H Achievement Days must be green tagged and weighed in at a supervised weigh-in. If you plan to take your animals to the South Dakota State Fair or Ak-Sar-Ben, you will also need a DNA sample pulled . Cost of the DNA sampling is \$6.00 per sample, payable at time of sampling. Keep in mind that both parent and 4-H'er must sign the DNA envelopes and affidavits.

Livestock affidavits must also be completed. Affidavits will be available the day of weigh-in or can be filled out in advance so only the weight needs to be entered that day. Affidavits are available form the <u>4-H Office</u>, on <u>4-H Online</u> or on igrow.org.

Sheep, Swine and Goats weigh in date is tentatively set for May 16, 2015 in Sioux Falls. DNA testing for all market animals will be done again this year at the time of weight-in. Remember to enroll in the Beef Project Area prior to weigh-in date!

### **Verification (Affidavit) Forms**

**Livestock Affidavits are due to the 4-H Office for ALL livestock that will be exhibited.** The deadlines for lease forms and affidavits to be in the 4-H Office are:

**NOTE:** Rabbits and Poultry has been changed to a June 1st deadline with the rest of the livestock. Remember that all poultry need leg bands (one per bird) and must have the division, breed and hatch date listed on the affidavit. All rabbits need to be tattooed (one per rabbit) in their left ear.

All animals will need to be entered into 4-H Online and the affidavits will still need to be completed and returned to the 4-H Office. Livestock affidavits are available from the 4-H Office, 4-H Online under Announcements & Newsletters, or igrow.org.

Scrapie tag numbers are required on the sheep and goat verification forms. If you raise your own sheep/goats and do not have your own herd scrapie tags, you need to contact the Animal Industry Board at 605-773 -3321.

### **PQA Dates Set**

### **Livestock Changes to be Aware Of**

Starting this 4-H year, market sheep and market meat goats will not be green tagged because they already have a scrapie tag in their ear that is a federal tag. They will still be weighed, but their identifier will be the scrapie tag. Breeding sheep and breeding meat goats will use their scrapie tag as the official identification. Dairy goats will need either a scrapie tag or a tattoo for identification. If you are in need of scrapie tags, contact the Animal Industry Board at 605-773-3321.

Also starting this year, breeding beef and dairy will need one of the following: a registration tag, registration tattoo, EID tag, complete bangs tag or a 4-H green tag number. No herd tags will be allowed for identification purposes. To be eligible for all Purebred Registered Breeding show, exhibitors are required to have registration papers in their name, farm name, family, or sibling name. A copy of the registration papers must be turned into the 4-H Office by July 1st.

Beginning in the 2015-2016 4-H year, South Dakota 4-H will move to completely different tags for market animals, breeding beef and dairy. We will begin using the NUES tags (National Unified Ear-Tagging System). These tags are federally required for animals to cross state lines.

Both **poultry and rabbits** will need to have verification sheets completed and turned into the 4-H Office by June 1st. Rabbits will need to have a tattoo in the left ear. Poultry will need to have leg bands and will need to be listed on the affidavit with division, breed and hatch date listed.

### **SWINE PQA**

Due to the 4-H Office July 1st. All youth who would like to exhibit swine at the 2015 South Dakota State Fair need to be trained and certified in Youth PQA PLUS. Watch future newsletters for dates, places and times of PQA certification sessions.

### COOL AND 4H/FFA LIVESTOCK

Country of Origin Law (COOL) requires retailers to ensure that country of origin information is provided for meat products, including ground and whole muscle cuts of beef, lamb, pork, poultry, and goat. Though 4-H'ers are not directly regulated by COOL, the first-hand knowledge of their project's country of origin requires them to provide documentation for the retail chain.

What 4-H and FFA Youth Need to Do? A simple affidavit has been developed that can work for all species of livestock (beef, sheep, swine, poultry, goat). The document explains the steps needed to be taken as well as example documents that can be used for an audit trail. This document is available at the 4-H Office or on iGrow.

**4-H and FFA Youth who raise their own livestock:** For their projects, members need to complete the document and keep it on file for a minimum of two years.

**4-H and FFA Youth who purchase their livestock from others** MUST have the producer fill out the document, give it to the youth, and the youth should keep the document on file for a minimum of two years. For more information, please contact the 4-H Office.



### **AK-SAR-BEN**

If you as a 4-H'er or parent are unable to be at the County Weigh-Ins and wish to have someone else bring your animals in to be weighed, and if you wish to participate in the AK-SAR-BEN show in September 2015, you must complete a Waiver and Hold Harmless Agreement prior to weigh-in. Contact the 4-H Office if you have any questions or need to complete a waiver.

The Ak-Sar-Ben 4-H Stock Show is a 4-H only Stock Show that is held annually in Omaha, Nebraska the last week of September. 4-H members from Colorado, Illinois, Iowa, Kansas, Minnesota, Missouri, North Dakota, South Dakota, Nebraska and Wyoming have the opportunity to make entries and exhibit. The Stock Show has a growing scholarship program that distributed nearly \$125,000 in scholarship benefits last year to 4-H members in our ten state area to help further their education. In addition to seven livestock shows, the schedule also includes several non-livestock competitions including a Quiz Bowl competition, Livestock Judging contests with divisions for 4-H, Junior College and Senior College teams and a Fitting Challenge competition.

### **RURAL YOUTH LOANS**

The U.S. Department of Agriculture's Farm Service Agency (FSA) makes operating loans of up to \$5,000 to eligible individual rural youths age 10 through 20 to finance income-producing, agriculture-related projects. The project must be of modest size; educational; and initiated, developed and carried out by rural youths participating in 4-H clubs, FFA, or a similar organization. ### **How to Add Animals in 4HOnline**

- 1. Log into your 4HOnline Account. Go to sd.4honline.com to access your account. Use the e-mail you provided for your 4-H enrollment.
- 2. Click on continue to family.
- 3. Click edit next to the 4-H'er that you want to add animals for.
- 4. Click on the Animals/Livestock tab on the top of the screen.
- 5. Select the Animal type you would like to add.
- 6. Click Add Animal.
- 7. Enter the requested Animal Information. Items that are in bold need to be filled in.
- 8. You can upload your pictures of your horses and livestock registration papers. The 4-H Office needs a copy all registration papers.
- 9. All verification sheets, horse ID forms, horse safety forms and lease forms must come to the office to be uploaded as they must be signed by the 4-H Advisor.

If family members are sharing an animal, choose a member to list it under and only enter it one time in the system. Members will have the option to show any animals listed under any of their family members.

### **4-H Youth Horse Training Requirements**



Youth who plan to participate at the South Dakota State 4-H Horse Show are required to complete Youth Horse Training and submit the Horse Project: Achievement Program form by June 1. Youth will complete a new training topic this year that focus on the safety of proper nutrition and the importance of being safe while feeding horses. New training activities and worksheets have been developed to further youth's knowledge in the Horse Project. Youth must complete a Youth-in-Action event, talk or demonstration about Horse Educations and Safety at a 4-H club, county or state meeting or activity. ### Skill - a - Thon

All youth (4-H and FFA) are encouraged to compete in skill-a-thon. Youth do not need to exhibit a project animal or register prior to attending the State Fair to compete in a livestock skill-a-thon. This is a free event. Youth may participate in any and all livestock skill-a-thongs. Beginner, Junior, and Senior divisions will follow the age division guidelines listed. Youth must be a current member of a 4-H club or FFA chapter. Skill-a-thons offered are: Beef, Goat (Dairy and Meat Goat Combined), Rabbit, Sheep, and Swine. Refer to the State Fair schedule for times.

### **Enter Livestock into 4-H Online**

Start gathering information on your show animals. Beginning now, you will be able to start entering animal information into 4HOnline for all animals except market animals ( the 4-H Office will once again be inputting the market animal information into 4-H Online). For all species, you will need to complete the ownership verification affidavits and turn those into the 4-H Office. When completing the livestock affidavits, pay special attention to the columns with an asterisk at the top. These are **required fields** and the State 4-H Office will not accept the forms without them being completely filled in. Remember, all livestock affidavit MUST be turned into the 4-H Office prior to the deadline. Get started with your market beef before the beef weigh-in on Saturday, March 14th in Dell Rapids from 9-11 am!

### 2015 Young Scientist Challenge

Discovery Education and 3M are again sponsoring the Young Scientist Challenge. Students in grades 5-8 are asked to propose a new innovation or solution to an everyday problem, and explain their solution in a one-to-two minute video. Registration is currently open at the **Young Scientist Challenge** website. Parents must sign a consent form and register their child. Students may then log-in and complete the student profile and upload their video presentation. Entries close on April 21, 2015.

The video will explain the problem and how it impacts the student, their family, their community or the global population. It will describe a new innovation or solution that could solve or impact the problem. It also explains the science, technology, engineering and/or mathematics behind the innovation. Finally, the video will illustrate how their innovation could both address the everyday problem identified and have a broader impact locally or globally.

To help students get started, 3M provides some thought-starters intended to help identify problems and think of creative solutions. They include: How we communicate, How we move, How we stay healthy, and How we make a difference. Additionally, students can view videos from past finalists.

After the entry deadline of April 21, the judging begins. A panel of judges selected from education, research and science communication judge each entry and score it based on this criteria:

- 30% for creativity
- 30% for scientific knowledge
- 20% for persuasiveness and effective communication
- 20% for the overall presentation

Ten finalists are announced in early June and given the opportunity to participate in a summer mentorship program with a 3M scientist as well as the final event activities, which occur in October at the 3M headquarters in Minneapolis, MN.

During the finals, students will give a presentation about their innovation and participate in some event challenges that they prepared for during their summer internship. Each finalist receives \$1000. The Grand Prize is \$25,000 cash, a trip to a destination such as Costa Rica, and the title of America's Top Young Scientist. Three runner-up winners also receive a travel prize. Six honorable mention prizes are awarded, \$500 toward an excursion from Excitations Company.


