



## COMPLIANCE AFFIDAVIT

1. You are today being placed on a type of probation for a ticket for a period of time set out in your Court Order. You will receive a copy of that Court Order, which states when your probation begins and ends (the “Probation Period”). The date your probation ends will be referred to herein as the “Probation Ending Date”.
2. As a condition to that probation, and without which the ticket CANNOT be dismissed, you are required to sign and return to the Clerk the affidavit attached to this document (the “Affidavit”) before a notary or the Court Clerk, dated and notarized after the Probation Ending Date. The reason it must be signed **after the Probation Ending Date** is because the Court requires you to state, under oath, that you have not committed any offense against the laws of this State or any other State that have resulted in a conviction, and have complied with the terms of your probation. Therefore, you cannot sign it until after the Probation Period has ended.
3. To sign it and have it notarized, you can go to the Georgetown Municipal Court office at 101 East 7th Street, request the Affidavit, and sign it before a notary / court clerk there. Otherwise, you can mail it to the Georgetown Municipal Court, P. O. Box 1424, Georgetown, Texas 78627-1424. If you submit it by mail, you must sign it in front of a notary public and have the notary public sign and seal the document.
4. Your probation period will not be satisfied, and **the ticket will not be dismissed**, until you have properly signed the Affidavit before a notary or court clerk and return it to the Court. You must submit the Affidavit to the Court within ten (10) days after your probation period has ended.
