

GENERAL APPLICATION FOR FELLOWSHIPS

for 2016–2017

APPLICATION GUIDELINES

Please submit one copy of single-sided and loose (not stapled or bound) application materials printed on A4 or 8.5" x 11" paper. Books, bound galleys, and off-prints are not accepted. To be considered complete, an application must consist of the following documents, labeled and paginated in the following order:

- Completed application form (General Application for Fellowships for 2016–2017)
- Titled project proposal
 - Professors, scholars, journalists, professionals, non-fiction writers, applicants in
 film: five to seven double-space pages with a description of your scholarly or
 professional project, a work plan, the form of your project (i.e. book, set of
 critical essays, professional study), and an explanation of how a residency at the
 American Academy might be significant for your work.
 - o *Fiction writers and poets*: a writing sample (15 to 20 pages) from your proposed project.

Note: We welcome projects at all stages of development. Significance of a Berlin residency is of secondary importance in the Selection Committee's deliberations.

- Curriculum vitae (abbreviated version of 10-12 pages, including list of publications, lectures, filmography, etc.)
- Supporting materials
 - Scholars, professionals, and writers: two recent and representative writing samples, i.e. chapters or articles from published or forthcoming work (please, no bound galleys or books; suggested limit combined: 60 pages)
 - Ocumentary and feature film applicants: two copies in "Region 1" DVD format and two copies in "Region 2" format (please label with your name and format)

In order to be eligible to apply for a fellowship at the American Academy in Berlin, you must be based permanently in the US. US citizenship is not required; American expatriates are not eligible. Candidates in academic disciplines must have completed their doctorates at the time of application; writers need to have published at least one book.

The Academy cannot assume responsibility for lost materials. Application materials are submitted at the candidate's own expense and are not returned. We advise you not to send original manuscripts and to retain copies of all items submitted.

When sending samples of work overseas, please include a Customs Declaration Form stating "No Commercial Value" for the contents. The Academy cannot pay for customs duties, nor is it responsible for complications due to customs clearance.

Candidates for 2016-2017 fellowships will be notified in late February 2016.

Bosch Prizes in Public Policy are generally awarded for terms of six to eight weeks, or sometimes for a full semester.

Selection for the Guna S. Mundheim Berlin Prize in the Visual Arts and for the Inga Maren Otto Berlin Prize in Music Composition has taken place. It is based on nomination rather than application.

Fellowship assignments are made by the American Academy in Berlin after the Selection Committee has designated the Berlin Prize winners.
