As you may be aware, the National Institutes of Health (NIH) continues to consider the details of a plan to form a single institute that is dedicated to the study and treatment of substance use, abuse, and addiction. Research portfolios that are currently part of the National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism (NIAAA), the National Institute on Drug Abuse (NIDA), the National Cancer Institute (NCI), and other institutes could be moved to the new institute. In addition, research currently being conducted at NIAAA and NIDA could be exported to other NIH institutes and centers.

I am concerned that this proposal could jeopardize the tremendous breakthroughs in alcohol research that have occurred in recent years. Some of my more specific concerns are: see the attached talking points and choose a few that are of particular consequence to you].

I request that Congress look extremely closely at this ill-conceived proposal to create a new institute at NIH. In addition, Congress must ensure that NIH and the HHS Secretary comply with the controlling requirements of the NIH Reform Act.
