ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

Ryan Wood, County Administrator had nothing new to report.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

RETIREE HEALTH CARE TRUST FUND ANNUAL REPORT

Chairperson Showers called for public comments. There were no public comments.

Craig Longnecker, Deputy Administrator reviewed some of the facts of the Health Care Trust Fund. He reported that Chairperson Showers is the newest Trustee, replacing Commissioner Martin. Effective January 10, 2012 the Co-Trustees of the Health Care Plan are Sara Clark Pierson, Robert Showers and Craig Longnecker with Ryan Wood serving as the Plan Administrator.

The Post Retirement Health Care Plan only covers employees who retire with 20 years of service at age 60. At age 65 the retiree must apply for Medicare and at the point the Plan become a supplemental plan.

The total liability currently is 6.8 million and we expect it to be over 90% funded following our next actuarial.

Bill Christensen, Investment Manager of Fifth Third Bank provided a brief update on the performance of the fund. The fund began this year with a Market Value of \$6,060,627. Contributions were \$1,127,228 and distributions in the amount of \$314,603 for an adjusted beginning Market Value of \$6,873,253. The value added from the performance on the account was (\$68,298), leaving an ending Market Value on 12/31/2011 of \$6,804,955.

Mr. Christensen stated that the overall investment performance since inception on May 1, 2002 is 4.6%. He also provided the members with details on the Combined Asset Mix with 57.4% being fixed income and 42.6% being Equities.

3. Communication Enhancement Project:

APPROVAL OF PAYMENT APPLICATION NO. 2 TO T.H. MILLER

- A. <u>T.H. Miller Approval of Payment Application No 2</u>: Chairperson Clover Adams introduced discussion regarding payment application #2 from T.H. Miller.
- C2AE has indicated that the County may elect at their discretion to withhold \$1,000 of the \$27,522.10 until the site restoration is completed next spring; Administrator Wood recommends that we approve the payment application in full as T.H. Miller has shown good faith in this project and they have already offered to come back in the spring to complete the remaining site restoration work.

<u>COMMITTEE ACTION</u>: Commissioner Enderle moved, supported by Commissioner Showers, to authorize Payment Application No. 2 for T.H. Miller in the full amount of \$27,522.10. Motion carried.

APPROVAL OF PAYMENT APPLICATION NO. 2 TO SABRE TOWER

B. <u>Sabre Tower – Approval of Payment Application No. 2</u>: Chairperson Clover Adams introduced discussion regarding payment application #2 from Sabre Tower.

COMMITTEE ACTION: Commissioner Enderle moved, supported by Commissioner Showers, to authorize Payment Application No. 2 for Sabre Tower in the amount of \$154,069.20. Motion carried.

TAFT ROAD TOWER FOUNDATION UPDATE

- C. <u>Taft Road Tower Foundation Progress Update</u>: Chairperson Clover Adams introduced discussion regarding the Taft Road Tower.
- Brief discussion took place regarding the structural analysis that was completed by Harris on the Taft Road Tower; In March 2011 the standards were changed, and although this tower was originally built under Standard F, the new standards require that the foundation be strengthened/ enhanced in order to meet Standard G requirements;
- Grant Tower conducted an engineering study and has offered to reinforce the Taft Road Tower foundation to comply with Standard G requirements for an amount of \$17,980 in addition to \$2,500 for the modification design services that have already been provided; C2AE has reviewed and deemed this quote as satisfactory:
- C2AE will provide construction observation services for the amount of \$3,500
 to be sure that the sequence of construction does not become an issue with
 the cold weather work;
- Director Fyvie briefly noted the benefits of discovering the required code change now rather than later.

COMMITTEE ACTION: Commissioner Showers moved, supported by Commissioner Enderle, to authorize Grant Tower to do the foundation enhancement of the Taft Road Tower Site and authorize construction observation services from C2AE for a combined total amount of \$23,980. Motion carried.

HARRIS CORPORATION INVOICE

- D. <u>Harris Corporation Invoice</u>: Chairperson Clover Adams introduced discussion regarding the Harris Corporation Invoice.
- Director Fyvie provided a brief update on the progress made by Harris Corporation with regard to the radio enhancement project;

- Deputy Administrator Longnecker provided a brief summary and distributed a handout detailing the current budget for the Communication System Enhancement Project Budget. No action taken.

SOUTHEAST TOWER SITE LOCATION UPDATE

- F. <u>Southeast Tower Site Location Progress Update</u>: Chairperson Clover Adams introduced Jim Fyvie, Central Dispatch Director, to provide a progress update on the Southeast Tower Site location.
- Director Fyvie provided a brief update regarding the status of the Vail property;
 Mr. Vail has proposed a location that is ¼ ½ mile east of the original location;
- Harris Corporation has assured us that we can get this location licensed from the FCC; however we will have to reduce power by a half percent; this change will not be a problem as we will still meet our ultimate goal of 95% coverage countywide;
- We are at a point where we will need to get this site surveyed so that we can come up with a proposal, get a lease signed and secure the site as a final location.

- 2. Finance Chairperson Pohl requested limited public comments.
- Larry Kindel, a Retiree from the Road Commission, expressed his concerns regarding the interpretation of House Bill No. 4152 and how it pertains to retirees during the collective bargaining process; Mr. Kindel is asking for clarification on the language and would like some direction on this matter.

CLINTON AREA TRANSIT AUTHORITY BUDGET AND MILLAGE RENEWAL REQUEST

- 3. Finance Chairperson Pohl introduced Rose May Mason, Clinton Area Transit System (CATS) Authority, to provide a brief update regarding the proposed 2012/2013 budget and proposed millage renewal for the August 2012 ballot.
- The Members were given information regarding the increase in service provided by Clinton Transit for the last two years and an estimated increase in ridership expected for this year:
- The Members were briefed on the cost reduction measures that are taking place to help reduce operating costs;
- The Members were given information on the proposed 2012/2013 budget;
- Discussion took place regarding a second millage renewal request.

<u>COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION</u>: Commissioner Enderle moved, supported by Commissioner Martin, to **recommend** approving the FY 2012/2013 Budget of the Clinton Area Transit System Authority as presented. Motion carried.

BOARD ACTION: Commissioner Pohl moved, supported by Commissioner Enderle to concur with Committee recommendation. Motion carried.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION: Commissioner DeLong moved, supported by Commissioner Martin, to **recommend** authorizing Clinton Area Transit System Authority to place a millage proposal (renewal) of up to .2 mills for a period of 4 years on the August 2012 ballot. Motion carried.

BOARD ACTION: Commissioner Pohl moved, supported by Commissioner Martin to concur with Committee recommendation. Motion carried.

CENTRAL DISPATCH RADIO/COMMUNICATION EQUIPMENT INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT 4. Finance Chairperson Pohl introduced Central Dispatch Director, Jim Fyvie, to discuss a request to purchase and install the necessary radio/communication equipment to provide mutual back-up functionality and regional collaboration as per the intergovernmental agreement signed between Clinton, Eaton, Ingham and Livingston counties.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION: Commissioner Clover Adams moved, supported by Commissioner DeLong, to **recommend** approving up to \$135,000 from the Central Dispatch funds to cover the purchase and installation of the necessary radio communication equipment as listed in the quote provided by Harris, dated December 5, 2011. Motion carried.

BOARD ACTION: Commissioner Pohl moved, supported by Commissioner DeLong to concur with Committee recommendation. Motion carried.

TREASURER BLANKET BOND

- 4A. Finance Chairperson Pohl introduced Tina Ward, Clinton County Treasurer, to discuss the One Million Dollar Blanket Bond covering the County Treasurer.
- As required by Public Act 211 of 2007, County Treasurer Ward provided a copy of the Blanket Faithful Performance Bond in the amount of One Million Dollars issued to Clinton County by the Michigan Municipal Risk Management Authority:
- The Bond is valid for the upcoming year and also meets the statutory threshold amount required by this Act.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION: Commissioner Martin moved, supported by Commissioner Enderle, to **recommend** acknowledging submission of the Blanket Bond Report for 2012 as required by Public Act 211 of 2007. Motion carried.

BOARD ACTION: Commissioner Pohl moved, supported by Commissioner Martin to concur with Committee recommendation. Motion carried.

COUNTY PHONE SYSTEM

- Finance Chairperson Pohl introduced discussion regarding a new County IP Phone System as detailed in the Capital Improvements section of the 2012 Budget.
- The current Nortel phone system is seventeen years old and can no longer be put on a maintenance contract or have guaranteed replacement parts;
- It is proposed that Clinton County purchase a new Avaya IP Phone System from Strategic Products and Services (SPS) under the State Contract for the amount of \$277,000;
- The City of Lansing, East Lansing and MSU have been contacted regarding their Avaya IP phone systems and the response has been excellent; they also used the same vendor to install and maintain their phone system.

COMMITTEE ACTION: Commissioner Enderle moved, supported by Commissioner DeLong, to approve the purchase of a new Avaya phone system per the 2012 Budget. Motion carried.

ST. JOHNS PUBLIC SCHOOLS REQUEST TO LEASE SMITH HALL

6. Finance Chairperson Pohl introduced discussion regarding a proposed lease with St. Johns Public Schools for the use of Smith Hall as a temporary kitchen during the renovation/expansion of the facilities at St. Johns Public Schools.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION: Commissioner Martin moved, supported by Commissioner Enderle, to **recommend** approving the St. Johns Public Schools lease of Smith Hall for the period of March through June of 2013. Motion carried.

BOARD ACTION: Commissioner Pohl moved, supported by Commissioner Clover Adams to concur with Committee recommendation. Discussion followed concerning the Smith Hall site being utilized in the event of an emergency situation during this lease. Administrator Wood noted that there are some very recent issues raised by Cooperative Extension, however Administrator Wood will work through the issue with Extension. Motion carried.

ST. JOHNS MINT FESTIVAL COMMITTEE AGREEMENT TO USE FAIRGROUNDS FOR MINT FESTIVAL

- 7. Finance Chairperson Pohl introduced discussion regarding a request from the St. Johns Mint Festival Committee to use the Clinton County Fairgrounds.
- This year the Chamber of Commerce would also like to have a Civil War Living History Camp, which would be set up west of the horse barn and arena on the grass area;
- The camp would include approximately 20 tents that would be on display during the day and then slept in at night;
- The Mint Festival will secure all the needed camping permits through the Mid-Michigan District Health Department and will ensure appropriate safety for this event;
- The County has a standard agreement for their utilization and the Mint Festival has been responsible for paying utility costs at the Fairgrounds resulting from their utilization.

IN RE: PUBLIC SERVICES COMMITTEE - OPPOSITION TO THE EARLY RELEASE OF VIOLENT OFFENDERS BY THE MICHIGAN DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS

To the Oakland County Board of Commissioners Chairperson, Ladies and Gentlemen:

WHEREAS recent events of violence against Oakland County residents by parolees of the Michigan Department of Corrections have alarmed citizens and public officials; and

WHEREAS according to reports in the Oakland Press on November 10, 2011 a homeless couple, both convicted felons, beat and murdered a Royal Oak woman in order to steal the woman's ATM card. The man accused of the murder was sentenced to 5-30 for home invasion. He was paroled September 29, 2010 despite past encounters with the law for rape and arson; and

WHEREAS the same Oakland Press article reports that on November 18, 2011, also in the City of Royal Oak, a 54 year old Detroit man was arrested for attempting to break down the front door of a resident, who was home at the time. The suspect had just gotten out of prison six days earlier. The suspect, who had a long record of burglaries and theft, had served the minimum of a 3-30 year sentence; and

WHEREAS the Oakland Press also reports that in the City of Ferndale a man out of prison only six days is alleged to have beaten and robbed a man in his Ferndale home on October 31, 2011. The suspect had been sentenced to 8-20 years in 2002 and was paroled in October of 2011; and

WHEREAS the Oakland County Prosecutor, along with several other prosecutors have had to sue the Michigan Department of Corrections for information on potential parolees; and

WHEREAS prosecutors statewide have gone to court to protest the pending parole of inmates considered to be dangerous.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Oakland County Board of Commissioners urges the Michigan Department of Corrections to review criteria used to determine eligibility for parole of violent and repeat offenders. We oppose the practice of releasing violent and repeat offender inmates near the minimum end of their sentence.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Oakland County Clerk forward copies of this resolution to the Governor, Director of the Michigan Department of Corrections, the Oakland County Legislative Body and all Michigan Boards of Commissioners.

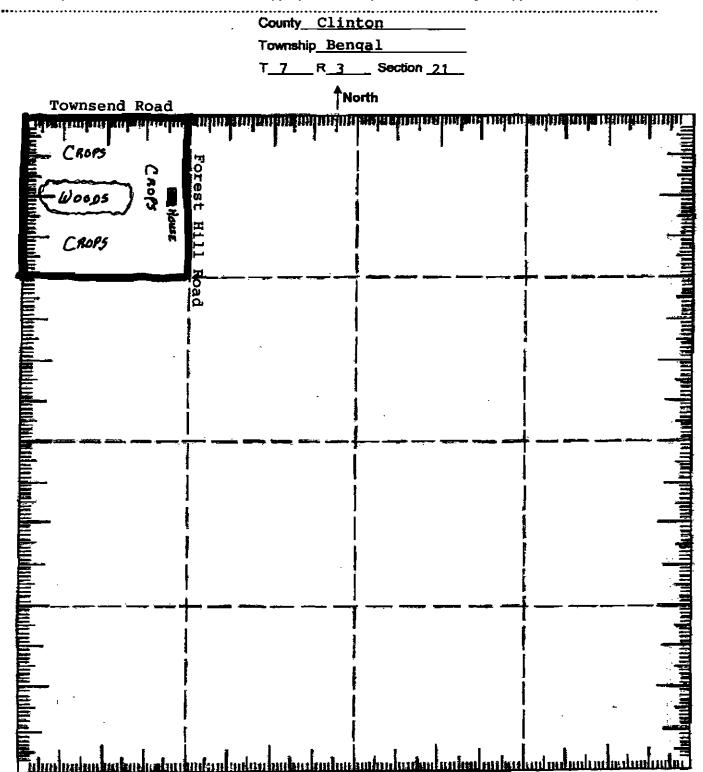

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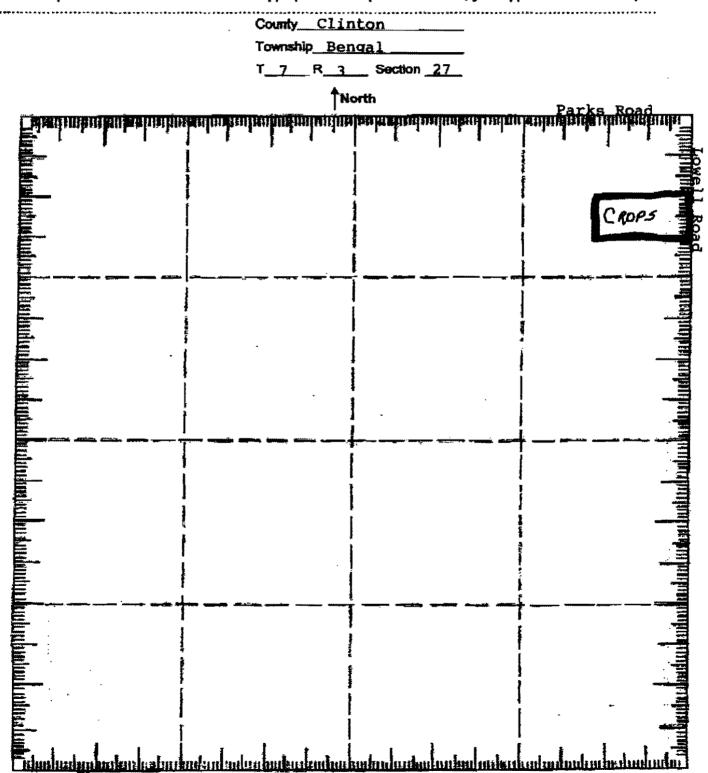
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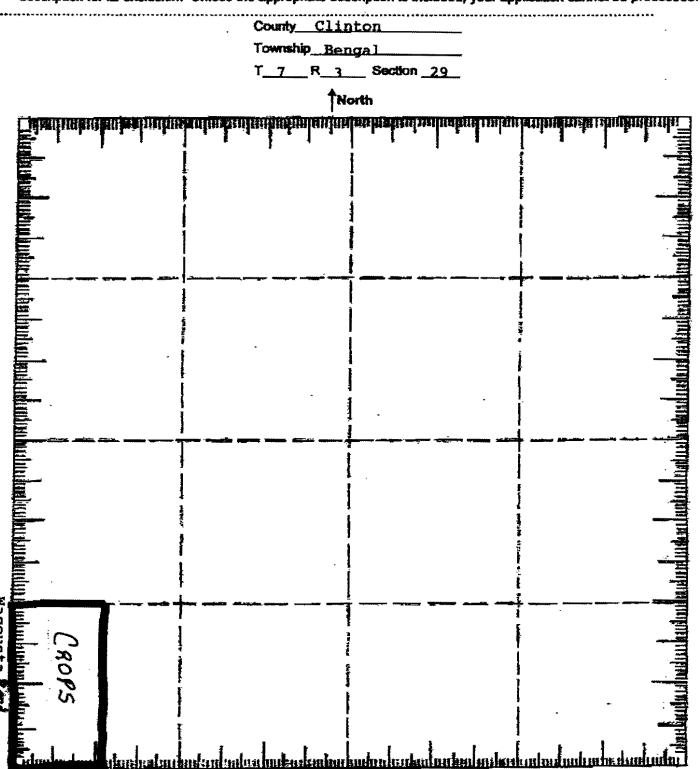
