To have a race entry form included in the Newsletter. Send one copy of the entry form with a check or money order for \$60 payable to GRTC (no cash please) to the George Tillson at the above address by the 15th of the month. Entry forms received without payment will not be included in the Newsletter. The \$60 charge DOES NOT include printing of the inserts. Arrangements may be made to have them printed by our printer or they may be printed elsewhere and 550 copies delivered to East Ridge OuickPrint, 1258 East Ridge Road, Irondequoit by the 21st of the month. Entries to be inserted must be no larger than 8.5" by 14" and must not be folded. Entries may also be published as a page in the Newsletter. Copied should be 8.5" by 11" and will be reduced at no cost to fit our page.

Race entries to be included in the newsletter must meet GRTC guidelines. There are two main qualifications: 1. Conditions covering awards must be clearly stated (minimum of top 10% in each age group is recommended.) 2. There must be no reference to drawings that might conflict with Postal Service regulations, especially use of the term "raffle".

Advertising from commercial sources will be accepted as a service to members at the rate of \$75 per page (\$200 for 3 months), \$50 1/2 page (\$135 for 3 months) and \$25 per 1/4 page (\$70 for 3 months). Business card size ads will be accepted at the rate of \$15 for one month or \$40 for three consecutive months. Submit ads to Terry Robbins, 60 Crittenden Blvd. Apt. 621, Rochester, NY 14620. Contributions of articles, photos, race experiences, opinions or simply notes are welcome and actively solicited. Volunteer help is always welcome. 


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Run for Hospice: bigger, better and Bagley again

Scott wins for third time in race that has become a happening

"You don't have a race anymore; you have a festival," a fellow race director told Pete VanPeursem after the third annual Run for Hospice 5K. By all accounts, that about sums up the event.

Of course it was a race, and a good one. Scott Bagley, the only winner the race has ever known, won as always. This time he came home in 14:45, five seconds ahead of Scott Knapp who has been getting closer and closer to the top spot in the big races. Since the time was two seconds better than his record in the inaugural race it earned an extra \$100. Top men and women won \$150. Todd Reeser, one of the topranked runners in the country at longer distances, was third for the third straight time.

Audra Naujokis-Knapp (Mrs. Scott Knapp) won the women's race in 17:26, four seconds ahead of Charlene Lyford of Greene who has been making the more-than-100 miles drive to be a regular in the big local races this year. Audra was second the first year but missed last year's edition. The record is 16:45, set last year by Vicki Mitchell who has since moved away from Western New York.

Masters competition wasn't quite as tight as might have been expected considering that the national champion Genesee Valley Harriers teammates who finished 1-2-3 are closely matched, and defending Hospice champion Tim McMullen usually has a slight edge. Not this time. Charlie Andrews turned the tables with a sparkling 15:47. to Tim's 16:09. He didn't, however, beat Tim's 15:41 record set last year). Charlie McMullen, the first-year winner, finished third in 16:24.

Top woman master was Susan Rowley in 19:17. She seems to have found turning 40 this year a tonic and has been running great all season. Her time was well ahead of defending champion Laurie Kinsella's 20:10, but not close to Laurie's record 18:56 set last year. Jackie Wellott was third in 20:28.

Prize money (all donated by PrimaCare of Rochester) was \$150, \$100, \$75, \$50 and \$35 for the first five places in men's and women's open and masters competition. There were mall gift certificates of \$25, \$15 and \$10 for the top three finishers in each age group. Groups with more than 30 finishers got additional \$10 awards to the rest of the top 10 percent finishers.

Participation was up to more than 700, counting 130 walkers and 50 young fun-runners. The 5K itself had 523 finishers, up from 381 last year.

But the race wasn't about prize money, it was about supporting Visiting Nurse Hospice, the organization that cared for VanPeursem's mother Helen during her last months before death from cancer October 12, 1995. The race is on the Saturday morning that is approximately the anniversary of that date. Hospice is now the major sponsor of the race and this year it will benefit to the tune of

something over \$13,000-final results aren't in yet.

That's a significant gain over the \$9,000 or so raised last year, and a lot of it came from increased sponsorship of individual runners. VanPeursem estimated that more than \$6,500 was raised by individual sponsorships, compared with about \$3,700 last year. Tops in that category was again Bryce Walker who raised \$2,813.

The festival atmosphere was built around food. Food, food and more food. Food provided by contributions and served up in the festively decorated church hall at First Bible Baptist Church on North Greece Road in Greece. That's also the site of Race with Grace, the Thanksgiving morning 10K with which Run for Hospice is a series this year with awards for combined results.

The highlight was Outback Steakhouse whose volunteer employees cooked up giant burgers for all who wanted them. Chili's provided (one guess) chili. The food was so popular that the line stretched out to North Greece Road (and the church is set back quite far from the road). VanPeursem said he recognizes that wasn't the most popular feature—though "very few complained," he said—and promised that next year a large tent with multiple food locations will be set up.

Prizes were another feature seldom seen on such a scale in this area. Total value of gift certificates, meals and merchandise was estimated at \$9,000. The number was way too great to hand out at the awards ceremony, so winners were announced by posting tear-off tags from race numbers on big boards. Winners-hundreds of them-turned the tags in for awards. Prizes were limited to advanced registrations, so that helped limit the race-day signup to about 90.

One of the most popular fund raisers was the chance to win two round-trip American Airlines tickets to just about anywhere in North America.

The highlight of the children's fun run was entertainment by Greece Paint Ally, a troupe of clowns.

A special effort was made to attract wheelchair racers. Monroe Surgical underwrote that part of the program. The seven competitors included the Rochester Rookies, a group of young wheelchair jockeys sponsored by Monroe. Wheelchair winner was Rod Shortwood.

Monroe Ambulance donated emergency medical services and provided a bike patrol.

Some of the other sponsors were Tim and Jack Rosati/Nothnagle Realtors, Breugger's Bagels, Clif Bar, Justice Florist, Montana Mills Bread Company, Pasta Makers Restaurant, Westside Chiropractic and Westside Tax Service (VanPeursem himself who provided the \$100 award for course records).

The race had a new wrinkle, "prime awards," which are prizes to men and women leaders at the first two mile marks. The idea is to encourage a strong pace. Reeser and Naujokis Knapp took the first-mile awards of \$50 Jim Dalberth certificates. Mile 2 leadership earned Bausch and Lomb Killer Loop sunglasses, and the Knapps both won them.

A big race can have its complications. VanPeursem and his sons Kyle and Philip (who both won their age groups) personally carried information flyers to every house on the route (about 250) to warn residents, but marshals reported some problems with drivers entering the road from driveways while the race was in progress. One marshal backed into the road and a collision with Reeser during the first mile, but he was able to regain the lea quickly.

The walk was set at two miles so walkers would finish at about the same time as the runners, but some of them got mixed up in the finish chute in the later stages of the race.

Host Harriers win national X-C championship

Local women place 2 in top 4 but Cats team falls short

The balance of the host Genesee Valley Harriers overcame the top finishes of their closest competitors as the locals won their first USA Track and Field national championship over 5,000 meters of Genesee Valley Park terrain Oct. 11.

Three teams finished within 23 seconds combined time for five runners, but the Harriers, led by Tim McMullen, were 22 of them to the good ahead Adirondack AC and Central Massachusetts Striders. Craig Fram of the Striders was the overall winner in commanding fashion as he led virtually from the start to finish in 15:36. Tom Dalton of Schenectady, the Adirondack top gun, was second in 15:50. Both are 40-year-olds who'd entered the masters ranks within 90 days of the race.

Lilac 10K champion Tom Carroll, 42, of Forestville in the Buffalo area was third in 16:03, five seconds ahead of McMullen who is 45. He was followed by Gary Moore (16:33), Charlie Andrews (16:39), Charlie McMullen (16:56) and Roger Messenger (17:38). The combined time was 1:23:54 to 1:24:17 for Adirondack and 1:24:18 for Central Mass. whose fourth and fifth men won spirited finish-line battles with their Adirondack counterparts but couldn't make up for Dalton's great run.

Patti Ford, 43, of the Syracuse Chargers was overall winner of the women's race in 18:46, and although that was a full three minutes ahead of the next finisher from her team, the Chargers managed the team victory by a comfortable margin over the local Cats AC team. The Cats had the third and fourth overall finishers in Ellen Coyne (20:33) and Sue Rowley (20:38), and third finisher Gail Wagner was a good 13th overall, but the Chargers balance was too strong.

Kathryn Martin, 47, of Northport, Long Island, stuck doggedly with Ford for most of the race before giving was slowly to finish 23 seconds behind her. That made Martin 45-49 national champion, but she had no team with her.

Teams consisted of five members for men 40-49 and 50-59 and three for the remaining men's groups and all women's. There was team prize money of \$400 for first, \$200 for second and \$100 for third in men's and women's 40-49; \$300 for first and \$200 for second for male 50-59 teams and \$200 for winning teams in women 50 and over and men 60-69 and 70-79. There were four teams entered in the oldest men's division and three scored.

The other team champions (complete results accompany this story) were all out-of-town teams.

Cross-country running is a growing sport around here,

thanks primarily to Pete Glavin's love of the sport and the dedication he has given to it over the past nine years. He founded the Upstate Cross-country Series and brought about several local national championships, but the former McQuaid and Rutgers University star isn't old enough to qualify for his own race. Bill Quinlisk was his right-hand man, assisted by the Genesee Valley Harriers teams.

The women and men ran separate races over a carefully prepared—and beautiful—course that was similar to, but not the same as, that used for the McQuaid Invitational. The course had the added advantage that spectators could see the race develop through at least four points of its progress without moving more than a few hundred feet.

Results, however, weren't so great as late entries created problems with the computer calculations and results had to be done manually. That wouldn't be much of a problem in a road race with the same 139 finishers, but the extensive team scoring required several hours to get straight.

The men's race also contested the Canadian-American challenge for the Fleischmann Cup. The American team scored a rare victory (about it's seventh in about 24 tries) over the out manned Canadians who seem to prefer longer races than 5K. They'll have a good chance to take it back when it is contested again in February on the West Coast. Men's winner Craig Fram has no masters history since he turned 40 just weeks before the championship, so he didn't know what to expect from the other competitors and they weren't familiar with him. Tom Dalton, of Schenectady, was in a similar situation-he'd competed in the Empire State Games in Rochester during the summer in the 35-39 age group. Although he'd competed in an internationalmountain run, Fram said he is primarily a road racer and runs only one or two cross-country events a year. He's never been a professional runner, but running has been his profession since high school in New Hampshire where he still lives (in Plaistow). He got into running footwear design and manufacture a few years out of high school when he got a job at the plant Nike had there at the time.

Later he worked with Rochester Olympian Pete Pfitzinger at New Balance before moving on to Puma for whom he works now.

He trains at a pretty much professional level, putting in 75 to 85 miles a week with a track workout and a hills-fartlek session. He said he hadn't run a hard 10K this year but that his times generally are close to his personal bests (such as a 29:51 10K) set 15 years ago.


Notes: Charlie McMullen is a three-time national champion in masters cross-country at the 8K distance but had been ill during the week before the race and was a little disappointed in his 12th-place finish.

Kathy Brown won a national championship a few years ago at Finger Lakes Community College. Turned 50 this year, she didn't expect to beat the top women in their early 40s, but she had to battle for second among women 50 and older. She trailed Vicki Putnam of the Motor City Striders of Detroit, whose team also won that division, and had to sprint to the finish to nip Karen Davies of the Syracuse Chargers at the wire.

Greg Brooks, 51, of Irondequoit, led his Cats team to second place in the 50-59 division with an 18:31 that was all the more impressive considering that he'd had an angioplasty procedure during the summer to open to blocked coronary arteries.

Dave Coyne, now 47, led the sixth-place Cats team with 17:25 and said he's regained the enthusiasm for running that made him the top area finisher in the Boston Marathon for a decade. He credits use of magnets in his shoes for an increased sense of energy and feels reaching the 2:40 marathon mark again isn't impossible.

Bob Hodge of the Central Mass. Striders was second on his team behind overall winner Craig Fram in 16:46. Even though it was good for ninth overall, it isn't the level he once was at but it represents a remarkable recovery from extensive injuries suffered in an automobile accident.




CHAMPION--Craig Fraim of Plaistow, NH is already comfortably in the lead as he crests a hill at about 2,000 meters into cross-country championship.

POSTERIOR HEEL PAIN

We have talked about plantar heel pain in a prior newsletter. Today's article is devoted to posterior heel pain or pain that you encounter behind the foot. This is a common malady that is often aggravated by running or walking.

The achilles tendon is the combination of three muscles in our calf which inserts into our heel bone. The name of this heel bone is the calcaneus. You can feel the insertion of this tendon by pointing your toes to your nose and touching the most distant portion of this tendon as it melds into the calcaneus (its usually covered up by the rear of your shoe).

You can imagine how irritated a soft, pliable structure such as a tendon would be if it had to rub against a bone day in and day out. Eventually it would tear and break. Our body has a unique structure which prevents this from occurring. It is called a bursa. A bursa is a fluid filled sack which cushions and protects both the bone and the tendon.

Occasionally the calcaneus will have an odd prominence, called a Haglund's deformity, which will press against the achilles tendon. This will cause the bursa to become inflamed and painful. In other instances an ill fitting shoe may press on the tendon causing the bursa between the skin and tendon to become irritated. Women who often dress with high heel shoes complain of this problem. We call it "pump bump".

Treatment of posterior heel pain can be very frustrating. Conservative treatment is limited and includes physical therapy, heel lifts and heel pads. A change in shoe gear may alleviate the symptoms. When all else fails, surgery may be necessary to remove the offending bone.

Do not ignore posterior heel pain. The differential diagnosis includes, but is not limited to, an achilles tendon tear and a calcaneal fracture. The longer you put off treatment the harder it will be to solve.
