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59th Annual Meeting Highlights

The 59th Annual Convention and Trade Show proved to be a tremendous success for the Illinois Oil & Gas Association. A crowd of approximately 425 people gathered at the Executive Inn in Evansville, IN. and enjoyed two days of informative talks, a sold-out exhibitor area and numerous opportunities to socialize with fellow IOGA members.

Technical Programs

Thursday's program began with an interesting presentation from Bill O'Grady, Director of Futures Research at A.G. Edwards and Sons, St. Louis, MO. Mr. O'Grady, who also spoke at that Fall Membership


Meeting, explained the recent high oil prices and his long term outlook for continued higher prices, stating that he had just recently come to realize that the market was being driven higher primarily because there is so little excess production capacity in the "The key to the world. market is that readily available excess capacity is depleted. This leads to the supply potential o f verticality."

However, Mr. O'Grady also cautioned of the potential in the near term for a "gasoline glut" noting that stocks have been building in recent months. As he noted at the Fall Meeting, Mr. O'Grady reiterated that "supply verticality" cuts both ways, commenting that if demand were to be curtailed significantly, prices could fall substantially.

The Thursday afternoon Geological Session featured three talks on the deeper potential of the Illinois Basin.



Hannes Leetaru from the Illinois State Geological Survey presented a talk entitled "Strategies for Trenton Exploration in the Illinois Basin"; Bryan Roth of Roth Exploration Geoservices, presented a talk entitled "Trenton and Deeper Targets: Models for the Illinois Basin from Outside the Basin"; and Robert Hickman of Structural Solutions gave a presentation entitled "Exploring for Hydrothermal Dolomite-Hosted Fields in the Illinois Basin." Each of the talks presented a common theme, emphasizing that from a geological perspective, there is a strong possibility that the deeper plays present in other basins may also be prospective in the Illinois Basin; and that while the Illinois Basin is mature with respect to shallower targets, deeper plays have been lightly drilled.

The Engineering Session presented on Friday morning, featured a "Mini-Seminar for the Independent Operator". Bob Kiker from the Permian Basin PTTC, presented two sessions; one on well bore management and the other on practices to reduce lifting costs.

The Technical Programs concluded with the Legal & Legislative Session presented by IOGA General Counsel, Craig R. Hedin of the firm Campbell, Black, Carnine, Hedin, Ballard & McDonald, Based on recent feedback he's received from many of his clients, Hedin presented a talk entitled "Starting Up Old Wells - Do You Need a New Lease? What else?", answering frequently asked questions, from operators contemplating Counsel restarting inactive wells.

Award Winners

As is tradition at the Annual Meeting, the best was saved for last with the presentation of awards for outstanding achievement. The following is a rundown of those honored.

Petroleum Professional of The Year

Bryan Dicus of Elysium Energy was named Petroleum Professional of the Year for his accomplishments as Division Manager of Elysium Energy, during which time they have undertaken one of the most aggressive exploration and development programs in recent memory in the Illinois Basin.

Petroleum Professional Woman of the Year

Kim Oelze of Oelze Production Company was recognized as Petroleum Professional Woman of the Year for her efforts not only with the Oelze Companies, but also for her tireless efforts on behalf of the industry as a member of the Executive Committee of IOGA, and as a member of the Illinois Petroleum Resources Board.

Service Person of the Year

Dave Edwards of Edwards Pump and Valve was named the Service Person of the Year. Dave has worked in the oil industry for more than 25 years, nearly ten of which he has owned and operated his own business with his wife Joyce, where he has earned a reputation as honest and dependable. He has also served on the IOGA Board of Directors for a number of years.

Lifetime Achievement

John Larrabee of Larrabee Oil Company was given the award for Lifetime Achievement for his long and diverse career that has included working as a crude purchaser and later as an oil producer. John is a past president of IOGA and member of the Illinois Petroleum Resources Board. He is also credited with helping establish the Illinois Oilfield Museum in Oblong.

Wildcatter of the Year

RK Petroleum was recognized as Wildcatter of the Year for their recent exploration efforts that have included the drilling of several seismically defined wildcat prospects. Their #1 Aumiller was completed as a deeper pool discovery (Dutch Creek) in the Oskaloosa Field in Clay County. RK Petroleum was also honored as Wildcatter of the Year in 1972, which was the first year the award was given.



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


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Drill-String Handling Workshop Held Recently in Grayville

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Two IOGA Member Companies Announce Changes

Richard (Dick) Simpson, owner of Simpson Gear & Oil, Inc., has announced his retirement and the merger of Simpson Gear with McCoy Machine & Gear, Inc. Dick and Harlan Simpson started oilfield welding in 1975 and in 1977 formed Simpson Oil, Inc. and began a drilling program in Crawford County. In 1979 Dick began manufacturing oil field gears and repairing oil field pump jacks as Dick Simpson Gear. Simpson Gear has become a major rebuilder of pump jacks in the tri-state and supplier of pump jack parts that are shipped all over the United States and overseas. Simpson Gear has the capability to repair and rebuild pump jacks on location. Fabrication of obsolete parts has made it possible for oil production equipment to remain producing.

During the early 80's the business employed as many as 15 full time employees and Dick has maintained a successful business throughout the rise and fall of oil prices. Simpson Gear currently has 10 full time employees all of whom will continue with McCoy Machine and Gear, Inc. Dick will remain with McCoy in a management position until September and then will turn his attention to developing his oil production.

Also undergoing a change is Geophysical Applications (GAPS) who announced a merger with Calgary based, Norex Exploration Services, Inc.

The new combined entity will have an expanded 4,500 channel capacity with state of the art ARAM Aries recording system and equipment. The merger allows GAPS access to a four crew capacity (3 telemetry and 1 cable crew), 4 hemi-44, 44,000lb Vibrosis trucks and 4 IVI 2,000lb Enviro-buggies. In particular, expertise gained on large capacity 3D's in the plains of Alberta will be combined with GAPS' current Appalachian expertise and experience to provide their clients with higher channel capacity, more crew availability, and better pricing.

The merger will also allow GAPS to expand their data processing facility in Guelph, Ontario. In addition to advance run-stream processing, bulk tape copying, media transfer, re-processing and reformatting service will be offered.

Former IOGA President, Mike Collins, Dies

John Michael Collins, 64, of Casey, IL passed away March 3, 2005 due to complications of Sarcoidosis. Mike was a long time member of IOGA and served as the Association's President from 1989 to 1991.
