Speaking of fish to be caught, are vou aware of Texas Parks & Wildlife's Winter Trout Stocking Program? Starting in December and running through February TPWD personnel will stock hundreds of thousands of rainbow trout in community lakes and ponds throughout the state. In the Metroplex area alone they will stock over 42,000 in 18 different lakes. So if you like trout fishing go to http:// tpwd.texas.gov to find the lake closest to you.

February is one of the busiest months of the year for your club because, as I write this, it is only six weeks until our annual fund raising banquet on March 7th. There are many club members volunteering their time & talents in an effort to make this, our 36th banquet, a raging success.
