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

Conference Information

The goal of this conference is to enhance the ability of urologic nurses and associates to provide quality care to urologic patients and provide opportunities to learn from and network with experts in the field of urologic nursing.

Advanced Practice Track

This year at the Annual Conference we will offer even more exciting advanced practice nurse and physician assistant training. The track will feature workshops, education sessions and networking designed specifically for advanced practice clinical knowledge and skills. The program includes:

- An all day cystoscopy workshop (includes lectures and hands-on training) and a **new** half day preconference on image evaluation of GU conditions where attendees will challenge their knowledge with participation in advanced and complex case study presentations.
- A 2 hour and 15 minute hands on advanced practice workshop with rotations every 45 minutes to stations including pelvic floor rehab and myofascial release, male genital exam, female genital exam, pessaries, and penile injections for erectile dysfunction and treating priapism.
- Dedicated advanced practice track education sessions including advanced pharmacology, urodynamic interpretation, metabolic stone evaluation, advanced case studies with imaging and definitive evaluation, and advanced update on menopause.


