IRNR Role in eXtension

eXtension relies on a network of staff from multiple institutions to help support, develop and maintain Communities of Practice (CoP). A CoP is a network of individuals who come together to provide information, expertise and knowledge for a topic area. eXtension CoPs are individuals from the 79 land grant universities as well as partners from organizations, agencies, businesses and private individuals who collaborate in resource areas to form a community. More than 67 CoPs currently exist.

Amy Hays, a program specialist with Texas A&M Institute of Renewable Natural Resources, serves as an at-large resource. In her role of CoP support, Hays assists new CoPs in developing content to launch publicly and supports existing CoPs in management and content enhancement.
