In the West we’re taught to fear Islamic extremism. Yet there’s another kind of fundamentalism that’s much closer to home – that has dangerous implications for all of us.

This book is a gripping exposé of the power of the Christian Right worldwide – and in particular their influence within the United Nations.

Jennifer Butler, a former representative at the United Nations, provides the first insider’s account of the strategies and effectiveness of Christian Right lobbying campaigns within the U.N. Drawing on personal interviews with Christian Right leaders, she analyzes the impact they have already had – and what the future may hold.

Butler reveals how today’s most powerful Christian Right organizations are building interfaith coalitions. At the U.N., Christian Right groups like Focus on the Family and Concerned Women for America are working with Catholic, Mormon and Muslim allies to advance a conservative social policy agenda. The U.S. has recently joined that alliance. President George W. Bush has given them a significant voice in shaping U.S. positions on issues including women’s rights, reproductive health, human cloning, child rights and AIDS.

In short, the Christian Right is globalizing – a phenomenon that promises to challenge progressive social policy on a worldwide scale – as well as transform the Christian Right itself.

REV. JENNIFER BUTLER is Executive Director of Faith in Public Life. An ordained Presbyterian minister, Rev. Butler most recently served as the Presbyterian Church (USA) Representative to the United Nations. During her nine years at the U.N., she represented the denomination on issues ranging from women’s rights to the Iraq war. She also taught courses at New York University’s graduate program in Global Studies. Rev. Butler served in the Peace Corps from 1989 to 1991 in Belize, Central

In February 2003, Tony Blair was warned by British intelligence that the invasion of Iraq would “heighten” the risk of terrorism in Britain.

In July 2005, al-Qaeda struck in the heart of London. Despite the British Government's increasingly desperate attempts at denial, polls show that an overwhelming majority of people in Britain are convinced that there is a connection between the London bombings and the war on Iraq. A majority of Britons fault Tony Blair himself.

Using secret government documents declassified since the bombings, and leaks from British intelligence, Milan Rai exposes official deceit at the highest levels, and establishes the crucial role of British foreign policy in generating a home-grown version of al-Qaeda. Rai shows how an official report drawn up by the Home Office and Foreign Office in early 2004 identified “foreign policy” – and the war in Iraq in particular – as a major cause of alienation among young British Muslims.

Examining the backgrounds of the 7/7 bombers, Milan Rai demonstrates that Islam is not to blame. Most importantly, the book shows us how to make sure that this never happens again – and offers brief obituaries for the 52 people who lost their lives that day.

MILAN RAI founded the British branch of *Voices in the Wilderness* and co-founded the anti-war group *ARROW*, a London-based direct action and anti-war information group, and its successor organization, *Justice Not Vengeance*. His previous books include *War Plan Iraq* (2002) and *Regime Unchanged* (2003). In 1993 he was awarded the Frank Cousins Peace Award for Research by the Transport and General Workers' Union.

The United States is the only country to have dropped the atomic bomb. Since the A-bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki, every U.S. president has threatened nuclear war.



What part does oil play in war? It's easy to conclude that Western intervention in countries such as Iraq and Afghanistan is primarily motivated by the West's desire to control precious oil resources. Is this also true of other conflicts around the world?

The contributors argue that there is an essential problem in the way that recent "oil wars" have been conducted. When a country's infrastructure is destroyed, and it is plunged into political chaos, as in Iraq, this provides neither security nor stability. Wars over oil further destabilize faltering regimes – with disastrous consequences.

This book examines the relationship between oil and war in six different regions: Angola, Azerbaijan, Colombia, Indonesia, Nigeria and Russia. Each country has substantial oil reserves, and has a long history of conflict. The contributors assess what part oil plays in causing, aggravating or mitigating war in each region.



Following on from their acclaimed book *Bad News from Israel*, Greg Philo and Mike Berry present a concise guide to the Israel-Palestine conflict. Riot! covers, with a reporter's eye, almost 200 years of civil disturbance on mainland Britain, and gives a voice to some of the remarkable men and women involved. Ian Heron shows that resistance played a part, not always beneficially, in the creation of proper parliamentary democracy, the welfare state, the trade union movement, the rights of immigrants and civil liberties. All of these, it can be argued, are under renewed attack today.

Heron tells the story of a largely unacknowledged tradition of violent protest in Britain, from the martyrs of Peterloo to the drug-fuelled street violence of today. *Riot!* charts how the struggles of individual groups of workers turned into a broader campaign for electoral reform and justice; how excessive use of state force failed to extinguish the fires; how the trade unions pressed for wider social justice; how Thatcherism reversed decades of gradual reform and sparked social turmoil; and how a “good” riot played a part in her downfall. Finishing with an account of the anti-globalization movement and G8 protests, this lively book shows how the ugly roar of a mob has perhaps done more to change society than measured parliamentary debate.

FAILING PEACE

Gaza and the Palestinian-Israeli Conflict

This book represents 20 years of research on the impact of Israeli occupation. Discussion of Israeli policy is often regarded as a taboo subject, with the result that few people – especially in the U.S. – understand the origins and consequences of the conflict. Roy’s book provides an indispensable context for understanding why the situation remains so intractable. The focus of Roy’s work is the Gaza Strip, an area that remains consistently neglected and misunderstood. Drawing on more than two thousand interviews and extensive first-hand experience, Roy chronicles the impact of Israeli occupation over nearly a generation. Exploring the devastating consequences of socio-economic and political decline, this is a unique and powerful account of the reality of life in the West Bank and Gaza. Written by one of the world’s foremost scholars of the region, it offers an unrivalled breadth of scholarship and insight.

SARA ROY is a Senior Research Scholar at the Center for Middle Eastern Studies at Harvard University. A distinguished political economist, she is the author of *The Gaza Strip* (1995, 2001) and editor of *The Economics of Middle East Peace* (1999).



What does Israel hope to achieve with its recent withdrawal from Gaza and the building of a 700km wall? Journalist Jonathan Cook presents a lucid account of Israel’s motives. The heart of the issue, he argues, is demography. Israel fears the moment when the region’s Palestinians – Israel’s own Palestinian citizens and those in the Occupied Territories – become a majority. Inevitable comparisons with apartheid in South Africa will be drawn. The book charts Israel’s increasingly desperate responses including military repression of Palestinian dissent; a ban on marriages between Israel’s Palestinian population and Palestinians living under occupation to prevent a right of return “through the back door”; and the redrawing of the Green Line to create an expanded state. Ultimately, concludes the author, these abuses will lead to a third, far deadlier intifada.

JONATHAN COOK, a former staff journalist of the *Guardian* newspaper, has written for *The Times*, *Le Monde diplomatique*, the *International Herald Tribune*, *al-Ahram Weekly* and *Aljazeera.net*. He is based in Nazareth.





Marcus Taylor shows the reality is very different. Examining the contradictions of neoliberal reform, he shows how it has created a society that is deeply ridden with inequality. Taylor examines the consequences of Pinochet's policies. He shows why the tensions that arose from social inequality led to the emergence of a "Third Way" neoliberalism in the post-dictatorship period. Taylor argues that neoliberalism has failed to transform social relationships and institutions. This failure has huge consequences for popular movements for social change in Latin America during a time of renewed political upheaval. 

Is socialism dead since the fall of the Soviet Union? What is the way forward for the Left?

Raby argues that Cuba and above all Venezuela provide inspiration for anti-globalization and anti-capitalist movements across the world. Another World Is Possible – but only through winning power on a popular democratic basis.

Raby argues passionately that the way forward for progressives is not the dogmatic formulae of the old Left, nor in the spontaneous autonomism of Antonio Negri. Instead, it is to be found in new, broad popular movements with bold leadership. Examining key leaders including Hugo Chávez and the Sandinistas in Nicaragua, Raby shows that it is more necessary than ever to take power, peacefully where possible, but in all cases with the strength that comes from popular unity backed by force where necessary. In this way it is possible to build democratic power, which may or may not be socialist depending on one's definition, but which represents the real anti-capitalist alternative for the twenty-first century.
