BEFORE FILLING OUT THIS APPLICATION:

It is important to consider how participating on a study abroad program may impact other areas of interest. Participating on a study abroad program may influence decisions about athletic commitments, participation in theater productions or special audition groups, and (if a senior) the college process. You are strongly encouraged to communicate your study abroad plans to interested adults so you may make an informed decision about studying abroad.

Please discuss whether a study abroad experience is right for you with your parents or legal guardian <u>during</u> the application process. The completed application, including all evaluation letters, is due in the Center for International Education by **Monday, January 7, 2013.**

What happens next?

Once we have received all of your application material, our study abroad admissions committee will review your application. Offers of admission will generally be made within two weeks of the deadline.

Some things to think about

While we believe that a study abroad experience contributes immensely towards your education, we also realize that an overseas or a domestic travel program is not for everyone. We ask you to consider whether a cultural and academic experience abroad is right for you. Please ask yourself if you are willing to experience new (and sometimes different and/or challenging) customs that may help you understand how people in different parts of the world live and learn. Please be aware of the physical and mental demands that a study abroad experience could have and to recognize your own limitations. If you are accepted into a study abroad program and you have submitted your initial deposit, you will not receive a refund if you decide to withdraw from the program. If you are not accepted for a position, your \$600 deposit will be refunded.

Scholarship information

Each year we receive more requests for scholarship aid than we can provide. We currently have a very limited amount of scholarship aid. If scholarship funds are needed in order to participate in a NMH study abroad program, parents should indicate need on the PARENT APPROVAL form. Aid will be awarded after consultation with the school's financial aid administrator and the accounting office.

While we will ask for input and recommendations from the financial aid office at NMH, this application is specifically designed for our study abroad programs and is not affiliated with the financial aid department. Please note the decision to participate in a study abroad program should not be based upon need alone. Because our programs are already greatly subsidized by NMH and generous alumni, we require that all participants make a significant financial contribution and that the amount of aid requested is truly what is needed in order to participate.

Important note for all students

Please keep in mind that participation in a NMH study abroad program is a privilege and not a right. If accepted, please note that you would have been selected from a number of qualified candidates. Among the qualities we seek in the selection process is an ability to represent NMH in an appropriate manner. Your acceptance is contingent upon being a model student who will uphold and honor NMH rules and regulations as stated in the NMH handbook (this applies whether you are on campus before your program begins or off campus while on your study abroad program).

Anyone enrolled in a NMH study abroad program that engages in conduct unbecoming of an NMH student or that is in violation of school rules will be subject to appropriate review and disciplinary sanctions, up to and including dismissal from the program and / or school. If after your acceptance to the program, you are found to be in violation of a major school rule, the Dean of Students, in consultation with the Director of the Center for International Education and the program leaders, will determine whether or not you will be allowed to participate in the study abroad program. In most cases, such students forfeit the privilege of participation in the program, and appropriate scheduling changes will be made. The consequences of such inappropriate actions may cause you to forfeit an entire semester of academic work.
