SUBJECT: Late French Immersion - Application for Enrollment
DATE: December 12, 2012

The Eastern School District is currently accepting registration for **Late French Immersion (LFI)**. Applications for enrollment will be accepted during the week of **January 21-25, 2013**, at elementary schools where applicable, **January 25th being the deadline for receipt of applications. Failure to meet this deadline may result in students not being able to avail of this program.**

Late French Immersion is intended for any student who is interested in developing fluency in the French language. This is an intensive immersion program beginning in Grade 7 where approximately 70% of the curriculum is taught using French as the language of instruction decreasing to approximately 30% as students enter senior high school. A student accepted into Late French Immersion is expected to make a six year commitment to the program, from Grade 7 to Level III of senior high school.

Any student who has successfully completed Grade 6 can apply to the Late French Immersion Program. It is important to note that there are increased challenges, particularly in the early stages of the program, since subject area learning must occur while the language of instruction itself is being learned. For this reason, success in the Late French Immersion is strongly connected to a child's interest, commitment and motivation to learning in the French language.

As part of the registration process, your child's Grade 6 teacher will be asked to complete a recommendation form. You and your child should inform the Grade 6 teacher of the application so that this form can be completed and forwarded directly to the school principal.

You will be notified in writing indicating whether or not your child is recommended - Your child's Late French Immersion school will also be identified at that time, following the regular feeder system where possible.

For further information about the **LFI** Program, you are encouraged to attend an information sessions for parents/guardians organized in your area. At the information session, you will be given an opportunity to ask any questions you may have regarding the **Late French Immersion Program.**
