President's Corner



Gig Harbor is just around the corner and is shaping up to be a nice-size rally. There are currently 14 signed up. Dana and Ruth are planning the meals. There was a last-minute change in the reservation with the park and Dana made the notification to the people attending.

Gig Harbor is the Gateway to the Olympic Peninsula. Commercial fishing, boat building, and logging dominated the economy until the construction of the first Tacoma Narrows Bridge in 1940. Gig Harbor is now a bedroom community to Tacoma.

If you have never heard the story of the first Tacoma Narrows Bridge, it

may be because it was short lived. The bridge construction started in 1938 and was completed July 1, 1940. The bridge was the third longest suspension bridge at that time. From the time the bridge was constructed, the deck began to move vertically in windy conditions. The bridge was nicknamed Galloping Gertie. They tried several engineering fixes to stop the motion, but they didn't work. The bridge collapsed November



7, 1940, after being in service only 4 months. Here is link to a video of the bridge. It says it was a gale force wind, but the wind was only 40 MPH.

Because of the "war," a replacement bridge was not built until 1950. That ridge is now the west-bound lane leaving Tacoma.

According to Deborah Raber, senior project manager with the Hillsboro Planning Department, Washington County requested that the city of Hillsboro, where the fairgrounds are located, allow increased flexibility regarding RV parking, the Hillsboro Tribune reported. County officials asked for "the opportunity to consider a more permanent facility to accommodate community visitors year-round rather than in connection with a specific event at the fairgrounds."
