Classes Begin: Monday, September 8, 2014

- 1. Fill out and sign the attached **Registration/Waiver form**, one form per child. Additional copies available in the Madera School office, Madera Clubhouse, El Cerrito Community Center, or on-line at: www.el-cerrito.org/recreation
- 2. Write one check for all MASEP **course fees** payable to "City of El Cerrito." (Non-El Cerrito residents add 25%, as established by the City Council.) A \$7.50 discount, per course, is given to students enrolled in our childcare* during MASEP and will be applied on the childcare bill after the session has ended. *Student must be attending childcare ON the day your child is attending the course. Information will be verified.
- 3. Materials Fees (if applicable) must be paid by separate check, written to and paid directly to the MASEP course instructor. Bring materials fees to the first day of class. Giving the check to the instructor is preferable however you may also place the check in the 'Materials Fees' envelope in the Madera School Office. Failure to pay materials fees by the 3rd class will result in dismissal from class with no refund of the paid course fee.
- 4. **Submit** Registration/Waiver forms and payment of course fees directly to the El Cerrito Community Center at 7007 Moeser Lane, El Cerrito, 94530, (510) 559-7000 (M/W every other Fri., 8 AM-5 PM, T/TH 8 AM-6 PM) or Classes fill on a first-come, first-served basis. **Registration forms and course fees will not be accepted in the Madera School office.**
- 5. **FAX** in registration forms with a Credit Card Authorization Form to **510-528-9413**.
- 6. For online registration or online registration instructions, go to www.el-cerrito.org/recreation.
- 7. Check-in after school: All Childcare and Non-Childcare students must report to the Multi-Purpose Room immediately after school and check-in with City Staff. Only K & 1st graders who are enrolled in After School Childcare MUST check-into the Madera Childcare Clubhouse. A City Staff member or MASEP instructor will escort your child from their respective meeting places to their classrooms. Non-Madera students please check into the classroom the class is held.

MASEP OFF-SITE CLASS LOCATIONS

- 1. El Cerrito Community Center, 7007 Moeser Lane (cross street: Ashbury Ave.)
 - a. <u>Main Hall</u>: Walk through the front door of the Community Center. Main Hall is the largest room in the building.
 - b. <u>Skylight Room</u>: Walk through the front door of the Community Center, walk through the Main Hall, the Skylight room is on the right of the Main Hall.
 - c. <u>Kitchen</u>: Walk through the front door of the Community Center, Kitchen is to your immediate left inside the front doors.
- 2. <u>Tassajara Pottery Studio</u>: From Madera go north on Arlington Blvd., turn left on Barrett, left on Tassajara to 2575 Tassajara. *Transportation will be offered to this location for select classes.
- 3. <u>Canyon Trail Art Center</u>: From Madera go north on Arlington Blvd., turn left on Cutting, right on Hagen. Follow signs to clubhouse to 6757 Gatto. *Transportation will be offered to this location for select classes.

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TRANSPORTATION - Please Read Carefully

- 1. Transportation will be limited to only 13 students each way. To guarantee a spot in the van, please register early.
- 2. You must fill out the transportation section of the registration form in order for your child to be transported to class. If you do not fill this out, we will assume that the parent/guardian is providing transportation.
- 3. Space is limited and transportation will be on a first-come-first-serve basis to select classes (see below). There will be a \$16 transportation fee for all students for each course they will need transportation to. For example, if a student is enrolled in a course with 8 classes, the fee is \$16 total. If a student is enrolled in a Monday class (8 classes total) and a Tuesday Class (7 classes total), the fee will be \$32 total.
- 4. Return transportation will be provided only for childcare students enrolled in childcare on the same day as a MASEP class. If your child is in childcare but you plan to pick them up from the off-site class directly, please let City Staff know and be sure to pick them up by the end of class. Otherwise, the childcare student will be driven back to Madera. Return transportation will NOT be provided for childcare with classes ending 5:15pm or later; parents are responsible for picking up their child at the off-site class location.
- 5. Transportation will be available for **all** Madera Students enrolled in the following classes: **Mondays**-Tennis Jr. **Tuesdays** Young Chefs **Thursdays** Zumba for Kids **Non-Childcare students in these** classes must report to the Multi-Purpose Room immediately after school and check-in with the van driver.
- 6. Childcare students can additionally be vanned to the following classes: **Mondays**-Puppetry & Jewelry** and Tennis** **Tuesdays** Art Exploration** **Thursdays** Fall Clay** and Mixed Media** **Note:** **Transportation for these classes will be limited to only 13 children for the return trip to Madera.

MONDAY

Shakespeare for Kids-"A Midsummer Night's Dream" Instructor: Mary Blyskal

Shakespeare for Kids will present "A Midsummer Night's Dream" a comedy that rejoices in the power of love to transform lives. This forest fantasy-an imaginative adventure of children -is people by an Athenian duke, an Amazon queen, the fairy sprite Puck, fairy queen Titania, and jealous Oberon, all who meet their mortal counterparts in an enchanted forest on one magical midsummer night. The class uses play and dramatic arts to teach classics to children.

Instructor Mary Blyskal is a former reporter and editor for The Associated Press in New York City. She lives in El Cerrito with her husband and 14-year-old son.

Cantonese Conversation Instructor: Li Zhong

This is a conversational class. Students will learn Cantonese through group conversations, games, songs, and videos. This class will increase the student's understanding of Chinese culture and improve their Cantonese speaking and listening skills. **No prior experience is needed.**

Instructor: Spurs Soccer Staff

Tennis Jr. and Tennis Instructor: Elán Crews

Children will learn the basics of tennis in a group setting and have fun learning the sport. My intent as a coach is to create a fun environment in which everyone can learn the skills for the sport of tennis for exercise and structure, and to encourage the translation into other life endeavors. We will work on most of the basic strokes and movements, and kids will play many games that encourage the fundamental eye-hand coordination ability and enjoyable multi-player atmosphere. Students will need to bring a tennis racket and tennis type shoes.

Puppetry & Jewelry Making with Kiki Instructor: Kiki Rostad

In this class children will make earrings, pins and magnets using a variety of materials such as sculpey, crayola model magic, jewelry findings, paint and glitter. The last day is a potluck finger food celebration. All projects go home the last day. Please send a box or bag.

Material Fees will be used for Sculpey, crayola model magic, fabric, felt, buttons, etc.

TUESDAY

Drama Club Instructor: Lew Williams

Act on the Madera stage with the Madera Drama Club. I am a retired teacher who has directed scores of youth plays. We rehearse twice a week and perform both for Madera students and in the evening for parents and family. Parents and actors must commit to attending all rehearsals, memorizing their characters lines, and creating a costume. It's fun to learn acting skills and perform on stage. (No experience necessary.) We will choose a play like Charlie and the Chocolate Factory or The Wizard of Oz based on enrollment.

Material Fees will be used for purchasing materials for set and prop construction. Students will need to bring a costume to the end performance.

Animation Creators: Video Game Design Instructor: Freshi Media Staff

Learn how to create and design a unique and interactive video game with Freshi Game Design! Beginning Game Developers work in pairs to conceive, design and build their own original computer game. Everything created for their game is original to the team—the characters, the action, the background, the music and the format.

Wonder Wheel of Color Instructor: Joan Wallner

Welcome to the land of COLOR! Through our fun projects-you are sure to become a COLOR EXPERT! Using the newly published book The Wonderful Colorful Wonder Wheel of Color as our guide, kids will learn all about color concepts to include: primary/secondary/tertiary colors (including color blending, mixing tints/shade and color value) monochromatic color schemes analogous and complimentary colors

The session ends with a Color Wheel party where each participant receives a book to take home and a certificate of Color-ology!

Material Fees will be used for a book to each participant, fabric craft (t-shirt, back pack or bag) fabrics, and threads for projects.

Young Chefs Instructor: Claudia Pereira-Oh

Calling all young chefs for a session of delicious food experiments and cooking! Students chefs will work in groups and get hands-on experience in using seasonal vegetables, fruits and other nutritious ingredients to create 2 to 3 flavorful dishes per class, drawing from diverse international cuisines. This class will encourage children to become more involved in the kitchen at home, to gain skills, learn new recipes, how to cook and try out new foods while maintaining kitchen safety and having fun. At the conclusion of the session they will receive all the recipes used in class.

Material Fees will be used towards ingredients used in the class.

Art Exploration Instructor: Annie Goodsill

Class will begin with a story, followed by drawing, painting, and sculptural projects. We blend the rigor of the structured classroom with creative choice and the freedom to explore. Check out www.AnnieArtist.com for more info!

Karate

Instructor: Leonard Baltz

This class teaches a traditional form of Japanese Karate known as Wado. Students will learn basic techniques including guarding, punching, kicking, balance and focus.

She has taught all levels and ages of violin for over 25 years and is on the string faculty of Escuela Bilingue International in Oakland and the Marin Community Music School. She was formerly a violinist in the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra in London.

Keyboard Instructor: Jan Jones

Children will learn to read notes and beginning theory. They will learn to play familiar tunes including some we sing in school.

Each student must provide his/her own polyphonic keyboard and batteries. Mid-sized are preferable to large ones, since kids have a struggle carrying large instruments. The keys must be at least mid-sized, not mini keys. A keyboard that is in tune is preferable. This includes most of the major brands such as Yamaha and Casio. A Casio SA 75 or 76 is a good choice; each child can carry his/her own instrument to and from class. Books will be handed out and each student must remember to bring the book to each week's class. The book will be taken home after class for practicing during the week and will belong to the student after the end of the session.

These two level, co-located courses use robot building and computer programming to teach science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) concepts within a team oriented problem/solution recreational setting. Through the use of the LEGO® Mindstorms NXT 2. 0 kit, NXT-G software, and laptop computers, the class experience is designed to be hands-on and lab research based. All equipment and supplies are provided for use. Although some participants may have had experience with general LEGO® kits, simple robot building and simple programming, we assume no prior experience. After introductory training, students will be able to program autonomous robot STEM lab tasks (challenges) and games.

Zumba Kids Jr. Instructor: Stephanie Ramos
