Born and raised in Israel, **Revital Shiri-Horowitz**, drew from her own family history to create the riveting story about an Iraqi Jewish family's emigration to Israel. *Daughters of Iraq*, follows three generations of Jewish women as they journey three places: Iraq in the

early 20th century, the new homeland of Israel, and Seattle, USA. It is the story of love and roots and how the two are forever intertwined.


Lavishly illustrated, *The Hidden and the Revealed: The Queen Esther Mosaics* (Gefen Publishing House, 2011) captures the shimmering brilliance of artist **Lilian Broca**'s monumental *Queen Esther Mosaic Series*. Created in classical Byzantine style but with contemporary sensibility, Broca's mosaics give life to the complex personality of Esther who rose from shy obscurity to become her people's saviour.

Archaeologist, art historian, and curator Sheila

**Campbell** has published widely on ancient and contemporary mosaics and Byzantine art. A Professor Emerita at the Pontifical Institute of Mediaeval Studies, Toronto, Campbell has curated many exhibitions, including a showcase of the Scuola di Mosaici (Friuli, Italy) at the Royal Ontario Museum.

**Linda Coe** (book designer) is a graduate of the Vancouver School of Art (now Emily Carr University). She has worked as a professional graphic designer for over thirty years and has taught design courses at Emily Carr University, the UBC, and at various workshops. Coe is a former President, a longtime Charter member, and a Fellow of the Society of Graphic Designers of Canada, BC Chapter.

Scholar, rabbi and SFU professor, **Yosef Wosk**, took inspiration from Broca's mosaics to create a lyrical prose-poem in the voice of Esther, that is so striking and unique, the work must be read for itself to be fully appreciated. The prose is accompanied by scholarly notes illuminating Wosk's extensive investigation of biblical, rabbinical, comparative religious and mythological aspects of the Esther story.


material, drawn from Jewish and personal sources, is engaging, connecting with and drawing from her audience.



**Lei Hui Hua** was born in Japan and grew up in Beijing, studying music from a young age. She was the Director of the Beijing Philharmonic Orchestra before immigrating to Canada in 1990. Hui Hua is now a music teacher in Burnaby.

**David Yeung** was born in China and immigrated to Vancouver in 1973. Yeung is a talented painter, musician and composer, who also enjoys guitar making. He has been a music teacher since 2000.

A panel discussion will follow of professionals specializing in the appropriate fields, moderated by Rabbi Laura Duhan Kaplan. The panel will address issues including how to recognize warning signs, ways to support the individual and their family, how to access the appropriate services, information and ongoing coping strategies.
