Speaking from the Hart Angels in our Midst

He was in his late 20's. I was in a hurry. It was Saturday morning and I was trying to leave the store, to get home and mow the lawn before the afternoon rains started. I don't know where he came from, but there he was.

"Can you help me with some gas money?" He must have seen my hurried look, and said, "I have a construction job 3 blocks from here, but they didn't pay me today. I am out of gas, and am trying to get home to my family."

Dilemma, what do I do? When I was a pastor of a local congregation I dealt with hundreds of folks in similar situations. Over the years I honed my radar skills to discern, as best I could: scam or need? Also, as a local pastor there was often a community coordinated protocol and program for assistance. Today, it was just he and I in the Publix parking lot.

Could I spare a couple bucks. Of course. But what if the need wasn't legit. I remembered that obscure verse from Hebrews 13:2 "that some have entertained angels unaware". So that July Saturday morning with unanswered questions that weren't going to be answered, either I was one of his angels to help him get home, or he was my angel in disguise.

Several weeks later I was in a gathering of about 35 people from 7 congregations who share the common vision of helping Peace New Church Development purchase an 11 acre parcel of land in Lakewood Ranch. At that meeting, I heard the testimony of several folks (angels I will call them) who believe in what is happening at Peace and are so committed to new church development that they gave \$150,000 toward the purchase. With a General Assembly grant of \$400,000 we need \$500,000 more for the purchase of this property, which happens to be right in the center of the target area for that growing congregation.

I know there are angels in our midst; I met some. I believe there are those whom God has so blessed that together we can make it happen. I trust the young man in the red truck got home, and I continue to believe there are angels in our midst to help Peace NCD secure its new home.

In 2006 more than \$2.2 million was received through the this offering to support a variety of peacemaking efforts: 25 percent is retained by congregations, 25 percent is retained by Presbyteries (our 2006 Peace River offering went to support the work of Dr. Les Morgan, Medical Missionary to Bangladesh) and 50% is used by General Assembly ministries such as the International Peacemaker program, developing Guidelines for Presbyterians During Times of Disagreement, and other works of peace in churches and communities.
