

Dear Parishioners,

We will have a seminarian in residence at St. Aloysius for six weeks beginning the last week of May. His name is Juan Ortega and he will begin his third year of theology study in September. Welcome, Juan.

Our parish school, Trinity Academy, is an excellent Pre K thru grade 8 school. Trinity grads excel. God is praised in prayer every day. Trinity's tech/ computer program is cutting edge.

All are welcome to Trinity Open House Sunday May 31st from 12 noon to 2:30 pm.

We are in the process of planning a new sign for the front of the church. The present sign has been there since the mid 1980's and is showing signs of wear.

Because signage is very expensive today, I have started a fund just for the new sign. May I make a suggestion? At times of family wakes, in lieu of flowers, make donations to St. Aloysius for the new sign. Or, at birthdays and anniversaries for the "hard to buy for" crowd, perhaps a donation in their honor would be appreciated.

Among the recent contracts signed, recently were these: the snow guards on the roof of the school and one to replace thirty slate shingles on the church roof. Also, for the repair of the fire escape on the rear of the Parish Center.

The Franciscan spiritual director and writer, Fr. Richard Rohr, OFM recently developed a program called Crossings, based on a biblical tradition. Fr. Rohr realized that young men were often not making a successful transition from boyhood to manhood; Crossings roots the paradigm for healthy, grounded, fruitful manhood in the model of Jesus. It is needed today.

Fr Rohr's studies of initiation rites throughout history and around the world today center on five lessons, five great truths a boy must feel in his flesh if he is to really become a man. He must be taught that:

- life is hard
- he is going to die
- he is not in control
- he is not that important
- life is not all about him.

If a boy doesn't internalize this wisdom, as a man he might be prone to perceive himself as life's perpetual victim. He will rebel against the "little deaths" of unfulfilled hopes and failed undertakings—things which mark evolving maturity. He will strut about in arrogance and hubris.

When a young man accepts these truths, he is ready for the real wounding that comes in mid life.

I quote Fr Rohr: "The wisdom of Crossings is that it names the tasks a boy needs to keep doing at this stage of his life if he is to take on the responsibilities and privileges of being a man. Through word and ritual, the initiates are provided with the spiritual space to do the work to outgrow their "little boy crutches" - their proneness to tantrums when they don't get their way, their over-reliance on their parents, and for some, a lingering fear of the dark. The little boy must be allowed to die and be buried so that a transformed man may be born."

Rohr thinks that we haven't given young men the wisdom they need to embrace maturity. As a result, many young men are trapped in permanent adolescence, possessed by energies with which they can't cope, relegated to imitating infantile role models. St. Paul (I Cor 13) wrote: "...when I became a man, I put away childish ways." Pray for all who are "trapped".
