



RABBI'S DESK - WE ARE MOSES



Moses is the Bible's greatest hero. Long before G-d calls him to lead the people out of Egypt, Moses displays his sterling qualities: he enters into two altercations and defends, in turn, his own people and the idea of justice. He escapes from trouble only to find defenseless women who need help and he comes to their aid. When G-d calls him to lead the people, Moses humbly protests that he is not up to the task. But G-d prevails and Moses takes on the job.

Then Moses courageously insists, to Pharaoh's face, that he “let my people go.” Pharaoh demurs but Moses persists... and finally it happens. Moses, the great liberator at the Red Sea, becomes, at Mt. Sinai, the great lawgiver. Later, when the people rebel and build a Golden Calf, Moses at first expresses rage at their actions and then pleads to G-d that He forgive them. And then comes the long 40-year trek through the Wilderness during which Moses faces more frustrations than accomplishments, more discouragement than exhilaration. But he stays with the plan and with his grumbling people.

But then, when responding to the people's cry for water, Moses commits a great transgression, a sin which dooms him death before reaching the Promised Land. The Torah is unclear about the nature of that transgression: was it that he struck the rock instead of speaking to it? Was it that, in a rage, he calls his own people rebels? Was it that he showed too little faith by hitting the rock twice instead of just once? Was it that he attributed the miracle of getting water from the rock to his own powers and not G-d's? Was it some combination of all those possibilities? Or was other things as well? Whatever it was, it cost him the crowning culmination of his 40-year labor, the result of failing to sanctify G-d in the presence of the people... a very serious charge indeed, especially for a biblical leader. The greatest hero of Judaism's greatest book falls calamitously short at a crucial moment.

And yet, when the moment for him to die arrives, what happens? “So Moses the servant of the Lord died there, in the land of Moab, at the command of the Lord” (Deuteronomy 34:5). “At the command of the Lord”... literally “by the mouth of the Lord”... which our commentators render “by a kiss of the Lord.” G-d, who angrily refused to relent on his punitive decree, nevertheless tenderly, lovingly and gently “kisses” Moses to his death.

What does this tell us? That even the greatest of heroes fails miserably from time to time and, when he does so, he pays a price. But that G-d, who holds us accountable, also forgives. Forgives because He knows that even the greatest of us sometimes succumbs to our baser instincts. Our weaknesses are simply a part of who we are and G-d accepts us for who we are. A famous passage at the beginning of the Bible also leads to this idea. At the end of most days of creation, the Torah proclaims that G-d “saw that it was good.” We human beings are a part of this creation; but intriguingly, the Torah does not say that G-d “saw that it was good” on the day we were created. Being good is our challenge, not our destiny. Our goodness cannot be taken for granted; we must cultivate it. And quite obviously we can, and often do, fail to be good. Nevertheless, at the conclusion of the whole creation story, the Torah offers a summary of the whole, remarking that “G-d saw all that He had made, and found it very good” (Genesis 1:31). Creation as a whole ... including our own tendency to fail, to miss the mark, to go astray, to rebel against standards of right and wrong... is a part of G-d's creation and, as such, is good. Another way of saying that, warts and all, we human beings are ultimately accepted for who we are. And that G-d promises that nothing that we can do will completely and irrevocably alienate us from Him or ever put us on an irreversible path toward perdition.



The Hartzmark Library has received a generous gift from Bob and Sue Curtis, a new English annotated translation of the Zohar. The translator is Daniel Matt, a leading authority on the Zohar and Kabbalah. The Zohar ("The Book of Radiance") is the foundational text in the literature of Jewish mystical thought known as Kabbalah. Eight of the twelve volumes have been published and are available in the Reference section of the Library. Also available is a circulating copy of *A Guide to the Zohar*.

SALTZMAN YOUTH PANEL ACCEPTING APPLICATIONS FOR 2014-15

High school juniors and seniors interested in strengthening the Jewish community and making the world a better place are encouraged to apply for the Maurice Saltzman Youth Panel (SYP), sponsored by the Jewish Federation of Cleveland. As a group, panelists recommend how to distribute \$50,000 to worthy programs in the Jewish and general communities. Participants will develop their leadership and group consensus skills as they learn about the philanthropic process and respond to community needs.

Applications and information are available at www.jewishcleveland.org/syp and are due by September 2, 2014 at 5:00 p.m. Applicants will be notified of their status no later than September 17, 2014. Panelists are selected through nominations from their rabbis, religious school directors, or youth group advisors, or a submitted application. Contact your rabbis for recommendation letters.

Selection to the Saltzman Youth Panel is highly selective and requires true commitment from its members. Selected students are required to attend all scheduled sessions, including seven Sunday meetings, a presentation to the Federation's Board of Trustees, Super Sunday, two dialathons, and conduct outside research and agency site visits.

The Maurice Saltzman Youth Grant Program of the Jewish Federation of Cleveland was established in the spring of 1998 through a generous gift from Shirley Saltzman and her family in memory of the late Maurice Saltzman. The program perpetuates the goals of Maurice Saltzman, a past president of the Jewish Federation of Cleveland, who cared deeply about educating the next generation of Jewish community leadership. Each year, a new Saltzman Youth Panel makes decisions to allocate \$50,000 to worthy organizations – 85% of which is awarded to programs serving the Jewish community. The other 15% is awarded to non-profit programs serving the general community. Through this process, the participants learn about the philanthropic process, responding to community needs, and most importantly, tzedakah.
