# Census of 150 Years Ago Gave Extensive Inventory of "Manufactures"

In the Eighth Census of the United States (1860), census enumerators recorded many details, including each person's name, age as of the census day, sex, color, birthplace, occupation of males and females over age fifteen, and more. No relationships were shown between members of a household.<sup>1</sup>

Five years later, an extensive 745-page inventory of "manufactures" was published by the Government Printing Office in Washington, "compiled from the original returns." It is from these data that we get an idea of what the industries in Jasper County were on the eve of the Civil War.

It was reported that there were two "blacksmithing" establishments employing five hands. In these firms, \$2,000 in capital was invested with raw materials costing \$488. Labor costs were given as \$1,500, with the annual value of products given as \$3,700.<sup>3</sup>

This cannot have been correct as there were no less than a dozen blacksmiths in Newton Township alone.<sup>4</sup> Two men in Poweshiek Township were listed as blacksmiths, George Ely, 33,<sup>5</sup> and Isaiah Gagle, 24.<sup>6</sup>

According to this census report, there was one boot and shoe manufactory in Jasper County in 1860. There was \$500 invested in this business, with \$250 being the cost of raw material. Labor costs were \$300 per year (one employee) and the annual value of products reported as \$700.

The enumerator counted four shoemakers in Newton Township. There were none listed for Poweshiek or Mound Prairie Township. (It wasn't until June 1861 that the Board of Supervisors divided Mound Prairie Township and Washington Township was formed. Sherman Township was organized in 1868.

Six establishments were engaged in the bituminous coal industry 150 years ago, employing ten hands. Capital invested was \$2,500, with \$900 being the cost of raw material. Annual cost of labor was \$3,000, with products valued at \$4,450 per year.<sup>11</sup>

Joseph Powell, a member of Joseph Slaughter's household in Mound Prairie Township, was listed as a "Cole Miner." He was born in "Whales" about 1825. 12

Daniel Swank, 34, was listed as a miner in the Poweshiek Township count.<sup>13</sup>

The milling industry (flour and meal) was the county's largest in terms of capital invested (\$47,500) and cost of raw material (\$64,740). There were four milling establishments employing ten hands. Labor costs were \$3,240 per year, with the value of products reported as \$80,340.<sup>14</sup>

"Because of the limitations on transportation during this era, the milling industry was more or less localized," Ivan F. Woodrow wrote a century later. "Grain had to be moved to the mills, processed, packaged and distributed. The larger operations were located on rivers which provided cheap water power but smaller mills were scattered throughout inland communities." <sup>15</sup>

In Poweshiek Township, 35-year-old William Harter was listed as a miller. Walter Briggs, 45, 17 and German-born Jacob Keltner, 26, 18 were millwrights.

There were ten sawmills in Jasper County in 1860, including portable. The amount of capital invested in these was \$19,900, with \$10,665 given as the cost of raw material. There were 32 mill hands employed at a combined salary of \$8,064 per year. The value of lumber sawed was \$24,650 per year. <sup>19</sup>

Three "saddlery" and harness manufacturers provided employment for seven men. The amount of capital involved (\$7,000) plus cost of raw material (\$3,200) equaled \$10,200. Labor cost \$1,680 annually and the value of products was reported as \$9,000.<sup>20</sup>

Newton had two saddlers and two harness makers at this time.<sup>21</sup>

The single wool-carding establishment in Jasper County had \$2,000 invested in it, with \$3,600 given as the cost of raw material. This wool carder employed one worker at a cost of \$240 per year. The value of items produced was \$3,840 per year.<sup>22</sup>

The census reported a total of 27 manufacturing establishments in Jasper County. A total of \$81,400 was invested in them, with raw materials costing a total of \$83,843.<sup>23</sup>

Sixty-six hands were employed in these early industrial ventures. According to this report, none of them employed women.<sup>24</sup>

The annual cost of labor was reported as \$18,024, with \$126,680 given as the annual value of products.<sup>25</sup>

As indicated above, this listing is less than complete. Other manufactures, such as bread, brick, "carpentering," clothing, confectionery, cooperage, dentistry, furniture – cabinet, millinery, painting, photographs, printing, stone work, tin ware, wagons, watches, etc. were not reported as they were for other counties.

There were skilled workers represented in these professions, occupations, or trades in Jasper County. One woman, Mrs. Julia Newell, was a milliner in Newton.<sup>26</sup>

# Sadie D. Hurst, Census Taker

On 23 March 1910, Sadie D. Hurst received from W. H. H. Asbury, Supervisor of census for the Sixth Iowa district, her commission as enumerator for the district comprising the incorporated city of Colfax, in Jasper County. The only woman in the class that took the examination, she beat out four competitors for the position.<sup>1</sup>

Mrs. Hurst, a 50-year-old divorcee, had the advantage of being the society reporter for *The Colfax Clipper*, a Republican weekly. She was living on Walnut Street with her elderly father, Charles A. Dotson, a retired farmer, whose caregiver she was.<sup>2</sup>

She was to commence counting the Spring City's residents 15 April.<sup>3</sup> The information to be recorded included name, relationship to head of family, age at last birthday, sex, color or race, whether single, married, or divorced, birthplace, birthplace of father and mother, and more.<sup>4</sup>

Mrs. Hurst's employer, editor-publisher H. W. "Ham" Robinson, gave her his full support and encouragement. "The census enumerator starts upon her rounds in Colfax tomorrow," he wrote in the 14 April issue of the *Clipper*. "Be ready to answer her questions promptly and give her all the assistance in your power."

He also offered her the following advice: "We suggest to the Colfax census enumerator, Mrs. Sadie Hurst, that it will be a good scheme to make each head of the household answer the questions, because the probabilities are that he can put down an approximate estimate of his wife's age without creating a painful scene."

Then, wouldn't you know it, Mother Nature interfered: "As soon as the enumerators started out snow came along and gave us an imitation of how March swapped places with April on the calender [sic] this year while preparing a proper reception of the count."

"COLD FACTS," a weekly column in the *Clipper*, gives us a pretty good sense of the marvels and frustrations Mrs. Hurst experienced as a census taker. Given Editor Robinson's freely expressed attitudes and opinions, the experiences recounted may need to be taken with a grain of salt.

"In her rounds last week the census enumerator discovered one woman who is the mother of 16 children – nothing like race suicide in that family; but she found seven households in the next block where they didn't have a kid to their backs and none of the couples had been married for a shorter term than ten years, while one pair had been spliced 40 years – but they lived in a locality remote from the mineral springs.

"It's wonderful the way some women get rattled when they come to answer the census enumerator's questions. The other day the Colfax enumerator tackled an auburn haired brunette and was getting along all right till she came to the question: 'How old are you?' Before the artless virgin had time to consider she blurted out: 'thirty-eight;' then realizing what she had done the bewildered creature caught her breath, stammered and

stuttered, finally exclaiming: 'Oh, I didn't mean that – indeed I didn't, I'm only 24. Thirty-eight's my bust measure.' And the enumerator had to put on a new blank and go all over the questions again.

"And among other freak heads of families she has encountered was a colored man who gave in his father's native count[r]y as Ireland, and his native language as Irish. Just think of a colored man addressing you in Irish. This is the first colored descendant of Irish paternity ever enrolled in Colfax."

Some residents could not be found. Regarding one black miner and his family Mrs. Hurst wrote, "Could not obtain Information left town May 1st."

All in all, things went well for this particular enumerator. "MRS. SADIE HURST informs the Clipper that she last week completed her task of enumerating the population of Colfax for the Thirteenth United States census – putting in twenty-one days of faithful work, and being very kindly treated by everybody," Robinson wrote. "Returns will be sent to the district supervisor next Saturday, and if any person, resident of Colfax has failed of being enumerated, or knows of some one else who has not been enumerated, let him please report to Mrs. Sadie Hurst, in person tomorrow."

After a six weeks' visit from her son, Dale, of Reno, NV, <sup>10</sup> Mrs. Hurst took off for Reno for a two months' visit with Dale and her other son, Glenn, who were in business there. Thereafter, she expected to extend her trip to take in San Francisco and Seattle.

"The Clipper hopes the lady will have a delightful time," the editor wrote. "She certainly deserves all the enjoyment of her vacation from household duties that is due to a loving daughter who has for many years cared for an aged father." 11

Strange that Robinson did not mention a holiday from work – or Mrs. Hurst's three-week adventure as a census taker!

# 1910 Church Census of Colfax

Approximately two months before Mrs. Hurst completed her duties counting Colfax's population a "church census" of the city was taken by "a combination of the church people of all denominations." It was published in *The Colfax Clipper* on 19 May 1910.

"Because there has been some false statements made as to why the results of the church census were not published," Rev. Nevil R. Miles, pastor of the Presbyterian Church, advised Editor Robinson, "they are given herewith, incomplete as they are, for all churches."

"This enumeration gives Colfax a population of 2335, of whom 1450 are adults, and 885 children," the *Clipper* noted.

Rev. Miles' figures gave the breakdown of church preferences as follows: Presbyterian, 334; Baptist, 329; Methodist Episcopal, 328; Christian, 218; Catholic, 77; Colored, 65; and Miscellaneous, 99. Of these, 13 were Christian Scientists, 7 Jewish, 7 Unitarians, 6 Episcopalians, 4 Congregationalists, 4 German Lutherans, 4 Mormons, 4 Spiritualists, 3 United Brethren, 3 Universalists, and 2 Quakers. Forty-three said they had no religious preference.<sup>1</sup>

Among the children the results were Methodist Episcopal, 249; Baptist, 231; Presbyterian, 146; Christian, 132; Catholic, 49; Colored, 48; Miscellaneous, 30.

Members in the city limits (totaling 726) were divided as follows: Methodist Episcopal, 186; Baptist, 139; Christian, 104; Presbyterian, 80; Catholic, 63; Colored, 56; Miscellaneous, 98.

The preferences for Sunday Schools were as follows: Methodist, 197; Presbyterians, 151; Baptists, 148; Christians, 117, and the colored churches, 62.

There were nine churches in Colfax one hundred years ago: Bethel Baptist (Colored), African Methodist Episcopal, First Baptist, Christian Science, Methodist Episcopal, First Presbyterian, Roman Catholic, Christian, and Episcopal.

Bethel Baptist Church (Colored) was situated at the corner of Chautauqua Avenue and Lincoln.<sup>2</sup> Rev. James Hudson, 40, was the pastor.<sup>3</sup> Rev. William H. Clark was a retired minister of this church.<sup>4</sup>

Rev. Silas W. Stansbury, pastor of the Newton A. M. E. Church, was apparently in charge of the Colfax church.  $^5$ 

First Baptist Church, Rev. John L. Barton, pastor, was at the corner of Walnut and Washington. Rev. Barton, 24, was also editor and publisher of *The Baptist Messenger*, a religious monthly.<sup>6</sup>

The Christian Science Church was at 206 S. Locust. Mrs. Lena Blake was First Reader and Miss Alice A. Clark, 60, was a Christian Science Practitioner. 8

Rev. Eugene Wilbur F. ReQua, 52, was pastor of the M. E. Church, located at the corner of Locust and Division.<sup>9</sup>

First Presbyterian Church, of which the 40-year-old Rev. Miles was pastor, was at the corner of Division and Walnut. 10

Immaculate Conception Church was located at East Front and Elm Streets. 11 It was a mission church served out of Newton by Rev. William Treacy. 12

The Christian Church, of which Mrs. Gertrude S. Harman, 30, of Des Moines, was the minister, was located at the corner of Locust and Division.<sup>13</sup>

There was also an Episcopal Church in Colfax at about this time. The parish was established under the name of St. Clement's in about 1901. 14

# **United Spanish War Veterans**

The Spanish-American War lasted less than a year from 21 April 1898 to 11 April 1899 although actual hostilities ceased on 13 August 1898. Fifty-seven thousand three hundred twenty nine (57,329) regular troops participated, 223,235 militia and volunteer troops and 31,959 Navy personnel (this number includes officers in the US Marine Corps but not officers in the US Navy proper) for a total of 312,523. Soon after the men returned home they began to form veterans' organizations. Originally there were several organizations. In 1904 three of the most prominent merged into a single organization known as the United Spanish War Veterans (USWV).

The TAPS form included the name of camp, camp number, department of (state), file date, name and highest rank in USWV, US Service (highest rank), Co, ship/regt, married or single, number and age of children, place of birth, place of death, date of death, buried in <a href="https://example.com/slank-cemetery">blank></a> cemetery at <a href="https://example.com/slank-cemetery">blank></a> with military honors, grave in charge of and camp number.

# **Naturalizations - First Papers**

The Iowa Genealogical Society recived a number of naturalization documents from the district court files in Polk County. Volunteer members scanned the documents and, when the ink was faded, transcribed the information. Great care was taken to assure each name was correct with the coordinating scan. The documents were then indexed for easy use.

The images on this page are available to IGS members for \$5.00 or to non-members for \$7.50 per sheet plus \$2.50 postage and handling by writing to IGS (see page 1 for the address) with the requested names. The front side, back side and transcription for an individual all are included in the mailing.

The indexing of the naturalization images used the following guidelines.

- If there was more than one date on a document, the earliest date was used in the name. The dating system of "year-month-day" was used.
- If the immigrant's signature was legible, his spelling was used for the name.
- If the name was difficult to decipher, other volunteers were consulted. Census indexes, city directories and Ancestry.com were also used to determine the name.
- In the rare instance of not being able to decipher a given name, the symbol ^^^ is used with the first initial of the name.
- There are a few documents in which the immigrant wrote his first name and the clerk wrote a different/similar name; i.e. Johannes vs. Jonathan or Charles vs. Carl. In these cases, the immigrant's signature was used as the name with the clerk's interpatation in parentheses.
- If the document originated in another county, the document was filed in Polk County Iowa.
- Even though the document was larger than 8x11 inches, the information on the back side may not have been that large. So the back side was usually scanned at the 8x11 size. No information was omitted to do this.
- Depending on the original paper size, the document was bi-folded or tri-folded to about 3x8 inch size. The name was written by the court clerk across one end for filing. This resulted in the "back side" of the document.
- There were some documents where the name on the back side did not agree with the name on the actual document. (Sometimes this is the name of the court clerk, which is the first name appearing on the document).
