# CCRSPA MINUTES - March 24, 2009

Members met at 11:00 for fellowship at the Perryville United Methodist Church before the meeting was convened by President Helen Chapman at 11:30.

First time visitors Pat Chalmers and Lucille Haddix were introduced. In addition, Anne Sutton, Area Director was introduced and spoke briefly. She congratulated us for our increasing membership once again. She also spoke of the upcoming Annual Business Meeting in May and the Convention in September. Anne reported that her term as Area Director is ending in June and that Dorothy Palmer of Talbot County will be succeeding her. We wished her well.

The minutes were approved and the Treasurer's Report was accepted.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

<u>Community Outreach</u>: Jan Yuninger reported that the coats were all distributed through the schools and reminded members to contribute to the Coat Fund.

<u>Volunteer</u>: Helen reminded us that a report of volunteer hours was due to the MSRSPA in early April. A clipboard is being placed at the luncheon tables to encourage members to record their volunteer activities on a regular basis.

<u>Membership</u>: Sandra Holland told us that we had 20 new members, which was the highest number in the state.

Nominating: Elaine Griffin read the slate of Officers and Committee Chairs that will be installed in May and take office in July. A directory of new officers and their addresses will be in the August Chalkboard. Tony Mattern will be added to the Publications Committee.

<u>Health and Benefits</u>: Donna Short reminded us of the upcoming Health Fair at Elkton High School on May 1st. She added that new numbers for the new insurance contract for next year are not yet available.

<u>Scholarship</u>: we have one applicant at this time. We were reminded to contribute to the Scholarship Fund.

We paused for a delightful chicken luncheon prepared by the Ladies of the Church. After the meal, we continued the business meeting with the President's Report. Helen spoke of the upcoming Annual Meeting, at which they will vote on a new President-elect for the State.

At this meeting, there will also be discussion and vote on a possible \$10 increase in dues in 2010. There has not been an increase since 2001. The

budget and by-laws will be voted upon. A discussion was held about the dues increase and it was decided to let the delegates vote after they had heard the discussion at the meeting.

Helen also stated there is renewed interest in trying to shift the cost of pensions onto the counties. This could potentially affect us by causing a shift of money used for health care to pensions. It was suggested that we might want to contact House and Senate members to share our opinions.

Barb Sanders introduced our guest speaker, Jean Moran, Director of Volunteer Programs at Union Hospital in Elkton. She spoke of particular programs staffed by volunteers, such as the Joint Program, Lobby greeters, gift shop and Patient Representatives. There are also volunteers who give hand rubs to patients and those that bring dogs for pet visitations.

The meeting ended after the door prizes were awarded and the raffle was held. We adjourned at 1:40.

# **BENEFIT UPDATE - APRIL 2009**

Thank you, Henry Shaffer!! I think that I am expressing the sentiments of all of our retirees. Mr. Shaffer has agreed to lead the school system for another four years. I had a conversation with him recently and expressed my appreciation for his decision. He was ready to join our ranks as a CCPS retiree when he was asked to accept the position of Superintendent of Schools. As many of you are aware, Mr. Shaffer has always been an advocate for those of us who are retired from the school system. He has remained vigilant in making sure that our benefits are safe.

The Maryland Retired School Personnel Association has distributed literature regarding proposed legislation that could pass on the cost of retirement to local entities, referencing "retirees could lose their health care benefits". In Cecil County that is not the case. Our health care benefits are part of the negotiated agreement with all employee groups. We will continue to have health insurance, and we will continue to have a subsidy to help offset the cost of our premiums. Mr. Shaffer was instrumental in appointing a retiree representative to the Benefit Advisory Committee; so we also have a voice and a vote on all benefit issues.

At a recent meeting of the Benefit Advisory Committee, Mae Alfree, Benefits Manager, advised us that the claims experience for all groups (active and retiree) were up. The consultants will make rate recommendations once they determine if the claims increase is a spike or a utilization trend. The Board understands affordable healthcare is important and will continue to offer the best possible benefit offering to all CCPS retirees and employees.

Don't forget the CCPS Employee's Wellness Fair on May 1<sup>st</sup>....all retirees are invited. It will be held at the Elkton High School from 8am to 4pm; however, there will

be a break from 11:30 – 12:30. Union Hospital will provide: stroke center, eating healthy, GI health, sleep services, chest program, skin screenings, diabetes awareness, joint replacement and other services. There will be several massage therapists and reflexologists.

A large number of informational booths will include: CareFirst, Coventry Healthcare, Delta Dental, Eye Med, American Cancer Society, Blood Bank of Delaware, Fun & Fit 4 Life, and lots more. There will be workshops in the morning and afternoon, to include: Emotional Aspects of Financial Management, How to Make the Most of Your Life, Jazzercise, Chess Demonstration, Energy Presentation, Healthy Cooking, Yoga, Zumba, Tai Chi, Cyber Safety. So, it is free, it is close by, and it will provide a great opportunity to see old friends while taking advantage of a wealth of "Wellness" information.

# **Burglar Alert When Traveling by Car**

Tourists' cars are prime break-in targets. Thieves know they are likely to hold valuables such as luggage and cameras. Out-of-state license plates, driving a rental car, having visible boxes or bags that could contain valuables are items thieves watch for. Even a map left on the seat makes it look like a tourist.

Empty your car of valuables when you park it. If you have out-of-state license plates, park in a garage or other secure location. Leave local newspapers and store packaging in the car – in plain sigh – to make it appear more "local." The thief knows that when you are traveling you often don't take the time to report a burglary. Another tip: Don't leave a message on your answering machine saying you are away from home.
