LIBRARY GILD




GARDENERS' GILD

Autumn in the Hudson Valley of New York

A day trip on October 11, 2014: Presented by the Gardeners Gild with support from the Nancy Ellen Banis Memorial Education Fund.

On Saturday, October 11, 2014, the Gardeners Gild will visit historic Kykuit, The Rockefeller Estate in Tarrytown, New York. Kykuit is a magnificent estate that was the home of the Rockefeller families for 4 generations. The estate includes a six story stone mansion and terraced gardens featuring numerous fountains and the outdoor sculpture collection of Nelson A. Rockefeller. This exceptional collection includes works by Pablo Picasso, Henry Moore, Alexander Calder, Louise Nevelson, and David Smith, among many others. The property overlooks the Hudson River Valley of New York and our trip is timed to enjoy the colors of the area's fall foliage.

Costs: A reduced price of \$48 per person for Arden Club members, or \$60 for non-members, is the cost to participants for the bus ride and the tour of Kykuit.



Reservation Details: Participants must RSVP by phone to Barbara Conway (302-529-9464) by the end of the day on Monday, September 15, 2014, with a non-refundable payment by check to the Arden Club. Reservations will be accepted on a first come, first served basis and are limited by the number of passenger seats (24) on the bus.

Additional Options: Sites of interest in the Hudson Valley which participants may also want to visit include: 1) Sunnyside: Washington Irving's Residence and Garden; 2) Philipsburg Manor, a farm from 1735 that tells the story of farming and life in colonial America; 3) Stone Barns Center for Food and Agriculture, with a working farm, market and walking trails; or 4) Lyndhurst, the Gothic mansion designed by architect Alexander Jackson Davis, and lovely surrounding gardens. OPEN CALL FOR ARTIST PROPOSALS

In 2007, Aaron and Sally Hamburger created a fund for the Village of Arden for an annual lecture series. They have changed their bequest so that the remainder of the money shall fund a public art work that will benefit the entire Arden community.

Proposals are requested for a public art work (painting, mural, sculpture, or landscape design) to be permanently installed outdoors in the Village of Arden. Suggested sites include the Gild Hall, Buzz Ware Village Center, or Arden Craft Shop Museum. The proposals should include location, material, visuals, cost estimate, and how the community may benefit or the rationale for the work. The costs should include design, execution, and installation, not to exceed \$12,000.
