2011 Arrigo O. Rogers Memorial Scholarship Award Application

Background Information

This scholarship award, established in remembrance of Arrigo O. Rogers, a graduate of the EOF program and an exceptional leader, is given to students enrolled in the EOF program who have demonstrated outstanding leadership skills and ability, and have a proven commitment to serving others. This commitment is evidenced through assuming leadership roles in their student communities and in their dedication to community service and civic engagement.

About Arrigo O. Rogers

Arrigo O. Rogers was a graduate of the EOF program at Rutgers College in New Brunswick, where he received EOF funding for both his undergraduate and graduate studies. He earned a Bachelor's degree in Administration of Justice and Political Science in 1994 and a Master's in Social Work from the Rutgers University Graduate School of Social Work in 1998. As a student, Arrigo served as one of the founding members and then President of the Alliance of EOF Students of New Jersey (AESNJ), the statewide EOF Student organization.

Other student leadership roles that Arrigo undertook as an undergraduate include: President of the Paul Robeson Club, Business Manager for the Black Voice/Carta Boricua campus news paper, and Chair of the Human Interest Rutgers College Programming Committee. He was also involved with the Rutgers Police Department/Student Interaction Committee, was Business Manager for the African Kaleidoscope (radio program), and member of the Black Men's Collective and the Rutgers Sexual Assault Date Rape Theatrical Group.

While pursuing his graduate study, Arrigo was a residence counselor for the Rutgers College Office of Residence Life for three years. During that time, he was commended for his bravery in the resolution of an incident involving the kidnapping of a resident at gunpoint. This tenacity continued into his professional life, as an Academic Counselor with the Rutgers College EOF Program. As a counselor, he was instrumental in establishing the Summer Residence Life staff-training program.

After joining the Rutgers College EOF staff in 1994, Arrigo served as the Student Leadership Development Coordinator and advisor to the Rutgers College Educational Opportunity Program Student Association (EOPSA). He was also a member of the Executive Board of the New Jersey Educational Opportunity Fund Professional Association (NJEOPFA) in the role of Advisor to AESNJ. Additionally, he was an advisor to the Rutgers College Alpha Pi Chapter, of Chi Alpha Epsilon National Honor Society and the Rutgers College Dean's Diversity Advocacy Board. A sought after facilitator, Arrigo conducted numerous workshops and seminars involving diversity training, grant and proposal writing, and leadership development.

In addition to these diverse roles, Arrigo was also pursuing a second Master's degree in Public Administration from the Baruch College School of Public Administration, and was a highly respected community leader in his home town of Woodbridge New Jersey. He volunteered countless hours to the Woodbridge Domestic Violence Response Team and the Middlesex County Human Relations Commission at the time of his untimely death in November of 2002.

Arrigo earned numerous awards and accolades for his outstanding service and unselfish commitment to EOF, students, and his community. He was a constant source of light that will be forever remembered.

The Arrigo O. Rogers Memorial Scholarship was established in the spring of 2003 in remembrance of this truly special individual.

Scholarship Details & Application Instructions

AWARD PRESENTATION AND RECOGNITION

The Arrigo O. Rogers Memorial Scholarship Award will be presented by the Educational Opportunity Fund Professional Association. Further information on place and date will be forth coming.

The recipients of the award will receive a \$500 scholarship. Award recipients must be available to attend the reception, and due to the educational nature of the scholarship, must be enrolled in school for the semester or term following the qualification.

APPLICANT CRITERIA

1. Must be an enrolled in the Educational Opportunity Fund program as an undergraduate student
2. Have at minimum a 2.75 cumulative grade point average
3. Have successfully completed at minimum 36 credits
4. Must have established a record of exceptional service in campus leadership and/or community service activity, with evidence of attention given to academic and career endeavors
5. Must be in good program standing

Campus Leadership

This is to be demonstrated in one or more ways and may include a) having made significant contributions to the quality of campus life, improvements in the college community, or through distinctive service to the student body, and/or b) having demonstrated exceptional leadership as a member of an executive board of a student organization or in a highly visible campus position.

Community Service Activity

This is volunteer service dedicated to taking initiative in contributing to solving problems in our neighborhoods and communities. This work should address societal or civic issues and be carried out in partnership/on behalf of local, statewide, national, or international organizations. The community service should represent a sustained degree of service involvement over time that can be characterized as inspirational to others and having made a difference in the lives of others.

Special Note for Graduating Students

Graduating seniors earning a bachelor's degree (May or summer 2011) are not eligible for this award.

Students graduating with an Associate's degree (May or summer 2011) and will be enrolled at a four-year college/university for the 2011 fall semester are eligible.

- ✓ The attached application packet certified by the campus EOF Office and which is to include:
- ✓ A college transcript listing courses and grades (an unofficial copy is acceptable)
- ✓ One recommendation letter, from an individual knowledgeable of the applicant's leadership abilities and accomplishments; we recommend a campus administrator, faculty/staff member, or a personal choice from a professional whose office or organization was impacted in some manner by your leadership and/or service efforts.

Application Packet

A. Application Cover Page/EOF Office Certification Statement

You have an Application Cover Page. This form serves as your cover sheet to your application materials. The form also provides for the endorsement of your application by your campus EOF Office.

B. Essay (Typed, 250-500 words, Times Roman, Font Size 12)

As an applicant you have the opportunity to introduce and highlight aspects of your life experience which provides the selection committee an "inside view" of your background, aspirations, and accomplishments. Pay particular attention to writing to the four areas listed below.

1. Familiarize the committee with aspects of your personal background
2. Describe your leadership philosophy
3. Describe what impact your major campus leadership/community service experiences have had on your own self-development, on those you worked with, and those you served

C. Student Involvement History (Times Roman , Font Size 12)

TIP: As much as possible, focus your history on areas of accomplishment that can be briefly described. The accomplishment is not merely the role (i.e. executive board position, etc) or activity but what was done while in that role or as a result of that activity. Describe things that made a difference!

There are many areas from which you can draw from. Here is a sample list.

1. Organizational Memberships
2. Committee Memberships
3. Professional/Career Development: Certifications/Internships/Field Experiences/Co-ops
4. Service-Learning Initiatives/Projects
5. College-Wide Initiatives/Projects
6. Honors/Awards/ Special Recognition
7. Community Service/Civic Engagement Initiatives/Projects
8. Local, State, Regional, National, International Academic Competitions
9. Organizational/Community Leadership Training and Development Programs
10. Resident Assistant/Peer Mentor/Tutor Positions
11. Athletic Team Memberships
12. Faculty/Student Research Projects

D. Letter of Recommendation and College Transcript

While the above items are required, it is also important to provide the letter of recommendation and your college transcript (may be unofficial). TIP: Your recommendation letter present opportunity for underscoring the impact of your accomplishments/work.
