RESOLUTION

January 14, 2014

WHEREAS, Section 15-1502(a) of the Public School Code of 1949 provides:

"Except as provided in Subsection (c), no school shall be kept open on any Saturday for the purpose of ordinary instruction, except when Monday is fixed by the Board of School Directors as the weekly holiday, or on Sunday, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Christmas, Thanksgiving, the first of January, **and up to five (5) additional days designated as local holidays in the adopted school calendar by the Board of School Directors as official local school district holidays** ..."

WHEREAS, the Board of School Directors of the Saucon Valley School District (herein "Board") has adopted a school calendar for the 2014-2015 school year (herein "Exhibit 'A'");

WHEREAS, it is the intention of this Resolution to designate five (5) additional days to be designated as local holidays in the Board's adopted school calendar as official local school district holidays.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board hereby resolves as follows:

1. The following five (5) additional days will be designated as local holidays in the adopted school calendar by the Board for the 2014-2015 school year:

November 28, 2014 April 2, 2015 April 3, 2015 April 6, 2015 May 25, 2015

2. In all other respects, the adopted school calendar for the 2014-2015 school year shall remain as set forth in Exhibit "A."

Virtual High School Global Consortium (VHS) is a non-profit international collaboration of public and private schools from the United States and many other countries. If offers middle and high school students high-quality online courses and provides professional development for online teachers. The program has been internationally recognized as a model for K-12 online education. Because we are members of VHS, some Saucon Valley High School students will be able to:

- Engage in thought-provoking on-line courses.
- Experience robust interactions with teachers and peers.
- Have unique opportunities to collaborate and exchange ideas across cultures and time zones.
- Participate in courses that are highly desired, but aren't otherwise available
- Gain essential 21st century learning skills, such as multimedia presentation, communication, and team-building.

The coursework is challenging. Students need to be highly motivated and must be able to work well on their own. Although students will be scheduled for an 87-minute daily class for one semester for these courses, much time outside of school is also required.

The classes may be chosen from a wide selection of courses that are not part of the regular SVHS curriculum, and will not count towards the core credit requirement. Students must have the approval of their School Counselor for all VHS courses. Once classes begin, students will <u>not</u> be allowed to drop a VHS course. Grades are assigned by the VHS instructor, not the teachers at the Saucon Valley High School. The grades will be part of the student's grade point average. - Replace high school lever cafeteria doors with push bars and kitchen door with door with window and swipe entry = 14,350 for doors and 1,000 for swipe entry
- Replace the deteriorated wood on athletic field seating four sets with new regulation aluminum seats- at Baseball, Field Hockey, and Soccer – <u>cost = 12,100</u>
- Remove carpet, abate asbestos tile and install new tile floor in room 404 at the high school <u>= 4,435</u>

RESOLUTION 2014-15

WHEREAS, on June 27, 2006, the Pennsylvania Legislature passed Act 1 of Special Session 2006, entitled the "Taxpayer Relief Act" (hereinafter "Act 1").

WHEREAS, Act 1 requires school districts to limit tax increases to the level set by an inflation index unless the tax increase is approved by voters in a referendum or the school district obtains from the Department of Education or a court of common pleas certain referendum exceptions;

WHEREAS, Act 1 does, however, allow a board of school directors to elect to adopt a resolution indicating that it will not raise the rate of any tax for the support of the public schools for the following fiscal year by more than its index, provided this resolution must be adopted no later than 110 days prior to the date of the election immediately preceding the upcoming fiscal year;

WHEREAS, the Saucon Valley School District index for the 2014-2015 fiscal year is 2.1%;

WHEREAS, the Saucon Valley School District Board of Directors has made the decision that it shall not raise the rate of any tax for the support of the Saucon Valley School District for the 2014-2015 fiscal year by more than its index;

AND NOW, on this 14th day of January, 2014, it is hereby resolved by the Saucon Valley School District (hereinafter "District") Board of Directors (hereinafter "Board") the following:

- 1. The Board certifies that it will not increase any school district tax for the 2014-2015 school year at a rate that exceeds the index as calculated by the Pennsylvania Department of Education.
- 2. The Board certifies that it will comply with the procedures set forth in Section 687 of the Pennsylvania Public School Code (hereinafter "School Code") 24 P.S., 6-687, for the adoption of its proposed and final budget.
- 3. The Board certifies that increasing any tax at a rate less than or equal to the index will be sufficient to balance its final budget of the 2014-2015 fiscal year.
- 4. The Administration of the District will submit the District's information on a proposed increase in the rate of a tax levied for the support of the District to the Pennsylvania Department of Education on the uniform form prepared by the Pennsylvania Department of Education no later than five days after the Board's adoption of this Resolution.

- 5. The Administration of the District will send a copy of this Resolution to the Pennsylvania Department of Education no later than five days after the Board's adoption of this Resolution.
- 6. The Board understands and agrees that by passing this Resolution it is not eligible to seek referendum exceptions under Section 333(f) of Act 1 and is not eligible to request approval from the voters through a referendum to increase a tax rate by more than the index as established for the 2014-2015 fiscal year.
- 7. Once this Resolution is passed, the Administration of the District is not required to comply with the preliminary budget requirements set forth in paragraphs (a) and (c) of Section 311 of Act 1. Provided, however:
 - (a) The Board understands and agrees that, upon receipt of the information submitted by the District as set forth in paragraphs 4 and 5 above, the Pennsylvania Department of Education shall compare the district's proposed percentage increase in the rate of the tax with the index.
 - (b) Within ten days of the receipt of this information, the Pennsylvania Department of Education shall inform the District whether its proposed tax rate increase is less than or equal to the index.
 - (c) If the Pennsylvania Department of Education determines that the District's proposed increase in the rate of the District's tax exceeds the index, the District is subject to the preliminary budget requirements as set forth in paragraph (a) and (c) of Section 311 of Act 1.
