This year was the Bicentennial of the Lewis and Clark Expedition. Dubbed the "Corps of Discovery" President Jefferson commissioned Lewis and Clark to find a route to the Pacific Ocean. The plan approved by Congress, President Jefferson appointed his Secretary, Meriwether Clark to lead the expedition.

Experiencing incredible difficulties they managed to journey through 11 States from Illinois to Oregon And back again. The expedition left St. Louis May 14, 1804 and returned to the point of departure on September 23, 1806. The Hungate family was able to relive this expedition at The Gateway Arch and the Missouri Historical Museum.

John Kasky reported that Pleasant Groove United Methodist Church was recently sold at auction. Pleasant Groove Methodist Church is the site of the first Hungate family to settle in Illinois, William and Sarah Hungate. In December 1977 a marker was place to dedicate this site. Chester B. Hungate (ABBIAEJ) of Huntington, WV enlisted the help of Ralph B. Hungate (ABBIKBGB) of McLeansboro, Illinois, the great grandson of William; the youngest son of William and Sarah. Ralph was able to secure permission to erect the memorial marker on the church grounds. The location of this marker is on Illinois State Route 14, 17 miles East of Benton and 7 miles West of McLeansboro, Illinois. At this writing the disposition of the new owner is not known. We believe, however, that the marker will remain in place. Following is the inscription on the marker:

"Here lived William & Sarah 'Sally' the first Hungate family in the virgin Illinois territory on their Federal Land Grant of Nov. 16, 1866 William born 1782 died 1846 Sarah born 1787 died 186?"

He was born March 22, 1936 in Dallas, was a graduate of Canyon High School and received his Bachelors and Masters degrees in Education from West Texas State University. He served in the Army. He taught in the Amarillo public schools for 30 years, retiring in January 1990. He was a life member of NEA and TSTA and the Retired Teachers Association. He was a member of San Jacinto Baptist Church. Survivors include his wife Kay, two daughters, Kristi Kay Steelman and husband Jeff of Bovina and Lorri Lynne Bagwell and husband David of Liberal, four grandchildren, Allison Kaye, Ashley Marie, and Amber Lynne Bagwell and Jeffrey Scott Steelman.

<u>Eva Catherine Hungate</u>, age 84, widow of Frank L. Hungate (ABBCBMAG) of McAllen, Texas died on May 13, 2004. Eva married Frank Hungate in January 1936, a union that lasted 64 years. She enjoyed fishing and hunting. Eva contributed her efforts to World War II by painting battleships at the Vancouver, Washington shipyard. Eva loved to travel, and was able to do so as Frank finished out his career on the Minutemen missiles.
