The Harley Summer Day Camp (HDC) is a small neighborhood day camp with a high counselor-to-camper ratio. Our veteran staff is friendly and caring. HDC campers enjoy an active, entertaining—and FUN—summer experience, where they make new friends, learn new skills, and take home some lifelong memories. Located at The Harley School in Brighton, we have outstanding air-conditioned facilities, an indoor pool, onsite medical staff, and free lunch and snacks. If you're new to the HDC, give us a call and check us out!

Day Camp

Day campers will rotate every morning through various activities with trained specialists in outdoor skills, sports activities, and arts and crafts. Daily swimming lessons will be provided by the aquatics staff. Campers may also work with "Feature Teachers." Lunch and a snack will be provided. After lunch outside, there is choice time, when campers may choose between quiet games, playground, active games, and free swim. We will also have various all-camp activities throughout the week. Past all-camp activities have included visits by the Rochester Museum and Science Center and the Wegmans Zoomobile, bounce houses, and celebrations like a luau, fiesta, or Wild Water Day!

Campers must be 4 years of age by August 1 to register, and will be divided by age into six groups that they will stay in for the week. A carnival is held the last day of camp, July 31, from 1:30 to 3 pm. Campers who attend any of the sessions are welcome to attend this event.
