• Purpose of the Study

The study aims to collect and compare data on different input modalities for operating electronic instruments.

• Participant Recruitment and Selection

Anyone without any visual, cognitive and motor impairment is eligible to take part in the study. People with Myopia or Hypermetropia requiring less than 3 Dioptre lenses are also eligible for the study.

• Procedure

The study involves a set of questionnaire followed by a computer task. The task involving pressing a set of buttons in a computer screen using an eye gaze tracker, microphone and a HOTAS (Hands On Throttle-And-Stick). The whole study will take approximately 70 minutes to complete.

• Data Collection

Data will be stored electronically.

Confidentiality

Confidentiality and participant anonymity will be strictly maintained. All information gathered will be used for statistical analysis only and no names or other identifying characteristics will be stated in the final or any other reports. All data will be identified only by a code, and will not be used or made available for any purposes other than the project.

• Likelihood of Discomfort

There is no likelihood of discomfort or risk associated with participation. However, the

participant can leave the experiment at any point of time if he feels fatigue or loses interest.
