## Commander's Message Cdr Dave Smith, AP



#### **USPS Mission Statement:**

"To promote recreational boating skills and boating safety through education, hands-on training, and civic activities while providing fellowship for members."

The District 13 Spring Conference will be held at the Four Points Sheraton Hotel in Ventura, CA, 22-24 March, 2013. All Squadron members who are able to attend will greatly benefit from the educational program and social events at one of the most beautiful marinas on the West coast.

I, P/C Richard Stevens and Ken Kotora, along with five other western state representatives attended the 100th Meridian Initiative at Lake Mead. This program is presented by the Pacific States Marine Fisheries Commission and the United States Fish and Wildlife Service. The focus of the presentation was watercraft inspection and decontamination training for the zebra / quagga mussels contained in Lake Mead. As all Nevada boaters now understand when registering a boat in Nevada, an invasive species decal is now required to be placed on the stern area of the boat. The new minimum requirements for boat cleaning are, Clean Drain and Dry, when a boat leaves Lake Mead. If you have your boat in the water at Lake Mead for over five days, then a high water temperature (140 degrees) pressure spray must be completed before leaving the state. The new boat cleaning equipment is still being set up and should be fully operational by Memorial Day weekend.

## National News USPS Centennial Celebration gets Underway

Created on 2 Feb. 1914, USPS will mark 100 years of education, fellowship and community service in 2014. Based on the powerboat handling skills programs of businessman Roger Upton at the Boston Yacht Club in Marblehead, Mass., USPS offers boating education programs in cities and towns across the U.S., its territories and Japan. The organization has also become an important ally of the U.S. Coast Guard, the Department of Homeland Security, the Department of Commerce and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration.

Today, nearly 40,000 members in more than 400 squadrons provide boating education in everything from seamanship and celestial navigation to marine electronics and engine maintenance. Several projects are under way to celebrate USPS' centennial. For more information and activity updates, visit usps.org/100. The Ship's Store is adding 100th anniversary logo items, an anniversary commemorative stamp is under discussion, and community activities are being planned at all levels.

During the 2014 Annual Meeting in Jacksonville, Fla., the Governing Board will hold a celebration on Saturday, 1 Feb. Our meeting hotel, the Hyatt Regency Jacksonville Riverfront is planning a party for all members. The city plans to post signs throughout the town and is working with the Jacksonville Sail & Power Squadron to conduct a boat parade on the St. John's River. The USPS Flag and Etiquette Committee has designed an anniversary ensign to be flown on members' vessels in 2013 and 2014, and a new logo is available online at theensign.org/foreditors.htm.

To kickoff the yearlong ceremony, anniversary ensigns will be presented to all 32 districts at the 2013 Annual Meeting. Each squadron will create unique ribbon streamers of specified dimensions to affix to their district's ensign. During the 2014 Annual Meeting, districts will parade their ensigns and streamers in an anniversary flag presentation. All members are encouraged to help plan yearlong celebrations in their communities, including municipal proclamations, appearances at civic and marine organization meetings, and presentations during boating safety equipment demonstration days.

#### NOAA and U.S. Power Squadrons renew cooperative charting program January 18, 2013

This week, NOAA and the U.S. Power Squadrons, a non-profit organization dedicated to safe boating, will renew a 50-year commitment to a cooperative charting program that helps to update the nation's thousands of navigational charts.

NOAA

Under the voluntary program, formalized by a Memorandum of Agreement, members of the U.S. Power Squadrons scan water and land areas, looking for changing conditions that may not be reflected on NOAA nautical charts. Power Squadrons members submit their reports online, and NOAA cartographers review and incorporate changes to their navigation products.

"The partnership between Coast Survey and the Power Squadrons is a long and successful one, speaking to our shared vision of safety on U.S. waters," said Rear Admiral Gerd Glang, director of NOAA's Office of Coast Survey. "The cooperative charting program, originally formalized in 1963, continues an extremely cost-effective method for correcting chart errors that are the result of constantly changing coastlines and seafloors."

Over the last ten years, Power Squadrons members have submitted more than 28,000 corrections to NOAA's nautical charts and the United States Coast Pilot, a series of nautical books that cover a variety of information important to coastal and Great Lakes navigators. More than 4,000 members have submitted reports, adding their particular local knowledge to NOAA's national effort to keep navigation materials accurate.

"I believe that our cooperative efforts with NOAA represent an ideal partnership between a volunteer organization and a federal agency," says John Alter, chief commander of the U.S. Power Squadrons. "It gives our members a feeling of accomplishment and pride to see their contributions reflected in the latest nautical chart updates and provides a tangible benefit to being a United States Power Squadrons' member. This cooperative effort has stood the test of time, and we look forward to our continued commitment to this important civic service."

Glang will attend the U.S. Power Squadrons' annual meeting on Saturday. He and John Alter, chief commander of the U.S. Power Squadrons, will sign a new Memorandum of Agreement that updates and improves the cooperative charting program.

In 1963, the U.S. Coast and Geodetic Survey, one of NOAA's predecessor agencies, recognized the challenge of maintaining one thousand U.S. nautical charts - covering 95,000 miles of coastline - with the sparse resources at hand. Many charts would go uninspected by Coast Survey surveyors for decades, agency leaders acknowledged. To help remedy the situation, Coast Survey established the cooperative charting program so local Power Squadron members could check their local charts for accuracy and report discrepancies.

The U.S. Power Squadrons is a non-profit, educational organization dedicated to making boating safer and more enjoyable by teaching classes in seamanship, navigation and related subjects. The organization has nearly 40,000 members, in more than 400 squadrons across the country and in U.S. territories.

#### MARINA SERVICES TO CONTINUE AT ECHO BAY BEYOND FEB 1

BOULDER CITY, NEV. – Land-based services will remain open at Lake Mead National Recreation Area's Echo Bay under a contract amendment that was signed Feb. 1.

The trailer village, RV site, land-based fuel, dry boat storage and administrative building were scheduled to close Feb. 1 after the temporary contract they operated under expired. By amending another contract within the park, these services will now remain open.

"We're very pleased that we're going to be able to continue operations at Echo Bay. Nearly 200,000 people visit this area of the park every year," said Bill Dickinson, park superintendent.

The park issued a prospectus for a new contract, seeking a concessioner to operate both the landbased commercial services and the marina and water-based fuel dock, but no proposals were submitted. The newly signed amendment with Forever Resorts allows land-based operations to continue, but the marina docks and water-based fuel services closed Feb. 1.

"Although the marina is closed, the launch ramp and courtesy dock will remain open," said Dickinson. "Echo Bay is not closed. We encourage people to come on out and enjoy boating and fishing in the peaceful Overton Arm."

Park officials are working to restore water-based fuel sales, but the process could take a few months.

"Our goal is to have water-based fuel available at Echo Bay before the busy summer season," said Dickinson. "In the meantime, people are reminded to know their boats' limits.

"Fill up before you head out on the water and have a communication source like a marine-band radio, in case you need to call for help," he said.

The National Park Service is currently making \$4.5 million in improvements to the Echo Bay Access Road to make the four-mile road safer. Crews are removing and replacing asphalt, installing new guardrail, extending drainage culverts, adding rip rap and installing new tortoise fencing. The project was funded by the Federal Lands Transportation Program. The contractor is Las Vegas Paving, and improvements are scheduled to be complete in May.

Another \$250,000 in improvements is being made to the water and wastewater system to replace underground piping.

## **Homemade Pretzels**

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

1 Tbsp. yeast 1/2 c. warm water 1 tsp. honey 1 1/3 c. flour 1 tsp. salt





#### **DIRECTIONS:**

• Preheat the oven to 325 degrees.

• Put the yeast in a small bowl with the water and honey. Stir a little, then let the mixture sit for 5 minutes.

• Mix the flour and salt together in a medium-size bowl. After the 5 minutes is up, check on the yeast mixture. It should be bigger than before and a little bubbly. Add this mixture to the flour and salt mixture.

• Stir everything together. Use a spoon to start. Finish with your hands. The dough is ready when it's still a little crumbly and flaky. Put the dough on the cutting board and knead it like you are playing with clay. Knead it into one big ball. Break off a piece of dough that's about the size of a big gumball or superball. Use your hands to roll it into a skinny snake.

• Twist the snake into a medium-size pretzel shape, and put it on the cookie sheet. Do this with all the dough, making 12 pretzels.

• Bake for 10 minutes and allow to cool slightly before biting in.

Yield: 1 dozen pretzels
