# April 17-18, 2012 OEHA Annual Conference Technical Program

#### Tuesday, April 17, 2012

#### General Session 9:00-10:00 AM

1.a. (Public Affairs) ODH Director's Address, Gene Philips, Chief of the Bureau of Environmental Health, ODH Gene Phillips holds a Bachelor of Science in Natural Resources Development with a concentration in Environmental Monitoring and Assessment from The Ohio State University, along with a Master in Business Administration from Capital University and a Master in Public Health from The Ohio State University. He is a Registered Sanitarian with the State of Ohio Board of Sanitarian Registration. Gene is currently the Chief of the Bureau of Environmental Health at the Ohio Department of Health, a position he has held since 2006. His responsibilities include overseeing the major environmental health programs. Additionally, he has twelve years of experience practicing environmental public health in small and medium-sized health districts in Central and Southeast Ohio.

This first 30 minutes of this presentation will provide an overview of current ODH program highlights during the past year and initiatives being planned for the future.

#### 1.b. (Public Affairs) Ohio EPA Director's Address-Director Scott Nally, OEPA

Ohio EPA Director Scott J. Nally was sworn into office by Governor John R. Kasich on January 10, 2011 as Ohio EPA's Director, and brings more than 20 years of public and private environmental management experience to the position. Director Nally comes to Ohio EPA after most recently spending the last six years at Ohio's sister agency in Indiana. Director Nally has an undergraduate degree in biological sciences from North Carolina State University and a master's degree in science from the University of Wyoming.

The second 30 minutes of this presentation will provide an overview of current Ohio EPA program highlights during the past year and initiatives being planned for the future.

#### 2. (Sewage) What's Wrong With Ohio's Sewage Rules?, Rebecca Fugitt, ODH

Rebecca Fugitt holds a BS and MS Degree in Geological Sciences from Ohio University. Rebecca has worked 25 years with the past 14 years working for ODH. She also worked for ODNR Division of Water for 10 yrs. and 3 yrs. at the National Ground Water Association.

This presentation will provide an overview of what's wrong with Ohio's current sewage rules and why we need to make the changes to the existing sewage rules.

3. (Solid Waste) New Division of Materials & Waste Management - Pam Allen OEPA, Div. Chief Pam Allen is the Chief of Ohio EPA's newly formed Division of Materials and Waste Management. Ms. Allen had been the Chief of the Division of Solid and Infectious Waste Management since June 2007. Prior to that, she worked in the Division of Hazardous Waste Management for 20 years serving in several different management positions for 18 of those years. She earned a bachelor's degree in chemistry with a focus on environmental studies and business from John Carroll University in University Heights, Ohio.

This presentation will offer an update on Ohio EPA's hazardous and solid waste management programs and the recent merger of three divisions into two new divisions.

4. (Air) Legionnaire's Disease Outbreak in a Long Term Care Facility: Environmental Considerations, L. Jacobs Luke Jacobs graduated from Eastern Kentucky University in 2002 with a BS Degree in Environmental Health. He went to work for Public Health Dayton Montgomery County for 5 years and received a Masters of Public Health degree from Eastern Kentucky University with an emphasis in environmental health management. He began working at Hamilton County in 2007 as a supervisor in the environmental health division and has recently began working at Columbus Public Health in the Disease Prevention Section.

This lecture will explore the challenges that face local health departments when faced with a confirmed outbreak of legionnaire's disease at a long term care facility.

5. (Pools) Pool Operation & Management – 10 Ingredients to Success, Kurt Carmen, OSU Kurt Carmen, a native of Ohio and an alumnus of The Ohio State University has been employed in the field of aquatic administration since 1974. He arrived at the OSU in 2002 to oversee the construction of the Aquatic Pavilion. Kurt is also the owner and founder of the Ohio Aquatic Council, Ltd., a consulting firm supporting aquatic education, engineering and design.

This presentation will provide an overview on proper operation and maintenance of pools.

#### 6. (Sewage) New HSTS General NPDES Permit, Mark Stump, Ohio EPA

Mark Stump received a BS Degree in Chemical Engineering from Ohio University and works as Environmental Supervisor/WQE2 for the PTI and Compliance Assistance Unit for Ohio EPA Division of Surface Water where he has worked for the past 26 years.

A presentation will provide an overview of the new HSTS general NPDES permit that will be implemented before the date of the conference. The presentation will include time for Q&A on sampling protocols and results and other issues that local health departments will face in the implementation and enforcement of the new permit conditions.

(Food) Dishwashing Machines and More, John Mandala, Alco Mandala Products
 John Mandala is a co-founder of Alco Mandala Products started up about 40 years ago.
 John received his Degree in Communications from Kent State University.

 Connie Livchak has worked for Ohio EPA Division of Materials and Waste Management for the past 1.5 years.

The presentation will provide an overview of OEPA's New Orphaned Landfill Program (CLOSER).

9. (Management) Environmental Public Health Leadership Forum Part I-This session will be facilitated by Bob Hasenyager, Mary Helen Smith, and John McLeod. Presentations followed by open discussions will be planned on various key public health issues facing local health departments.

10. (Pesticides) NPDES Permitting for Mosquito Control Programs in 2012, Joanne Kick-Raack, OSU Joanne Kick-Raack is the State Program Director for the Pesticide Safety Education Program for the Ohio State University Extension and has been with the program for over 20 years. She holds a BS Degree in Plant Pathology from Cornell University and an MS Degree in Agricultural Education with an emphasis in IPM from the Ohio State University. Joanne is a charter member and past- President of the American Association of Pesticide Safety Educators. She has served in Washington D.C. as the National Program Leader for the Pesticide Applicator Training program at the USDA. In her role as state pesticide coordinator, Joanne is the liaison for Ohio on pesticide education issues with the US Environmental Protection Agency, the US Department of Agriculture and the Ohio Department of Agriculture.

This presentation will provide an overview of the new NPDES Permitting regulations for the Mosquito Control Program.

11. (Food) Using Quality Improvement to Decrease Repeated Violations in Restaurants, Paul Desario, Cuy. Co. Paul Desario is a registered sanitarian who has worked with the Cuyahoga County Health District for the past 17 years. Paul received his Environmental Science Degree in 1994 from Kent State University. He received his MPH from the University of Akron in 1999.

The food protection unit identified re-occurring critical violations as a weakness in our programming. To address this issue, CCBH conducted a rapid cycle improvement project to measure what interventions if any, had success in decreasing critical violations in restaurants.

12. (Solid Waste) The Tire Recycling Business, Phillip Lutton, Rumpke Consolidated Companies, Inc.
 Philip Lutton worked 6 years as a sanitarian and currently works with Rumpke Landfill. Phillip received a BS
 Degree in Environmental and Hazardous Materials Management from the University of Findlay.

This presentation will discuss the ins and outs of the tire recycling business, common myths and misconceptions. It will reflect on my experience as a division supervisor for the Rumpke Tire Recycling Facility in New Miami, Ohio. This project was the cleanup of the third largest used tire dump in Ohio.

13. (Management) Environmental Public Health Leadership Forum Part II This session will be facilitated by Bob Hasenyager, Mary Helen Smith, and John McLeod. Presentations followed by open discussions will be planned on various key public health issues facing local health departments.

#### Split Session IV 2:20-3:20 PM

14. (Sewage) Innovations in Precast, Drainage & Onsite Wastewater Products - Justin Setser, Polylok / Zabel Justin Seltzer has worked as a sales representative for Polylok for the past 8 years and has over 31 years of experience in precast concrete, field service, and septic system deliveries.

This presentation will explain the advantages and proper installation of Polylok's product lines which include distribution boxes and effluent filters.

15. (Food) A Chef's Perspective on Quality Assurance, Jack Edwards, DoubleTree Hotel Chief Chef Jack Edwards attended Culinary Institute of America where he graduated in 1980 with a Certified Executive Chef Certificate. He has over 37 years of experience in commercial food operations including hotels, restaurants, off-site catering, and carry out; acting as Executive Chief for the past 3.5 years for the DoubleTree Worthington.

The chef will provide information on food safety and sanitation from his perspective. He will discuss how a comprehensive QA plans enhances both food safety and food quality. The chef will discuss DoubleTree's QA plan with temp logs, date marking, and employee illness controls that ensure a level of food protection.

16. (Management) Health District Merger's: Challenges & Opportunities, Summit Co. Experience, B. Hasenyager Bob Hasenyager has worked with the Summit Co. Combined Health District for the past 16 years and currently serves as the Environmental Health Director. Bob received his BS Degree in Biology from Kent State University and a MS Degree in Environmental Management from the University of Findlay.

This presentation will provide an overview of merger lessons learned when the Barberton and Akron Health Departments were recently merged with the Summit County Health District.

17. (Rabies) Raccoon Variant Rabies, John Paul Seman, USDA Wildlife Services

John Paul Seman is currently the District Supervisor for the USDA-Wildlife Services Program in the Northern Ohio District, which encompasses 39 Ohio counties. John Paul's duties include supervision of USDA's raccoon rabies, deer management, wildlife and aircraft conflicts at airports, and other wildlife damage programs within the state. John Paul received his BS Degree in Wildlife and Fisheries Management from The Ohio State University.

This presentation will cover the many different types of rabies variants throughout the nation. The presentation will take a look at these different variant types and how they are being managed with a focus on the management of raccoon variant rabies in Ohio. We will talk about various techniques, new vaccines, successes, and finally what the future holds for rabies management.

- (Pools) Water Quality in W. L. Erie-Ken Krieger, Heidelberg University, Director of National Center for Water Quality Research
  Dr. Kreiger receive a BS, MS, and PhD Degrees in Biology, all from Emory University
  Diverse water quality issues persist or have recently reappeared in Lake Erie. Current major issues will be presented, partly in an interactive format using web-based sources.
- 19. (Sewage) Eval. Soil Loading Rates for New and Replacement Sewage Systems, Matthew Deaton, ODNR Matthew Deaton received his BS Degree in Crop Science with a minor in Agricultural Construction. Systems Management from The OSU University. For the past 11 years he is has worked at the Ohio Department of Natural Resources where he is currently serving as the Soil Resources Administrator

This presentation will review how to choose the best loading rates and determining options for systems and placement of those systems in terms of the soil profile/borings.

20. (Manufactured Homes) Ohio Manufactured Homes Commission Overview, OMHC Director Janet Williams Janet M. Williams has been in the Manufactured Homes Industry for 17 years. She worked with the Ohio Manufactured Homes Association for nearly 10 years, leaving the Association to help with the start-up of the newly formed Ohio Manufactured Homes Commission in 2005. She served as the Assistant Director prior to being named Executive Director for the Commission.

This presentation will provide an overview and update of the Ohio Manufactured Homes Commission and the role that health departments play.

#### 21. (Rabies, Ticks, Mosquitoes) Zoonotic Disease Program, Kathleen Smith, ODH

Dr. Kathy Smith graduated from The Ohio State University College of Veterinary Medicine in 1978 and received her BS Degree Animal Science, College of Agriculture; DVM College of Veterinary Medicine; MPH Preventive Medicine, all from OSU. She has been the State Public Health Veterinarian at the Ohio Department of Health since 1988. Within the Bureau of Infectious Diseases, Dr. Smith supervises the Zoonotic Disease Program. The Zoonotic Disease Program deals with those diseases that are transmitted from animals to man such as rabies and WNV.

This presentation will provide an overview of the status of zoonotic disease surveillance and prevention activities in Ohio. Specific topics include rabies, zoonotic disease reporting, tick and mosquito borne diseases.

22. (Public Affairs) How OEHA Represents Its Members on Pending Legislation- Holzapfel, Hicks Partners, LLC Zach Holzapfel, vice president at Hicks Partners, LLC, is a 10-year government relations professional with a wealth of experience in state and local government by maintaining constant contact with government agencies, departments, Ohio General Assembly and Ohio congressional delegations. Holzapfel holds a Master of Public Administration degree from Ohio University and a Bachelor of Arts degree in Communication from Capital University.

This presentation will provide an overview of how Zach serves the Ohio Environmental Health Association on pending legislation that effects public health.

23. (Food) Food Protection-A Grocer's Perspective, Mike Diskin, Giant Eagle Mike Diskin presently serves as the Retail Food Safety Manager for Giant Eagle where he has worked for the past 2.5 year. Prior to that Mike worked as a regulator for 26 years for the Allegency County Health Department. Mike received a MS Degree in Public Health from Michigan University.

This presentation will cover the critical elements of a comprehensive food safety program for a major grocery business.

24. (Solid Waste) "What do I do with all of these TV's?", Mark Adams, Canton City Health Dept. Mark Adams received BS Degree in Biology from Akron University and a MS Degree in Public Health from Tulane University. Mark Adams serves as the Director of Environmental Health for the Canton City Board of Health where he has worked the past 18 years. Mark recently retired from the United States Coast Guard after serving nearly 23 years in both active duty and the reserves.

The presenter will discuss E-Waste and the steps the Canton City Health Department took to resolve personnel shortages and its mission to increase services amidst financial difficulties.

25. (Food & Sewage) NSF Standards Overview, Ron Grimes, NSF

Ron Grimes received his BS Degree in Environmental Health from Indiana State University. He completed his M.P.H. in Health Planning and Administration at the University of Michigan. Ron has also been accepted into the American Academy of Sanitarians. Ron has served as President of several state and national environmental organizations most notably President of the National Environmental Health Association. Currently, Ron is Manager of Regulatory Affairs Environmental Health Programs at NSF International focusing on relationships between NSF International the State and Local Regulatory Agencies across the US and Canada; assisting Regulatory Agencies with standards and regulatory compliance; and working closely with regulatory officials keeping them current on new environmental health initiatives and services.

This presentation will provide a review of new NSF standards, changes, and potential changes in existing NSF Standards as they affect Environmental Health Programs. This will provide the participant an understanding of the breadth of the NSF Standards and relationship to their career activities.

26. (Air) 101 of Air Permitting Basics & Treatment Strategies, Mike Hopkins, OEPA DAPC Michael Hopkins has been with the Ohio EPA since 1980. He is currently the Assistant Chief, Permitting of the Ohio EPA. Mr. Hopkins earned his Bachelor's degree in environmental engineering from the Pennsylvania State University. He is a licensed Professional Engineer in the State of Ohio. He is a member of the Air and Waste Management Association, the National Society of Professional Engineers and the Ohio Society of Professional Engineers.

The presentation will cover the basics of Ohio EPA's air pollution permit program: what needs a permit (particularly at sanitary and CDD landfills), who you should talk to if you need a permit, and how to apply for and obtain a permit.

27. (Food) Sous Vide- Understanding Reduced Oxygen Packaging, Shannon Self, Delaware County Shannon Self presently serves as a Food Safety Sanitarian for the Delaware General Health District where she has worked for the past 8 years. Shannon received her BS Degree in Environmental Health from Bowling Green State University.

This presentation will examine the Sous Vide process of cooking. The discussion will discuss what exactly is happening during the process and how it can be done within the limitations of the State Food Code. Copresenters will be demonstrating this process.

28. (Solid Waste) Composting and Recycling for the Cleveland Metroparks Zoo- Nancy Hughes Nancy received her Bachelor of Science / Conservation major from Kent State University. Nancy has worked for the past 9 years for the Cleveland Zoo.

Nancy will present on many of the sustainability initiatives at Cleveland Metroparks Zoo including the extensive recycling and composting programs and the newest LEED certified exhibit, African Elephant Crossing.

29. (Sewage) The Use of Scent Trained K9 for Illicit Discharge Detection, "A 2012 Update", Scott Reynolds
 Scott Reynolds is owner of Environmental Canine Services which he started up in 2009.
 Scott received his BS Degree in Environmental Studies and Applications from Michigan State University.

This presentation will provide an overview of how canines can be used to reduce costs in detecting illicit discharges discharging to storm sewers. This technology is helping Municipal Separate Sanitary Sewer Systems comply with their Phase II Storm Water mandates to eliminate illicit discharges that pollute our rivers and lakes which can impact our public beaches and recreation safety.

30. (Air) Health Effects of Air Pollution, Shelly Kiser, Dir. of Advocacy, Amer. Lung Assoc.
 Shelly Kiser serves as the Director of Advocacy, for the American Lung Association where she has worked for the past 8 years. Shelly received her BS Degree in Journalism from the Otterbein University.

This presentation will provide an overview of health impacts from air pollution sources.

(Food) Custom Processing of Deer, Curing/Smoking of Meat & HACCP Variance Reqmts., Matt Fout, ODA Matt Fout has been with the Ohio Dept. of Agriculture, Division of Food Safety, for over four years. He provides advice, consultation and direction to local health departments and food industry on food safety issues. Prior to this he was employed at the Pike County General Health District as a generalist sanitarian. He also worked at the Pike Soil and Water Conservation District as a District Technician where he implemented Farm Bill programs and conservation practices with local farmers and land owners. Mr. Fout obtained his BS Degree in Natural Science from Shawnee State University.

This presentation will provide an overview of custom process of deer, cutting and smoking of meat and the HACCP Variance requirements.

32. (Sewage) Grand Lakes St. Mary Strategies- Russ Gibson, OEPA DSW Russell Gibson, NPS Program Manager-Mr. Gibson has managed Ohio EPA's NPS and Section 319 Programs since 2005. Previously, he worked for more than 20 years with Ohio's Department of Natural Resources in a variety of positions including manager of permitting, hydrology and bonding for mineral resources; northwest Ohio scenic rivers coordinator; community grants administrator for the Division of Recycling and as a preserve manager and park ranger. Mr. Gibson has a bachelor's degree in Natural Resources Management from Ohio State University as well as extensive graduate coursework in Public Administration.

This presentation will cover Ohio's multi-agency progress on implementing strategies to address water pollution impacts on Grand Lakes St. Mary.

 33. (Pesticides) Pest Control: Best Practices Christopher LoPresti and Jim Stocker, Apex Pest Control Services Christopher R. LoPresti presently serves as Commercial Sales Manager for Apex Pest Control Services. Jim Stocker presently serves as the CEO of Apex Pest Control Services where has worked since 1969. Previously Jim served as the Captain of the Euclid Fire Dept. 1958-1985 (30 years). Jim Stocker: attended Ohio State and Tri-C College.

This presentation will cover sanitation in restaurant kitchens, problems dealing with owners/managers, and Effective treatments to stay within the law and the label.

34. (Air) Handling Air Nuisances Investigations, Bob Princic, OEPA DAPC

Bob Princic has worked for the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency for more than 23 years. He worked initially in the Division of Emergency and Remedial Response (DERR) as a site coordinator and supervisor, overseeing state-lead remedial projects, interim action clean-ups and Superfund sites in northeast Ohio. The last 11 years, he has worked in the Division of Air Pollution Control. His current duties as supervisor of the technical services group include managing the district's ambient air monitoring and asbestos inspection programs. Mr. Princic holds a BA Degree in Communications from Cleveland State University and a BA Degree in Geology from Kent State University.

This presentation will cover how to respond to odor nuisances from landfills and industrial facilities and provide a case history. Investigating a nuisance complaints can be technically challenging, time-consuming and resource intensive. Coordination with local health departments, municipal entities while addressing citizens' complaints and the media is necessary to move from the investigation to resolution.

35. (**Food**) When Good Beef Goes Bad; The DLM Beef Recall of Jack Gridley, Dorothy Lane Market Jack Gridley works as the Meat and Seafood Director, Dorothy Lane Market.

This presentation will provide an overview of a proactive market response to national beef recall.

36. (Sewage) Ohio EPA Regulations for Sludge Land Application, Jake Howdyshell, OEPA, DSW Jake Howdyshell has worked for Ohio EPA for the past 6 years in the Central Office for the Division of Surface Water. Jake currently coordinates the Sludge Land Application program. Jake received his bachelor's in civil engineering from Ohio University.

This presentation will cover the Oho EPA regulations that apply to the disposal of sludge by land application for agronomic benefit.

37. (Management) Epidemiology–Using Emergency Room Data for Environ. Health Information, Chris Henning Chris Henning received an Associate's Degree in Business from the University of Maryland, a Bachelor of Science in Comprehensive Science and Health Education from Kent State University, and a MS Degree in Public Health from the Ohio State University. A member of the United States Army for nearly 8 years and employed within a law firm during college. Shortly after graduation from Kent State University in 1993, she was hired by the Canton City Health Department as a Sanitarian.

HMS, Health Monitoring Systems, records every emergency department and statcare visit in large portions of northeast Ohio. In this presentation, the speaker will share how some health departments are using it to track environmental issues, such as bug bites, animal bites, injury data, outbreak investigations, etc. This is a great data source for grant submissions, quality assurance and monitoring the health of the community we serve.

38. (Management) Ohio Voluntary Accreditation Standards (OVAT), Lynnette Cook, Chief of Perf. ODH Lynnette Cook has worked at the Ohio Department of Health for the past 2 years and currently serves as the Chief of the Office of Performance Improvement. Lynnette received her Bachelor's degree in Psychology from the Ohio State University and her Masters and PhD in psychology from the University of North Carolina Chapel Hill. During the past year, the Ohio Voluntary Accreditation Team (OVAT) has engaged local health departments to solicit feedback on changes to the minimum standards mandated by R.C. 3701.342. The standards are being changed to reflect national Public Health Accreditation Board (PHAB) standards.

This presentation will review the accreditation standards, and identify both how they relate to and implications for environmental health.

39. (Pools) Public Health Protection at Wolf Lodge Resorts - Franceen Gonzalez, Great Wolf Lodge Resorts Franceen Gonzales presently serves as the Vice President of Risk Management for all of the Great Wolf Lodge Resort facilities.

By-Laws:

Chapter I: Annual Dues
