I can spend hours in a bookstore, or the library. I love looking at shelves of books and picking out something new to read. The easy availability of ordering books online means that I frequently come home to find a package with one or more books on my doorstep. I love the thrill of opening a book for the first time, and immersing myself in the writer's world.

As much as I enjoy discovering a new writer, from time to time, I enjoy rereading a book. This Lent, I am returning to a spiritual classic that I first read more than a decade ago. I have re-read it several times since. Each time I return to its deep wisdom, I learn something new about myself and faith.


The book is called "A Testament of Devotion" by Thomas R. Kelly. First published in 1941, the book consists of five essays by a Quaker teacher. Each one urges us to center our lives on God's presence, and there to find stillness and peace. The five essays are convenient for Lent, as I can read one at the beginning of each of the 5 weeks in Lent, and spend the rest of the week pondering how it speaks to me of God.

Over the years, I have learned that I often try to do too much for Lent. So this year, I am going to try to keep my Lenten practice simple. I am not going to learn something new, or try to climb spiritual mountains. Instead, I am going to return to the familiar, and enter into the stillness of God's presence.

May you find stillness in this holy Lent, and may Christ be with you.




