RECIPE: Yummy old fashioned salad!

Ingredients

- Iceberg Lettuce (common lettuce)
- Carrot
- Tomatoes
- Cucumber
- Purple onion or spring onion
- Capsicum
- Sour cream
- Corn chips

Method

- Finely slice lettuce and place at the bottom of the bowl
- Grate carrot, make another layer.
- Finely chop up the other vegetables and add them in layers.
- Pour sour cream over the top.
- Top up with crunched up corn chips (nachos).

Effective immediately the new opening hours for the uniform shop are as follows:



Belmont Primary is excited about our initiative called the 'Belmont Primary Passport for Participation'. We have received funding through a special grant to enable the school to offer interested families the opportunity to be rewarded for a wide range of school based activities.
