- ORCL 5 residents in for 7 days, 1 resident in for 3 weeks, 1 resident in for 2 weeks, 1 resident in for 10 days & 1 resident in for 1 month.

Ironside Walk notes are as follows:

Tenant Mr G – admitted August 2007 (21 days), readmitted September 2007 (25 days), readmitted November 2007 until January 2008 when discharged to a care home and passed away there January 2008.

TDC tenant - diagnosed with cancer in late 2006, admitted to hospital in December 2006, discharged in March 2007, readmitted in June, discharged to nursing home in September and passed away in January 2008.

Tenant Mrs E - ambulance called several times but not admitted until July 2007, discharged two weeks later, returned in early August and immediately discharged, finally readmitted in early October and passed away a few days later.

Tenant Mrs N - admitted to A & E in November 2007 with vomiting and severe pain, passed away unexpectedly later the same day.

Tenant Mrs T – was admitted to hospital in September 2007 a day before tenancy sign-up. Tenancy signed in hospital at tenants request as planned to return home but was not discharged til November. Only spent three weeks at home before admission to residential care.

- ALD -115 units are managed by Colchester Borough Homes (CBH), with the remainder split between Springboard, Hanover and the Balkerne Gardens Trust. One extra-care scheme at Fivefields Court.
- COL 289 units are managed by Moat Housing, with the remainder with the Salvation Army and Maldon Housing Association.
- COP being in the centre of Clacton means there is a large number of schemes, mostly managed by large national providers including Housing 21, Anchor Trust and Hanover (including 1 extra-care scheme). TDC still manage 56 units (2 schemes).
- IRON the only other sheltered scheme is Honeycroft, a TDC scheme.
- JOHN the closest scheme is 4km away in St Osyth.

- KNI 11 bungalows adjoin our scheme and are managed by Moat. The remaining units are at Maytree Court, a sheltered scheme managed by Colchester Borough Homes in Tiptree.
- NEWF 146 units managed by CBH, including one extra-care scheme. Shaftesbury manages one extra-care scheme and the remainder are Hanover.
- ORCL same as Knights Close.
- PRI in addition to the scheme adjoining ours and managed by Moat, the remaining scheme is linked to Priors Way and also managed by Moat.
