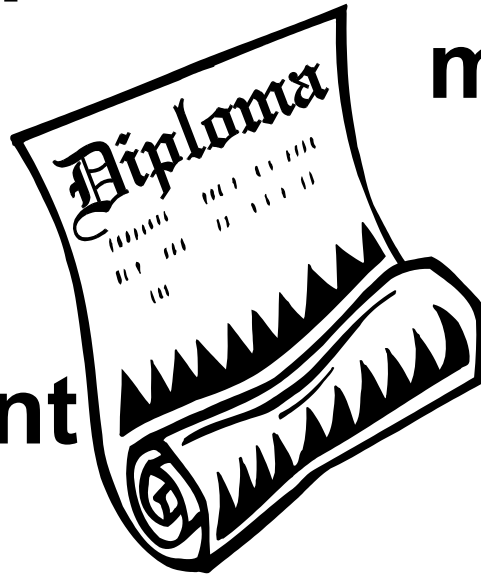

- **Completing these minimum course and credit requirements will earn a high school diploma. Only those students who meet all requirements will participate in the commencement ceremony**



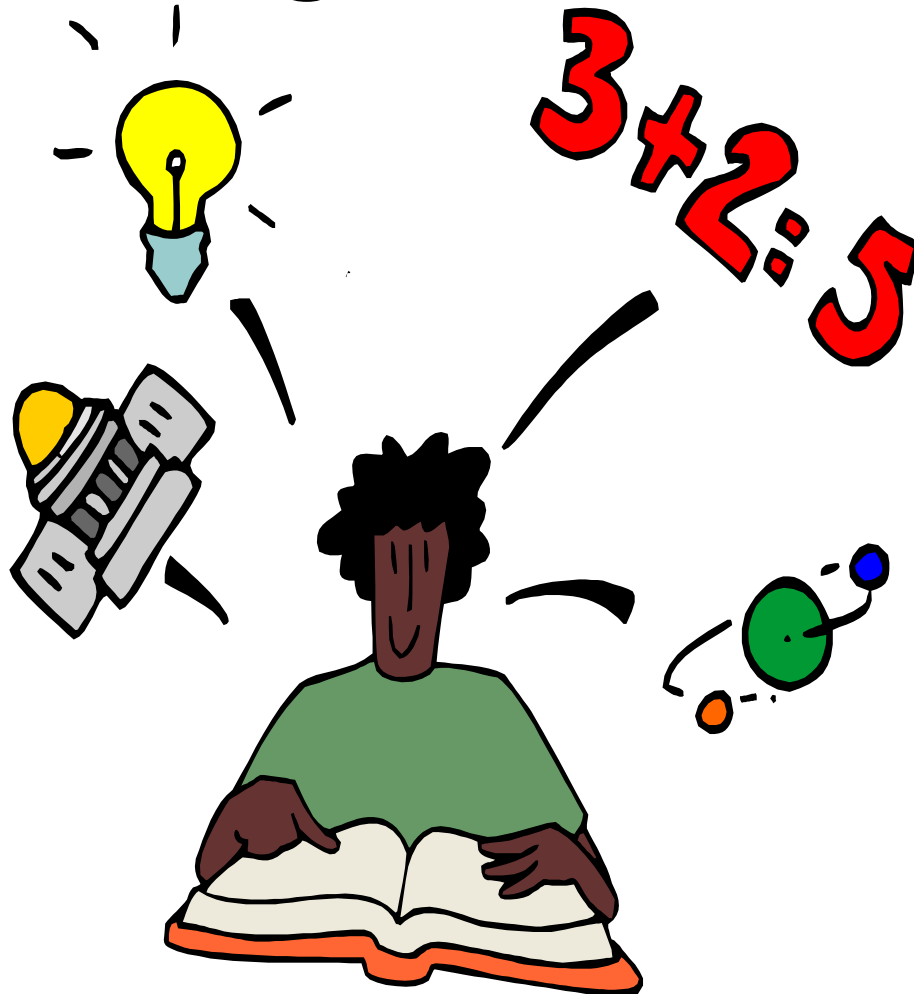
# High School Graduation

# Setting a timeline

## *Fall Grade 12*

- SAT and ACT, NO LATER THAN DECEMBER grade 12
- Apply to CSU October 1 – November 30
- Apply to UC November 1 – 30
- Apply to private and out of state colleges August – February
- Apply for a CAL GRANT
- Gather required information for FAFSA

# Community College

- Admission requirement – must be 18, a high school graduate, or pass the CHSPE
- No SAT or ACT is required
- Community College placement test for Math and English (EAP at WHS this spring)
- Certificate Programs, Associate Degrees, and GUARANTEED Transfer Programs
- Best Deal in the US – about \$26.00 per unit!
- Books and other costs total about \$1500 per year

# Community College

- Several CCs 'share' residence halls with four year colleges
- Apply for residence halls as early as January
- Guaranteed transfer programs
- Honors programs

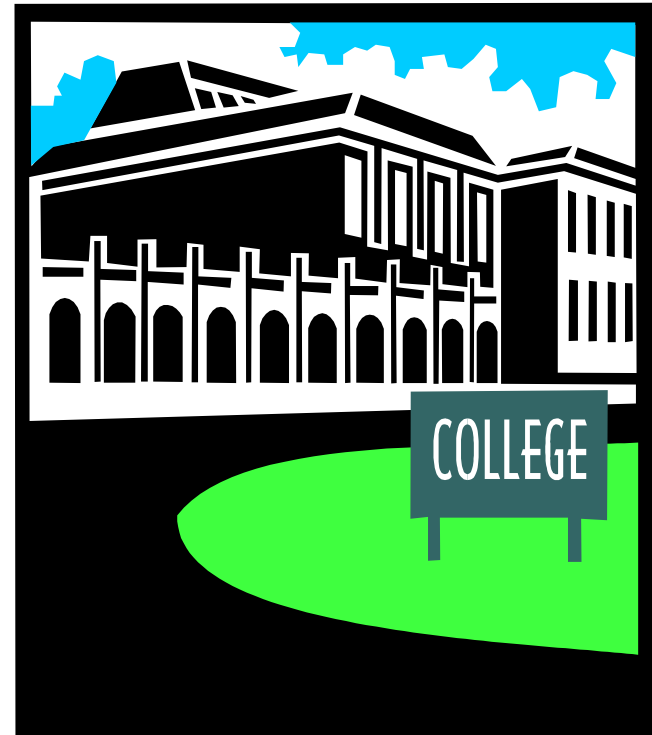

# Visual or Performing Arts

- Visual or Performing Arts Requirement
  - Students must complete at least one full year of one course
  - College course may meet the requirement
  - If community college, use IGETC list, 3A
  - College course is theory or history, not skill

# California State University

A quick look ...

- 23 Campuses (plus ' CSU Fullerton – Irvine Campus')
- **Guaranteed** admission to the local campus – admission may be selective if you live outside the area
- Our local campus is CSU Fullerton

# California State University

- Apply October 1 through November 30
- Most selective campuses are SLO, San Diego, Long Beach, FULLERTON
- Admission is based solely on a numeric index using GPA and SAT Reasoning Test or ACT score

# CSU Campuses



# California State University

## CSU Admission Index

- $\text{GPA} \times 800 + \text{SAT (CR + M)} = 2900$   
Or  $(10 \times \text{ACT}) + (200 \times \text{GPA}) = 694$

GPA of 3.0 eligible with ANY score  
**GPA = grades 10, 11 college prep**

Standards Test in May – extra 15 questions**

**Mathematics Placement test is part of the California

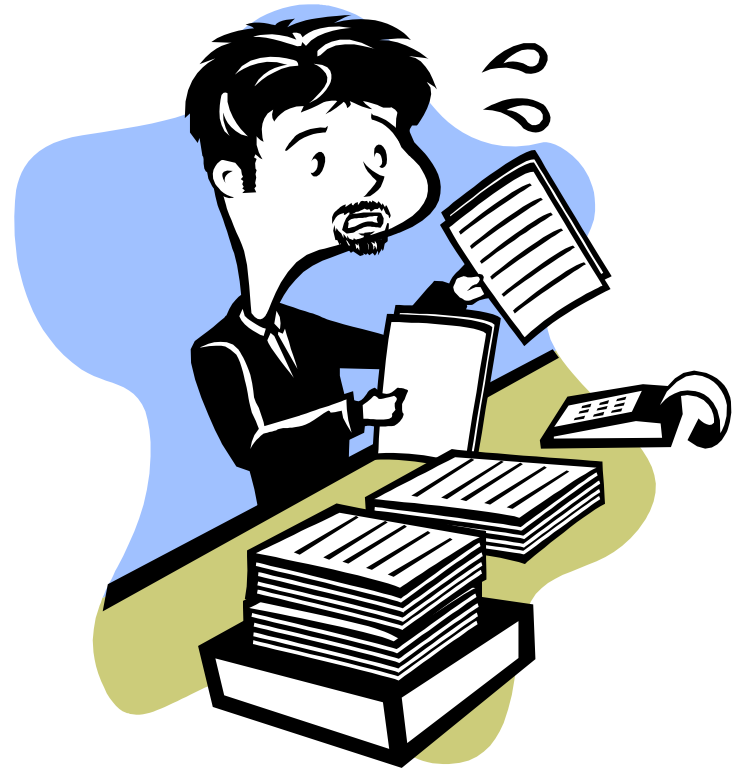

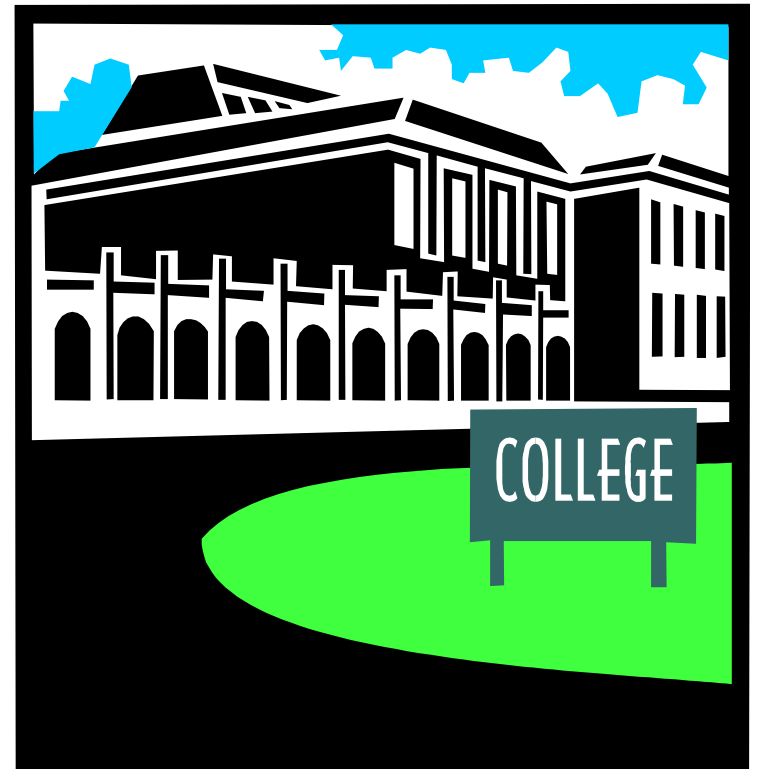


# University of California

- Personal initiative and motivation
  - Did student take advantage of his school's most rigorous offerings?
  - Each application is reviewed thoroughly for this examples
  - What do the essays reveal or explain?
  - Extracurricular review

# University of California

- No student who meets the minimum eligibility requirements will be denied admission without a complete review

# Why do colleges use Admission Test scores?

- Adds value to student transcripts and other admissions information
- High correlation between ACT &/or SAT scores and first year college GPA
- Placement in required Writing and Mathematics courses

# SAT Reasoning test

- Test has three sections
    - *Critical Reading*
    - *Mathematics*
    - *Writing*
- 800 points per section



# SAT Reasoning Test

# SAT Reasoning Test

## *Suggested Testing Pattern*

Mock PSAT in Fall of grade 10

PSAT in Fall of grade 11

SAT in Spring of grade 11

SAT in Fall of grade 12

*Students who follow this pattern earn on average  
**100 points** higher than students who take  
the SAT only one time*

# **SAT Reasoning Test**

***When students repeat the SAT, what happens to their scores?***

**65% INCREASE**

**35% STAY THE SAME or  
DECREASE**

# ACT

- ACT is (and has always been) clearly linked to student achievement, not aptitude
- Test has five sections:
  - Reading
  - Mathematics
  - English Grammar
  - Science Reasoning
  - Essay (optional)



# ACT

- ***Most widely used***
- ***35% of students who take both SAT & ACT, will score higher on ACT***
- ***Many colleges use for placement***

# SAT Subject Tests

- **Recommended (NOT REQUIRED) by the University of California for certain majors, and only a few other universities (not Stanford, not USC!)**
- **NOT REQUIRED by most colleges**
- **Check to make sure!**
- **Take any two tests of choice from different subject areas**

# SAT Subject Tests

- *SAT Subject Tests are offered every test date except the March/April date*
- *Some tests are only offered on one test date each year*

# DEVELOPING A PLAN TO FINANCE YOUR EDUCATION

Receiving Financial Aid  
is a ***three step***  
***process***

1. Completing the FAFSA (and possibly other applications)
2. Reviewing the Student Aid Report
3. Evaluating Financial Aid Offers



# What is financial aid?

- *Financial aid closes the gap between a family's resources and college costs.*
- *There is money for college from the federal government, states, colleges, and private resources*
- *Nearly two-thirds of all college students receive financial aid.*
- *The most common types of aid are grants, scholarships, work-study, and loans*

# What is financial aid?

- *Eligible non-citizens also qualify for most federal and state aid*
  - *US Permanent Residents with I-151*
  - *Conditional Permanent Residents with I-151*
  - *Eligible non-citizens with I-94*

*If a student is not eligible with an I-151 or I-94, then the student **may still be eligible** for state or institutional funds*

*To be eligible for financial aid, a student and parents must each complete the FAFSA*

# What is financial aid?

## ***Basic Equation of Need:***

***Cost of Attendance (COA)***

- ***Expected Family  
Contribution (EFC)***

= ***Student's Financial  
Need***





# EXPECTED FAMILY CONTRIBUTION - ***EFC***

Whether students attend an expensive college or one with lower costs, the ***EFC*** remains the same!

The ***EFC*** may or may not be what a student ends up paying – that depends on the student's 'indirect' spending (food, clothes, recreation, and transportation)

# Blue and Gold Opportunity Plan

- Students who qualify for financial aid, are California residents and whose families earn less than \$80,000 a year may be eligible for the [UC Blue and Gold Opportunity Plan](#). The plan covers system wide fees. In addition, Blue and Gold students with sufficient financial need may qualify for even more grant aid to help reduce the cost of attending.



# CAL GRANT

- Offered by the State of California to every eligible applicant
- Residency + GPA + Income
- Full tuition at a public college
- \$9,500 towards tuition at a private college

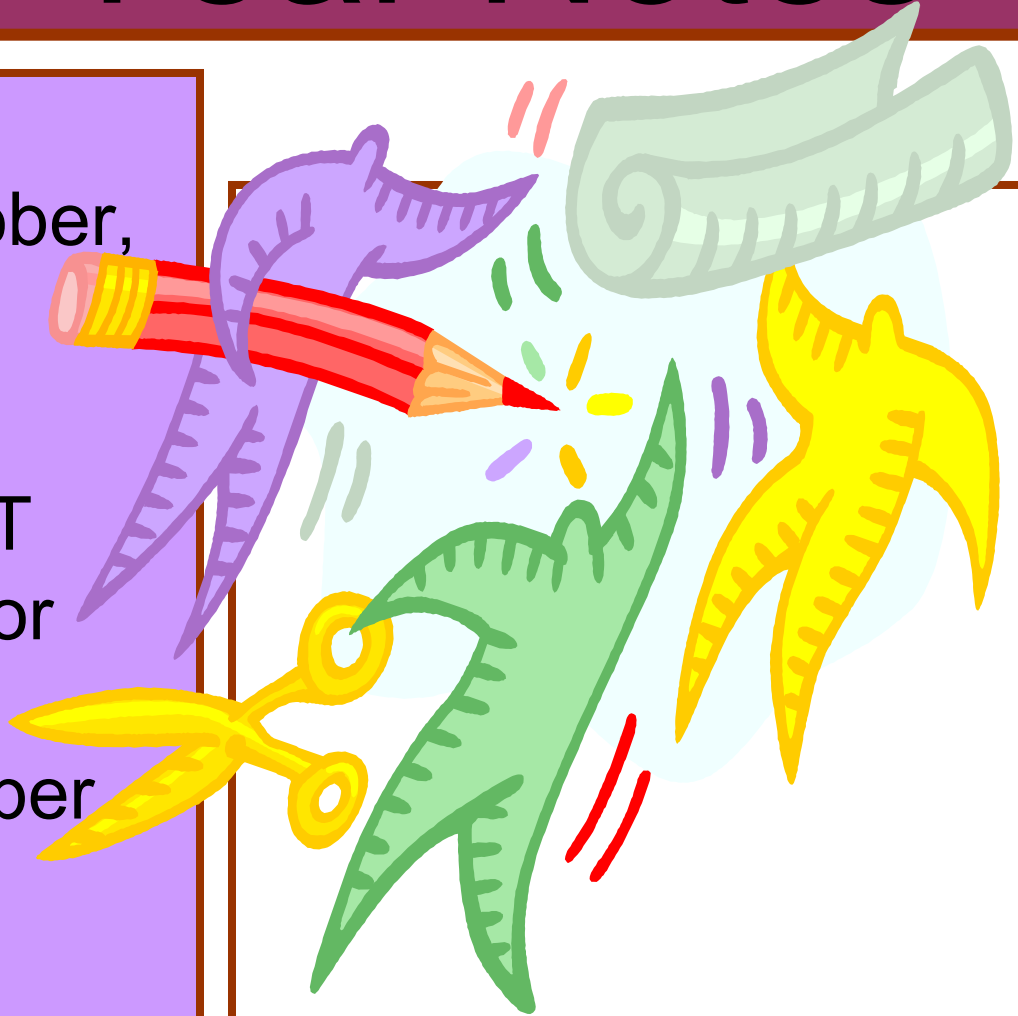
