

n July of 2009, Richard Bradley Parker, (Rick) became the Principal of East Mecklenburg High School. After serving as one of the Assistant Principals at East for ten years, he becomes the seventh Principal in the sixty year history of this school replacing his mentor and longtime friend, Mark Nixon.

Mr. Parker was born in Charlotte and grew up in the Oakdale community with his proud parents Margaret and Roy Parker. He attended elementary school at Oakdale and University Park, and Coulwood Junior High School. Rick attended West Mecklenburg High School and graduated in 1983. He was an honor student at West and was Vice President of his senior class. He lettered in baseball, basketball, cross country and soccer. He went on to play

Junior Varsity Baseball at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and graduated from there in 1987 with a Bachelors degree in education and then attended Appalachian State University where he earned his Masters in Education in 1989. In 1997 pursuing an interest in administration he attended the University of Winthrop in South Carolina and received his Administrative Degree in 1999.

Mr. Parker has two daughters, Brooke, 17 and Alexis, 10 from a previous marriage and is engaged to be married to Rhonda Barrera in February of 2010. Rhonda is an active supporter of East Mecklenburg High School athletics and events.

THE ECHO FOUNDATION PROJECT

"IN THE FOOT STEPS OF ELIE WIESEL" A Documentary Film Project

ast Mecklenburg High School will host the Echo Foundation for their Humanity's Day program on February 3, 2010 and for their Student Dialogue Day on March 24, 2010. The Echo Foundation was founded in 1997 to carry on the message that Nobel Peace Prize Winner Elie Wiesel brought to Charlotte that year—a call to action for human dignity, justice and moral courage.

"In the Footsteps of Ellie Wiesel" was a leadership and travel program that offered high school students the opportunity to experience formative locations in Elie Wiesel's life in Romania, Poland, France and Germany. Students shared a special time with Mr. Wiesel when he was in Charlotte in 2007. The documentary film is the story of this trip by 12 Student Ambassadors representing 15 schools across the Charlotte region. Gabriella Reed, now a senior at East, is one of those students.

On February 3^{rd} students from across CMS and area private schools will see a Film Trailer and have a dialog with Holocaust survivor Susan Cernyak-Spatz, her daughter, Jackie Fishman and granddaughter Lee Beresford who took a similar journey. On March 24^{th} students will be here from all CMS schools and area private schools to see the documentary film screening and have a panel discussion with the student ambassadors.
