INTRODUCTION:

SBPD continues to handle the increased volume of calls for service attendant to the peak season. Our numbers continue to rise both as the season progresses and incrementally over the same periods one year prior.

We continue to curtail advanced / non-mandatory training and outside activities to a minimum level so as to maintain the staffing levels required by our call for service volume.

Organizationally, we've settled into the new departmental layout and supervisory structure, and our officers continue to respond well to the increased demands placed upon them attendant to the service level to which we aspire. Although we continually task the officers with the additional work that a true dedication to service demands, the days don't seem to get any longer. They do the work in the same amount of time, with little (or no) grousing. I am very proud of the work that they perform, and the level at which they've "bought in" to our mindset.

PERSONNEL ACTIONS:

SBPD initiated no demotions, terminations, or transfers during this reporting period.

One non-sworn employee received a one-day suspension without pay after a reprimand for improper job performance (second offense).

We received one complaint against an officer (actually, the department as a whole) during this reporting period. A citizen accused SBPD of "harassing" her 17 year-old son, based upon the fact that he received three summons in less than a month from various officers (one of which required an arrest). I met with the mother, who (naturally) did not have all of the facts attendant to the cases. Two of the cases actually stemmed from a Quality of Life (QOL) case we're managing wherein youth loitering, underage drinking, and illegal drug activity had deteriorated the quality of life in an entire residential block. In less than one month of active management, the problems have, for the most part, been mitigated. Residents there report a greatly reduced nuisance level, although we continue to work the area as a QOL project.

Once the mother learned the details, she withdrew her complaint and agreed to partner with us as we continue to work the problems in that neighborhood- a perfect example of how the QOL system works to maintain the very high quality of life (and correspondingly low crime rate) we enjoy here.

I included a copy of the form we use to track these projects for your review; it's fairly straightforward and should demonstrate the multi-disciplinary problem solving approach we bring to bear when these types of situations arise.

Although all of our officers continue to embrace our service mindset and commitment to excellence, I commended several officers in regard to particularly exemplary performance of duty during this reporting period.

We received an outside commendation from the US District Court (Federal Probation Office) in regard to OFF Al Sanabria's excellent courtroom demeanor, law enforcement knowledge, and spirit of cooperation. Sanabria had coordinated with Federal probation in regard to a case he investigated which resulted in a probation violation hearing in federal court. His abilities and attitude represented us well.

Internally, I formally commended OFF Dave Trilety in regard to his successful handling of a prescription fraud / financial transaction card fraud case. Trilety caught the case at the patrol level, and in keeping with our goal of working each case as a major incident (time permitting, of course) was able to locate suspects, obtain warrants, and eventually obtain full confessions. As a side note, SGT Travis Bailey's participation in the US Marshal Service's Operation Intercept Fugitive Task Force (detailed for you in last month's report) assisted in this case- Bailey was able to locate and arrest the suspects in two separate locations in Myrtle Beach.

I've included both commendations for your review.

HIGH RISK LAW ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITIES:

SBPD conducted no vehicle pursuits, and no officers were injured on-duty during this reporting period.

We used a reportable level of force on one occasion during this reporting period (standard handcuffing, escort holds, etc. do not require additional reporting beyond our Uniform Crime Report). On 22 JUL 11, CPL David Reyher arrested a combative suspect who resisted arrest and efforts to transport him to the PD for the booking. The suspect damaged Reyher's patrol car by knocking the rear side window out of its track, and continued to threaten Reyher and struggle throughout the booking process (despite three TASER strikes). Reyher was able to safely restrain and control the suspect without injury to himself or the suspect (a testament to his professionalism and experience level).

We conducted one brief foot pursuit during this reporting period, when OFF Julian Ziolkowski detected a vehicle break-in suspect fleeing from a parking lot and gave chase. Ziolkowski captured the suspect without incident after a one-block pursuit.

Officers responded to an active shooting call during this reporting period; luckily it resulted in neither injuries nor a use of force. CPL Chris King and OFF David Turbeville responded to reports of an individual on the beach discharging both fireworks and a handgun. The officers located the suspect and arrested him without incident, seizing a .45 caliber pistol in the process.

TRAINING:

Due to the strenuous demands of our peak season service volume, SBPD continues to curtail non-essential training. Officers continue to complete their required monthly in-service training and legal updates online during their standard duty tours.

Officers Julian Ziolkowski and Chevis Ridgeway completed a four-day Basic Narcotics Investigation and Interdiction course in Greenville, SC from 18-21 JUL.

On 27 JUL, Ziolkowski and OFF Brian Clark traveled to Lexington County to attend Advanced Tactical Handgun Training sponsored by the SC Law enforcement Officers Association.

WORKLOAD / PERFORMANCE METRICS:

As usual, we've included our Monthly Activity Report (along with the same period last year spreadsheet for comparison purposes). Also included are the usual supplemental reports: the Criminal Investigations log, Beach Services Field Activities, and the USMS Fugitive Task Force.

This month, SBPD officers issued 99 written warnings in lieu of Uniform Traffic Tickets.

NOTABLE EVENTS / INFORMATION:

Subsequent to the Accommodations Tax Advisory Committee recommendation (and your formal approval), we fast-tracked the acquisition and outfitting of our new Beach Services utility

vehicles (two Kawasaki Mules). As we thought would be the case, the Beach Services officers have found the Mules to be a dramatic improvement over the four-wheelers in comfort level, access, and operability. They are registered now and street-legal now, so we've ordered trailer hitches to provide for the movement of rescue equipment (trailers, personal watercraft, etc.). They will be particularly useful should we experience a major storm, as they are able to move through debris and small areas much better than squad cars or trucks.

The vehicles are more clearly and quickly recognizable as police vehicles as officers move to calls

through crowded beach areas, and their amphibious design has already benefited the Town in that one vehicle was partially submerged while traversing a swash without engine damage. Traversing salt water in the four-wheelers often created engine problems.

We'll have one of the Mules parked outside of Council Chambers prior to Tuesday evening's meeting for your examination. I'll be happy to answer any questions you may have at that time as well.

As the final piece of our transformation / rebranding effort, we've added a traditional police uniform to our approved duty wear order. Currently, officers wear one of three types of attire IAW with SBPD uniform policy: the blue patrol uniform (a tactical uniform with thigh pockets and all cloth insignia), business attire / coat and tie (for investigative or command personnel), or the "field" uniform consisting of khaki field pants and a black golf shirt with embroidered badge (the "black and tans," as the officers refer to them, were added late last year to provide a standard uniform for range days, training, heavy station work, mass callouts, etc.).

The missing piece, from a professionalism and appearance standpoint, was a standard police uniform to wear during court appearances, high profile outside assignments, funerals, etc. The new uniform will consist of poly / wool blend midnight blue pants and shirt, with standard metal insignia for nameplates, badges, etc. Both the old patrol uniform and the newly issued dress uniform will transition to the new "police" shoulder patch we provided to you for review a few months ago. I will wear mine to the meeting Tuesday night and answer any questions you may have, but you'll instantly recognize it as the standard municipal police uniform in use nationwide. They will provide us the capability to ditch the tactical uniforms when appropriate (as situations dictate) to better represent the Town and SBPD. The guys are already referring to them as "Adam-12's," which may or may not have something to do with our black and whites...

<u>INSTRUCTIONS</u>: The SBPD QOL Case Management System is designed as the primary method by which the department identifies, tracks, and remedies quality of life issues in Surfside Beach. An important part of the SBPD mission involves preserving and improving the quality of life, maintaining peaceful and quiet neighborhoods, abating public nuisances, and protecting citizens from the detrimental effects of crime.

All SBPD Quality of Life (QOL) cases must be authorized by the Chief of Police using this form, which shall serve as the initiation document for the QOL case file attendant to that project IAW SBPD General Order 308 (Crime Prevention and Community Relations). This document and the supporting case notes shall be considered ongoing investigative work product to be used in prospective law enforcement actions for the purposes of exemption from disclosure under the SC Freedom of Information Act (per the parameters set forth in §30-4-40). All materials related to the QOL case shall be placed in the file, which shall be maintained by the Platoon SGT's.

All officers contributing case work to a QOL case shall adhere to the remediation plan as approved by the chain of command to ensure that all efforts are properly coordinated and comply with General Order 308's requirements in regard to Constitutional safeguards, intelligence gathering, and enforcement.

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I would like to commend you in regard to your exemplary performance of duty during a prescription fraud and financial transaction card fraud investigation initiated and completed at the patrol level. You continue to display the kind of initiative and drive we aim to instill in our officers, and you set an example for younger officers to emulate.

When a local pharmacy reported on 12 JUL 11 that a suspect had passed a forged prescription, you approached the investigation as a major incident and immediately devoted your time and attention to investigating the case and providing a high level of service to the victims. You compiled a solid investigative file and made a good suspect by matching DMV photos, conducting follow-up interviews with the owner of the stolen scrip, and watching surveillance video. Your investigation eventually led to a second suspect, and both were arrested within a week based upon your investigation.

Good officers know that the arrest is not always the best juncture at which to end an investigation. Subsequent to the arrests, you continued your work by interrogating both suspects and obtaining good, solid confessions from both.

Your mastery of basic police patrol procedure, follow-up investigation skill, and desire to serve the citizenry here at the highest level possible resulted in the removal of two criminals (and an amount of illegally obtained drugs) from open society. A good week's work...

Your actions obviously contributed greatly to this community's continued safety, and reflect very positively on you and this agency. Be proud of your performance (as I am), and stick with it. We all slip and fall occasionally, but it's consistency that separates the amateurs from the pros.

NARRATIVE: CLEARLY ARTICULATE SERIOUSNESS OF OFFENSE SUSPECTED AT THE TIME FORCE WAS USED, THE PHYSICAL THREAT TO OFFICER(S) OR CITIZEN(S), AND THE SUBJECT'S RESISTANCE OR ATTEMPT TO FLEE

ON 07-22-11 AT 0134 HRS CPL REYHER WAS FLAGGED DOWN, THEN WAIVED OFF BY AN EMPLOYEE OF SCOTTY'S BEACH BAR 111 SEASIDE DR S. THE EMPLOYEE WAS ON THE OUTSIDE DECK NEAR THE FRONT DOOR SPEAKING WITH THE OFFENDER WHO WAS BENT OVER AND APPEARED TO BE IN ABDOMINAL PAIN.

CPL REYHER APPROACHED THE OFFENDER AND ASKED IF HE WAS "OK". THE OFFENDER IMMEDIATELY BECAME COMBATIVE BY PUMPING AND FLEXING HIS ARMS, MAKING VERBAL THREATS TO LEAVE HIM ALONE OR CPL REYHER "WOULD BE SORRY". HE SAID HE WAS HAVING AN ANXIETY ATTACK AND WANTED TO BE LEFT ALONE. CPL REYHER DETECTED A STRONG ODOR OF ALCOHOL EMANATING FROM THE OFFENDER'S PERSON. THE OFFENDER WAS ENRAGED AND DISORDERLY, ENDANGERING HIMSELF, THE PATRONS OF THE BAR AND THE CITIZENS OF SURFSIDE BEACH. THE INCIDENT OCCURRED ON THE SECOND FLOOR BALCONY DECK. CPL REYHER WAS POSITIONED WITH HIS BACK TO THE STEPS DOWN AND COULD NOT MANEUVER TO A SAFER LOCATION DUE TO BAR PATRONS, STAFF AND TABLES. PTL BRODE WAS REQUESTED BY RADIO TO RESPOND FOR ASSISTANCE.

CPL REYHER ATTEMPTED TO CALM THE OFFENDER BY EMPHASIZING THE POLICE INTENT WAS TO DETERMINE IF THE HE HAD A MEDICAL PROBLEM AND REQUEST EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES IF NECESSARY. THE OFFENDER WAS QUICKLY CYCLING BETWEEN CALM AND RAGE INDICATING THAT HE MAY HAVE INGESTED A NARCOTIC. CPL REYHER TALKED THE OFFENDER INTO SITTING ON THE DECK FOR THE SAFETY OF ALL INVOLVED. THE OFFENDER WAS SEATED BUT BECAME ENRAGED, PUNCHED THE BAR DOOR WITH HIS FIST, LEAPT TO HIS FEET AND MOVED TOWARDS CPL REYHER. CPL REYHER FEARED THE OFFENDER WOULD PUSH HIM OFF THE DECK EITHER DOWN THE STAIRS OR OVER THE BALCONY RAILING. CPL REYHER STOPPED THE OFFENDER BY FIRING HIS ASSIGNED X-26 TAZER, STRIKING THE OFFENDER WITH (2) PROBES IN HIS CHEST AND LEFT THIGH. THE OFFENDER FELL TO THE FLOOR, CPL REYHER USED STRONG VERBAL COMMANDS TO THE OFFENDER TO ROLL ONTO HIS STOMACH AND PUT HIS ARMS STRAIGHT OUT. AT THE END OF THE FIRST CYCLE, THE OFFENDER WAS ON HIS STOMACH BUT MOVED HIS ARMS UNDER HIS BODY AS IF TO STAND. CPL REYHER ACTIVATED THE TAZER ONCE MORE AND COMMANDED THE OFFENDER TO PUT HIS ARMS OUT. WHEN THE CYCLE COMPLETED THE OFFENDER COMPLIED. PTL BRODE ARRIVED TO ASSIST DURING THE SECOND TAZER CYCLE. CPL REYHER COMMANDED THE OFFENDER TO PUT HIS ARMS BEHIND HIS BACK AND THE OFFENDER COMPLIED. CPL REYHER HANDED THE TAZER TO PTL BRODE, ADVISED THE OFFENDER HE WAS UNDER ARREST AND ATTEMPTED TO SECURE THE OFFENDER IN HANDCUFFS. THE OFFENDER'S RIGHT HAND WAS SECURE BUT HE FLEXED HIS LEFT ARM AND BEGAN TO RESIST ARREST AGAIN. AT THE REQUEST OF CPL REYHER, PTL BRODE ACTIVATED THE TAZER ONE MORE CYCLE. THE OFFENDER DID NOT RESIST FURTHER AT THAT TIME AND WAS SECURED IN HANDCUFFS.

OFFICERS ESCORTED THE OFFENDER TO CPL REYHER'S PATROL VEHICLE THAT WAS PARKED APPROXIMATELY FIFTY FEET FROM THE BAR. ENROUTE TO THE CAR THE OFFENDER ATTEMPTED TO PULL AWAY FROM THE OFFICERS BY TWISTING HIS BODY AND DIGGING HIS FEET INTO THE GROUND. CPL REYHER USED LOUD VERBAL COMMANDS TO THE OFFENDER TO STOP RESISTING. WHEN THAT WAS INEFFECTIVE, CPL REYHER USED TWO TO THREE KNEE STRIKES TO THE OFFENDER'S RIGHT THIGH. THE OFFENDER STOPPED RESISTING AND WAS MOVED TO THE PATROL VEHICLE. AT THE PATROL VEHICLE THE OFFENDER REFUSED TO SIT IN THE REAR SEAT. CPL REYHER USED TWO TO THREE KNEE STRIKES TO THE OFFENDER'S RIGHT THIGH. THE OFFENDER AGAIN STOPPED RESISTING ARREST AND SAT IN THE PATROL VEHICLE. EMS WAS NOTIFIED. PTL BRODE OBTAINED (2) USE OF FORCE WITNESS STATEMENTS FROM BAR PATRONS.


WHILE WAITING FOR EMS TO RESPOND THE OFFENDER STRUCK HIS HEAD AGAINST THE PATROL VEHICLE CAGE AND DRIVER SIDE DOOR WINDOW CAUSING A LACERATION ON HIS FOREHEAD. HE REMAINED ENRAGED AND CONTINUED A VERBAL RANT MAKING THREATS TO HARM CPL REYHER AND HIS FAMILY. WHEN THE OFFENDER HIT HIS HEAD AGAINST THE DOOR WINDOW HE DAMAGED THE PATROL VEHICLE (CAR 33), BY KNOCKING THE WINDOW OFF TRACK. MEDIC 31 (BEACHY AND ELLIOTT) ARRIVED AT APPROXIMATELY 0200 HRS. THE OFFENDER WAS TOO DISORDERLY TO EXAMINE. DR RAHTER AT WACCAMAW MEDICAL CENTER WAS NOTIFIED AND ADVISED BY TELEPHONE THAT THE HOSPITAL WOULD NOT ACCEPT THE OFFENDER IN HIS CURRENT DISORDERLY STATE. CPL REYHER TRANSPORTED THE OFFENDER TO THE SURFSIDE BEACH POLICE DEPARTMENT. AT THE SBPD JAIL THE OFFENDER CONTINUED TO RESIST ARREST BY TWISTING AND PULLING. HE WAS SECURED IN A CELL, OFFICERS REMOVED THE HANDCUFFS FROM THE OFFENDER THROUGH THE FOOD SLOT DOOR.

CPL REYHER CHARGED THE OFFENDER WITH THE SURFSIDE CITY ORDINANCES PUBLIC DISORDERLY CONDUCT AND MALICIOUS DAMAGE TO PROPERTY, AND THE STATE OFFENSE OF RESISTING ARREST. A USE OF FORCE REPORT WAS COMPLETED.
