(5) If the judge finds that there is a need for preventative measures, the court might make one or more of the following orders:

Order supervised visitation

- Require a parent to post a bond, which would provide money to bring the child back if abducted.
- Prohibit one or both parents from removing the child from the county, the state, or the country.
- Prohibit the parent with custody from relocating the child without approval from the court or the other parent.
- Require the surrender of passports and other travel documents.
- Prohibit a parent from applying for a new or replacement passport.
- Require a parent to notify a foreign embassy or consulate of passport restrictions.
- Require a parent to register a California order in another state before allowing a child to travel to that state.
- Require a parent to get a custody and visitation order from another country, equal to the most recent U.S. order before the child can travel to that country for visits. However, foreign orders may be changed or enforced depending on the laws of the country.
- Require a parent, who wants to travel with the child, to provide: a travel itinerary, copies of airplane tickets, addresses and telephone numbers where the child can be reached, an open airline ticket to allow the other parent to travel to get the child.
