Dear Parents,

As we enter the month of February we have completed half of this school year. May we all enter the last half in a spirit of reaching our fullest potential to complete a happy, successful school year. **On Friday, February 6th at 7:30 p.m.** at Good Shepherd Parish approximately 40 of our students will be anointed by Bishop Gregory Bittman with the **Sacrament of Confirmation** which is God, the Father's gift of the Holy Spirit to our students to help them live the Christian faith in words, if necessary, and actions.

February 11 is designated as "**The World Day of the Sick**". We are reminded that our love and service to our sick and suffering cannot be neglected. This day also recognizes the great efforts of doctors, nurses, health care institutions, and pastoral care givers on behalf of the sick.

As you probably know, **Valentine's Day** is celebrated on February 14th, and **Family Day** in Canada is celebrated on February 16th. Both of these should attempt to bring the family members closer together in a spirit of love and caring for one another.

This year, **Ash Wednesday on February 18**, is the beginning of the season of Lent. It seems as though we just finished celebrating the Christmas season. I pray that you had time to celebrate the birth of Christ surrounded by family and friends.

The Lord will guide you continually, and satisfy your needs in parched places, and make your bones strong; and you shall be like a watered garden, like a spring of water, whose waters never fail. ~ Isaiah 58:11

As part of our Transform professional development program, we are contributing our classroom and professional development stories to this site. Although we are continually submitting stories to this website, presently, there are examples from H.E. Here is some valuable information on Terms of Use of websites your children may be using. When your child creates an account on a website they may be using, they are subject to the Terms of Use of that website. These terms are typically written in legal language and may be difficult to understand. Knowing what you as a parent should look for when considering allowing your child to create an account on a website they're using can help you decide if you're comfortable with your child using the site. Here are some things to look for in the Terms of Use, often found as a link at the bottom of the main site page:

- 1) Age restriction: Many (but not all) sites such as YouTube, Facebook, and other social media sites have an age 13 restriction for users to create an account, or permission from a parent. Other sites such as Prezi have far more restrictive terms of use which state that the site is intended for users 18 and older.
- 2) Personal Information: What personal information is the site requesting from your child, and are you comfortable with your child sharing this information? A good rule of thumb is to never share more personal information than is required by the site, and to create 'nicknames' wherever possible instead of providing a real name.
- 3) Public Gallery: Some sites (e.g. GoAnimate) give users access to a public gallery of works that other users have created. In some cases, the content of these sites may not be considered appropriate.

In his Ash Wednesday homily last year, Pope Francis shared the importance of Lent for us as Catholics. "Lent comes providentially to reawaken us, to shake us from our lethargy". As you begin your walk through the desert with Jesus, who journeyed for our salvation, may you be ever mindful of the state of the world around you and of your ability to effect positive change.

Quick School Traffic Safety Information

From the desk of Const. Andre Paul

Parents are reminded to please keep the safety of all our children in mind when driving in school areas.

1. U-turns are only permitted on private property, at dead-end roadways, and where permitted by signs. U-turns must be conducted safely.
2. Even when occupied, vehicles can only be parked in designated locations regardless of whether parked on school property or public streets.
3. Vehicles parked in front of fire hydrants, in crosswalks, no parking zones, park restricted zones, or handicapped zones can be given violation tickets and towed. Vehicle owners are responsible for all costs related to towing. Fines range from \$57 (park within 5m of crosswalk/fire hydrant or corner of roadway intersection or park within 1.5m of driveway), \$150 (park in emergency zone), to \$250 (park in handicapped/disabled parking) and tow fees including storage can quickly exceed hundreds of dollars.
4. Stopping to drop off or pick up a passenger in a marked crosswalk is illegal and drivers could face violation fines in excess of \$575 (crosswalk violation when pedestrian present).
5. It is illegal to stop in the middle of the road to pick up or drop off a passenger. Drivers could be fined between \$115 (obstructing traffic flow) and \$402 (stunting).
6. While AMA crossing guards are not given specialized authority under the Traffic Safety Act, failing to abide by their direction could lead to a fine of \$402 for careless driving.
7. Blocking an intersection or crosswalk while attempting to enter a public or private roadway entrance or driveway can lead to charges ranging from \$115 (obstructing traffic flow), \$287 (fail to stop at crosswalk stop line near intersection), to \$575 (pedestrian crosswalk violation).
8. Failing to yield for a pedestrian in a marked/unmarked crosswalk can lead to fines of \$402 (careless driving), \$575 (crosswalk violation), and in special circumstances result in fines for both violations being issued.
9. Failing to stop for a pedestrian in an unmarked crosswalk (corner to corner or mid-block, where indicated by a sloped mobility curb, to corner) will also lead to identical fines as indicated in Question 8.
10. The city of Edmonton anti-idling bylaw indicates: A person shall not cause, permit or allow a motor vehicle to idle for more than five minutes total in any 30 minute period in any area identified as a no idling zone. Exceptions: "All motor vehicles when the outdoor temperature is less than zero degrees Celsius and only to allow safe vehicle operation and maintain clear windows... not to exceed three consecutive minutes, due to emergency, traffic conditions, or weather conditions." Fines start at \$250 and double (\$500) on consecutive convictions.

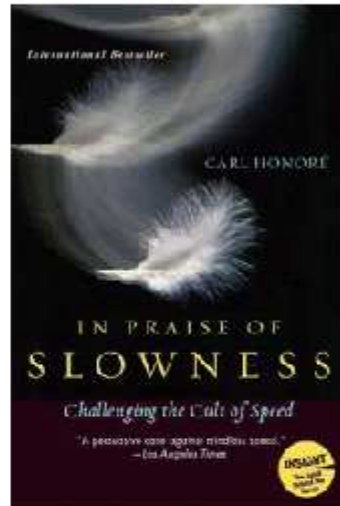
