Evangelical Christian Zionism: Retrospect, Prospect, and Response

Increasingly, American political support of Israel owes its power and stridency less to the influence of a powerful, Jewish lobby than to Evangelical Christian organizations and their supporters. Furthermore, much of the economic support of Israel, both in direct monetary support and tourism, comes from these same groups and individuals. While many pro-Israel Jews accept this support from the perspective of "any port in a storm" or, perhaps worse, as necessary lest American Jews offend this important group of Christians, others are unnerved by the prospect of having to rely on the good will (or ulterior motives) of a group of non-Jews in maintaining vital international support for the Jewish State.

This presentation will briefly outline the challenges posed by Christian Zionism, consider the contemporary manifestations and potential ramifications of this growing movement within Christianity, and suggest ways in which the American Jewish community might effectively respond.
